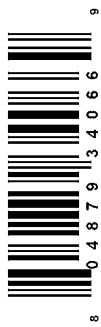

Rave leaves one dead, another injured near Superior

On Sunday, Nov. 12, 2023, the Pinal County Sheriff's Office announced that a homicide had occurred on U.S. Hwy. 60 near Superior (outside of town limits) and that PCSO and Superior Police Department were investigating.

According to the Pinal County Sheriff's Office, on Saturday night in the area of Uno Trail and U.S. Hwy. 60, between 50 and 100 people gathered in the desert for an unregulated rave party. Around 9:50 a.m. Sunday, police received a 911 call from witnesses who reported that shots had been fired. Shortly after, police said that the suspect also called 911 to report the shooting.

With the PCSO Aviation Unit overhead, officers from Superior Police Department, Arizona Department of Public Safety and Pinal County Sheriff's Office detained the suspect and lead medical staff to the victims.

One victim was deceased and a second is in stable condition at a Valley hospital in the ICU.

The initial investigation showed that the suspect had

attempted to steal a vehicle before shooting two individuals. All parties involved were attending the party.

The names of the victims were not released by police.

The suspect has been identified as Daniel Schmitt, 29. He was arrested and booked into the Pinal County Jail in Florence. He has been charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon and first degree murder.

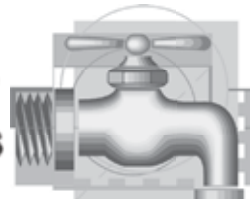

Hayden Lobos are the

It's been 51 years, but the state title once again comes to Hayden.

For the final time this season, the Hayden high-school football team took their place under the stadium lights, ready to play some Lobo ball. A season full of victories and dedication got them to the number one seed in the 1A State playoffs, and a continued devotion to the pursuit of greatness got the Lobos to the championship game. Hayden's Lobo Blue sea once again flooded the stands of Ed Anderson field at Coronado High School in Scottsdale.

The game began with intensity as the Lobos were the first to score a touchdown, missing the 2-point conversion. Mogollon was quick to retaliate with their own touchdown, running into the end-zone, luckily the Lobos held it down and prevented them from scoring the 2-point conversion. The score sat at 6-6 five minutes into the game. The Lobos offense played with tact, running hard. Tyler Garner scored the second touchdown, setting the score at 12-6. Kino Lorona ran the 2-point conversion, but was stopped short of the goal. The Lobos continued to play a smart defense, with Rene Ochoa stopping runs, and Dominic Alvarado pressuring Mogollon's quarterback. Deondre Collier broke through a tough D-line to score a touchdown, putting the score at 18-6, followed by a pass to Keiston Pool for the 2-point conversion, putting the score at 20-6, where it would stay for the remainder of the first quarter.

The second quarter started with Collier collecting 17 yards during a run, then 50 more yards during a pass. Ochoa busted through a tough defense and scored the first touchdown of the second quarter, putting the Lobos at 26-6. Mark Acevedo and Kirk Fox played some tough defense, stopping Mogollon from pushing forward.

After a turn-over to the Lobos, the boys continued to push forward with intensity. Pool caught a pass, and got the Lobos 8 yards from the goal line. Collier continued to break forward, running tough and scoring another touchdown, setting the score to 32-6. While on defense, Garner picked up a fumble, returning the ball to the Lobos. Lorona helped gain yards by being an unstoppable force with the ball. The Lobos couldn't break through, and the

ball was turned over to the Mustangs, and they slowly began to advance with 30 seconds left in the first half.

Ochoa recovered a fumble, giving the ball back to the Lobos with 10 seconds left. The final play of the first half was a pass from Paul Gaither to Pool who smoothly pitched it back to Ochoa. The score of the first half was 32-6.

The Lobos played a motivated first

half, and demonstrated not just their toughness, but a high level of sportsman class, making sure their jerseys stayed tucked-in, while their opponents had some of theirs tucked in, half tucked, or just un-tucked.

Coming out from the half with the same energy as the start, the Lobos were set to receive the kick. Collier caught the kick gaining yards. Fox helped advance the

Lobos forward, by gaining more yards during a run, then catching a pass and smoothly maneuvering into the end-zone, putting the score at 38-6. Ochoa scored the 2-point conversion, getting them to 40 points.

The Lobo defense continued to put pressure on the Mustangs. Mogollon slowly moved down the field, then scored a touchdown and 2-point conversion,

moving the score to 40-14. Mogollon began to hold Hayden from breaking forward, eventually getting the turnover and advancing forward. The boys only let this slide for a few plays, then began to put pressure on Mogollon's quarterback, who began to throw the ball wherever he could. Acevedo hit the quarterback sending him back 6 yards. The Lobos turned over the ball. Lorona ran a 75-

yard touchdown, followed by a 2-point conversion pass to Pool, setting the score to 48-14. Mogollon scored a touchdown off of the kick-return, followed by a 2-point conversion, putting the score to 48-22, where it would stay for the rest of the third quarter.

The fourth quarter started off with Garner and Lorona helping the Lobos advance forward. Lorona ran a

touchdown into the end-zone, and Collier caught the pass for a 2-point conversion. The score now sat at 54-22. Hayden's defense continued to apply pressure to Mogollon's offense. Collier intercepted a pass, and ran it into the end-zone, but a flag on the play considered it no good. Mogollon then scored a touchdown off of a pass, followed by a 2-point conversion. The score moved to 56-30.

