As a parent or legal guardian, you also have responsibilities: 1) You must appear for every court date. You are required to appear for every hearing the court sets, including a pre-trial conference, a settlement conference, and the adjudication hearing. If you don't show up for a court date and you don't have a good reason for not showing up, the court may find that you waived your rights in this case and that you have admitted the allegations in the dependency petition. The court will then schedule other hearings that you must attend, and the court will proceed without you if you do not have a good reason for not coming to court. 2) You must participate in reunification services. You must participate in all the services that DCS offers you to help reunite you with your child. Your failure or refusal to remedy the circumstances that caused your child to be removed from the home may be grounds for terminating your parental rights or establishing a permanent guardianship for your child. 3) You must attend termination or guardianship hearings. # State of the Town Event – The Superior Resolve

**R**ebuild Superior Inc. with the support of many sponsors hosted the third annual State of the Town event last week. The annual event is a celebration of the accomplishments of the Town of Superior and the community as a whole.

The evening event took place at the Besich Park with a reception catered by Felicia's Ice Cream shop, performances by the Superior Dance Company, and awards for community volunteers. Rebuild Superior Inc. Chairman Manny Guzman emceed the event and presented community awards to Billie Jo Villaverde for keeping the tradition of folklorico dancing alive in Superior. Valarie Garcia Denogean was also presented with an award for her constant work with the Youth of Superior and leading the Town of Superior Youth Council.

Lynne Nemeth, the Executive Director of the Boyce Thompson Arboretum, gave a few words about the

relationship of the Boyce Thompson Arboretum and the Town of Superior. She highlighted the upcoming centennial celebration activities at the Arboretum. Nemeth announced her resignation a few months ago from the Arboretum. Mayor Mila Besich surprised Nemeth with a presentation of a ceremonial key to the Town.

“Under Lynne’s leadership, our relationship with the Boyce Thompson Arboretum has improved greatly. She has lead through the Telegraph fire, massive flooding and a pandemic, all while forging a greatly improved relationship with the Town. We will miss her and leadership and she is deserving of this award,” said Mayor Besich.

This year the theme for the event was “The Superior Resolve.” Mayor Besich’s remarks talked of the accomplishments for the year. Key highlights include

reducing the Highway User Revenue Fund imbalance from \$3 million to under a million dollars. She explained that the town will process \$24 million in federal and state grant funding going to a variety of projects across the town including the \$4.5 million wastewater treatment plant upgrade, multi-gen center renovations, and fire breaks. She shared that the baseline of the accomplishments made by the town are measured from where the Town was in 2016 and where it is today. “Our narrative has shifted dramatically, from broke, boarded-up and blighted, to bright, bodacious and buoyant!” she said.

Besich remarked that the Town is still awaiting the re-release of the Resolution Copper project’s Environmental Impact Statement and shared that there is growing frustration on the delays.

“After eight years of study, consultations primarily with tribes and other stakeholder groups, the re-release of the Resolution Copper Final Environmental Impact Statement continues to be stalled. From our vantage point, it is extremely concerning that we are still waiting on this federal permit especially at a time when our country needs to develop more green energy using American minerals,” she said.

Besich also recognized the many entities who helped to create the “Good Neighbor Agreement” to ensure that there is accountability with Resolution Copper now and into the future.

Throughout her remarks, she thanked the staff and many community volunteers.

“I truly appreciate the support and determination of our Council to serve and our staff for their willingness to think big and plan with a laser focus. This dynamic team is a once-in-a-generation team of people committed to Superior – together we have been punching well above our weight class to GSD – get stuff done!” she said.

The evening closed with a final presentation by Superior Dance Company.

The annual event drew about 200 people to the park to learn about the Superior Resolve.
