### LETTER TO THE EDITOR

### Vote Your Values, Fight for Your Rights

ow does voting in every election affect you, from midterm to general? The people you elect up and down the ballot make decisions that impact your civil rights and quality of life.

Every vote counts. Choose wisely. The people you elect will be around for a long time. Decide if you want to vote for candidates who believe in American Democracy, those who are dedicated to making life better for ordinary Americans regardless of the color of their skin, where they came from, or what they believe.

Or you could choose those who do not believe in your right to vote unless you vote for them. They prefer an authoritarian form of government. If you think the government has too much control already, what do you think authoritarian leaders will do? They seek power and money. They do not care about the people they serve. It's all about what they can gain by being in office. Large corporations and the wealthy 20% will benefit far more than ordinary working citizens. One only needs to look back at history to see that this is true.

The Governor can sign into law or block legislation that offers protections and equal access to services for people in their state. Choose one who believes that everyone's vote counts, one who tells the truth, does not amplify big lies, and cares more about helping the people she will serve than taking away their rights.

The Secretary of State is Arizona's chief elections officer responsible for administering elections and can expand or limit your voting access through various policies. Choose one who is honest, one who believes in democracy, and one who will protect your right to vote. If you vote for a candidate who believes violence is a solution to addressing

problems and believes that overturning an election is the best way to get a desired outcome, you can be sure your votes may not count in the future.

In Pinal County, Supreme Court judges and Superior Court judges are appointed by the Governor. State courts make decisions that affect you, like whether reproductive freedoms are protected or not. Before you mark all the boxes with a yes or no, find out if any of the judges have poor ratings and make your decisions based on that.

How do you feel about your children's right to learn? Local school boards can make rules that restrict discussions about race and gender, or they can uphold the rights of students and educators to teach and learn about these issues. Elect school board candidates who want children to learn about their world and who will not try to limit what they can and can't know.

Ballot propositions give voters a chance to be heard on issues that are important to them. Be sure to take the time to read up on each of them before you choose yes or no. Some will take away your rights and leave choices in the hands of politicians, not the people.

Each choice you make will affect your future in Arizona. Please choose wisely.





### Lobos are heading to the 1A semi-finals; will face Williams

The Hayden football team returned to the field last Friday, after a bye for the first round of the 1A state playoffs, hosting the San Manuel Miners. The game ended with a final score of 82-20, sending the Lobos into the semifinals.

"The game was what we expected. We knew San Manuel was going to come out and play hard. Our offense played strong and our defense settled down after giving up 2 scores in the first quarter and got back to playing hard hitting Lobo football that caused 4 turnovers," said assistant coach Armand Cruz.

Quarterback Fabian Elvira went 11-13, with 242 passing yards, 1 carry for 18 yards, and threw for 6 touchdowns.

Receiver Brandon Garner Jr. had 3 receptions for 119 yards and 3 touchdowns. Receiver Issac Castillo had 3 receptions for 59 yards, and 2 touchdowns. Receiver JJ Aguirre had 1 reception for a 64-yard touchdown. Running back Deondre Collier had 7 rushes for 78 yards and 2 rushing touchdowns. Running Back Jordan Rodriguez had 7 rushes for 50 yards with 1 rushing touchdown.

Kino Lorona had 8 tackles, 3 assist, and 1 interception. Rene Ochoa had 5 tackles, 1 assist, and 1 forced fumble. Deondre Collier had 5 tackles, 1 fumble recovery, and returned for a 25 yard touchdown. Mark Acevedo had 4 tackles with 1 assist. Julian Cruz had 3 tackles, and 2 forced fumbles. Dominic Alvarado had 1 tackle, 1 sack, and 1 forced fumble. Andrew Waddell had 1 tackle and 1 sack. Brandon Garner Jr had 2 tackles and 1 assist.

Keiston Pool had 1 tackle and 1 assist. Mathew Armenta had 2 tackles and 2 assist. JR Fong had 1 interception. Izzy Gallego, Angel Moreno, Tyler Garner, JJ Manriquez, Manny Aguirre and JJ Aguirre all recorded a tackle.

Cruz added, "Now it's time to really get focused and work even harder as we prepare for a tough Williams team. Our team is very thankful for the continued support from our Lobo Fans and we are hoping for a big turnout for Friday's game."

The Lobos will face Williams on Friday, Nov. 4, at Coronado High School, 2501 N. 74th St., Scottsdale, with a kickoff time of 7 p.m. Tickets will be \$10 for adults and \$5 for students. 



# CASA of Arizona celebrates National Adoption Day with hundreds of adoptions this year; More CASA advocates are needed to help pave the way for children to find loving homes in times of crisis

With adoptions taking place across the country for National Adoption Day in November, CASA of Arizona (Court Appointed Special Advocates) will celebrate this milestone with hundreds of children across the state that have now found their forever, loving homes this year.

National Adoption Day is a collective effort to raise awareness of the more than 115,000 children waiting to be adopted from foster care in the United States. Each November, children across the country get to celebrate a new life with loving families. In many of these cases, a CASA advocate has been there to support the child along the way.

On any given day, there are more than 11,500 children and youth in Arizona living in foster homes, group homes, shelters, or with relatives due to neglect and abuse. At present, more than 10,000 of these children don't have access to a CASA volunteer to advocate for their best interest.

A family in Arizona recently experienced the gift of adoption as they formally adopted a sevenyear-old boy and four-yearold girl whom they had fostered since the youngest was seven months old. The day coincided with the girl's four-year birthday and the family threw a neighborhood party for everyone that had been involved to celebrate this new sense of security that their son described with these words: "I belong now. This is my family."

"This is a new start for these children," said the adopted father and mother in this case — Joe and Christina. "Seeing the kids get something good in their life and finally finding a life full of love provides such a sense of relief and happiness for us all — and we couldn't have gotten to this point without CASA."

CASA volunteers are everyday members of the community who are appointed by a judge to represent the best interest of abused and neglected children during a dependency case. Their role is to act as a consistent adult presence for a child in foster care as they go

through court proceedings and adjust to life in their temporary homes — to walk the walk with the child and let them know they're not alone.

"CASAs are desperately needed because they advocate for each child's best interest above anything else," said Joe and Christina. "The minute our CASA volunteer was appointed, we felt a positive shift in the case with progress being made to establish stability and permanency in the children's lives. Our CASA volunteer provided us with the miracle these children so desperately needed."

CASA volunteers have the unique opportunity

to make a huge, direct impact in the lives of children — while also becoming integral parts of the CASA program, court process and family's lives. "If you're looking for an opportunity to change someone's life and set them on a completely different life path, becoming a CASA is for you," said CASA

volunteer Al who has been

with the program for 9 years. "For me, the idea that I've put these kids into a home where I know they will be loved and cared for — and if they get a booboo, mom and dad will put a band-aid on it — is irreplaceable. I can make time for that any day."