The referees then began to get trigger-happy with their yellow flags, and push the Lobos' offense back with penalty after penalty, eventually turning the ball over to Mogollon. It was short-lived for the Mustangs, as Dominic Alvarado intercepted a pass, giving the ball back to the Lobos. Quarterback Gaither threw a pass to JJ Manriquez who carried it into the end-zone, putting the score to 62-30. The Lobos continued to play tough until the end.

The final score of the game was 62-30, making Hayden, Arizona's 2023 1A football state champions, dethroning Mogollon's three-year reign. The crowd of Lobo blue exploded with cheers of pride and excitement.

This is Hayden's first state football title in 51 years, since 1972. Hayden hasn't been back to the finals since 2018 where they were runner-ups against Superior, and before that it was 30 years, in 1988 where they were runner-ups to Thatcher.

When asked what made this team so special, Coach John Estrada told the media, "Their hard work ethic. We set goals back in May, hit the weight room and worked hard all summer, and through the season, and left it on the field. It was all about hard work, fundamentals, and our technique."

When asked about how it feels getting such strong support from the community, Coach Estrada commented, "Look at them, it's like that in every activity these boys are in, whether its football, basketball, baseball, they get total support from our community."

Coach Estrada went on to thank his players for their hard work this season, and his coaching staff who did an outstanding job.

"We got it done this year," Estrada said.

The one person missing was the late Coach Bob Bohrn, but Estrada told AZPreps365 that Bohrn was there in spirit. Bohrn was Estrada's right-hand man on his coaching staff and played on Hayden's 1972 state championship team, AZPreps365 reported.

Bohrn died of cancer last year, but his impact lives on.

Following the game, Coach Estrada presented the game ball to his father, Joe, who is also a Lobo alum.

The Hayden Lobos brought their 2023 season to a close with a flawless 12-0 record, and carved their name into Hayden's athletic legacy. Congratulations Lobos, 2023 1A State Champions!

CASA of Arizona recognizes National Adoption Day

Each November individuals and communities come together to celebrate and bring awareness to adoption and foster care. For over 20 years, the third Saturday

in November has been designated National Adoption Day. It celebrates the child and family in their new forever home.

The Arizona Supreme Court's Dependent Children's Services Division facilitates two statewide volunteer programs, the Foster Care Review Board (FCRB) and the Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA), that are dedicated to the well-being of the approximately 10,000 children in Arizona's foster care system. Comprised of an amazing and dedicated volunteer base, these programs are currently in need of volunteers in all of Arizona's 15 counties.

As one volunteer expressed "The opportunity to make a difference in kids' and families' lives is why I got involved. What I didn't expect is that it's enriched my own life as much or even more."

Volunteers are trained to recognize the importance of reunifying children with their parents when it is safe and possible. When that is not possible, volunteers advocate for a safe and permanent home with a relative (kinship) or a caring and loving adoptive family. Both CASA and FCRB volunteers connect all the dots of a child's life to help draw the picture of what is best for the child.

As a CASA volunteer, you will visit the child and get to know their life and the people involved. You will then advocate for the child's best interests in court and by working with others involved with the child. This could include speaking with the child's teachers, foster family, parents, and service providers and then making recommendations to the court. A CASA volunteer stays with the child throughout the entire case and is often the one consistent adult throughout the court process.

As a FCRB volunteer, you will serve on a 5-member panel that meets virtually (via Zoom) one weekday (8:30-5:00) per month to review cases of children in foster care. On a rotating basis, the Board reviews the same cases and becomes adept to the particular needs of the child and family until permanency is achieved.

"You do not need to be steeped in child welfare experience or knowledge. You only need to have a compassion to help guide a child through one of the most emotionally difficult experiences they will have in their life," said Charlie Gray, CASA Program Manager.

Applicants for both programs must be at least 21 years of age, pass a fingerprint background check and participate in an introductory program training.

For those looking for a different volunteer experience, the Arizona Supreme Court is also seeking to recruit community members for its more than 30 standing committees and commissions. To learn more about the Court's Committees and Commissions visit, azcourts.gov/committeescommissions/

There will be 19 classes plus motorcycles for those planning to enter the car show. To enter the car show or to find more details please contact Doug at 602-908-0005.

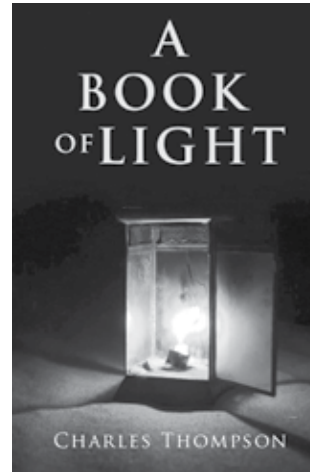

Your Southeast Pinal County Master Gardeners (are pleased to invite you to attend a Zoom webinar presentation on Wednesday, Dec. 13, at 1 p.m. Dr. Debankur Sanyal, University of Arizona

Environmental Sciences, Soil Health Specialist, will present: “Nutrient Deficiencies in Plants and How to Improve Soils”.

All higher plants require 17 individual nutrients to grow and reproduce. Each nutrient is critical to one or more vital functions within a plant. Lack of a nutrient often produces

unique deficiency symptoms that allow an observer to identify the missing nutrient. This information can be used to develop and implement effective treatment strategies. These observations of symptoms are useful for narrowing the range of possible nutrient deficiencies. Dr. Sanyal will focus on those nutrients most often lacking in Southern Arizona plants.

Using a key based on visible nutrient deficiency symptoms allows the identification of common plant nutrient deficiencies. In addition, soil management techniques to avoid or treat these nutrient deficiencies will be shared.
