LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Vote Your Values, Fight for Your Rights

ow does voting in every election affect you, from midterm to general? The people you elect up and down the ballot make decisions that impact your civil rights and quality of life.

Every vote counts. Choose wisely. The people you elect will be around for a long time. Decide if you want to vote for candidates who believe in American Democracy, those who are dedicated to making life better for ordinary Americans regardless of the color of their skin, where they came from, or what they believe.

Or you could choose those who do not believe in your right to vote unless you vote for them. They prefer an authoritarian form of government. If you think the government has too much control already, what do you think authoritarian leaders will do? They seek power and money. They do not care about the people they serve. It's all about what they can gain by being in office. Large corporations and the wealthy 20% will benefit far more than ordinary working citizens. One only needs to look back at history to see that this is true.

The Governor can sign into law or block legislation that offers protections and equal access to services for people in their state. Choose one who believes that everyone's vote counts, one who tells the truth, does not amplify big lies, and cares more about helping the people she will serve than taking away their rights.

The Secretary of State is Arizona's chief elections officer responsible for administering elections and can expand or limit your voting access through various policies. Choose one who is honest, one who believes in democracy, and one who will protect your right to vote. If you vote for a candidate who believes violence is a solution to addressing problems and believes that overturning an election is the best way to get a desired outcome, you can be sure your votes may not count in the future.

In Pinal County, Supreme Court judges and Superior Court judges are appointed by the Governor. State courts make decisions that affect you, like whether reproductive freedoms are protected or not. Before you mark all the boxes with a yes or no, find out if any of the judges have poor ratings and make your decisions based on that.

How do you feel about your children's right to learn? Local school boards can make rules that restrict discussions about race and gender, or they can uphold the rights of students and educators to teach and learn about these issues. Elect school board candidates who want children to learn about their world and who will not try to limit what they can and can't know.

Ballot propositions give voters a chance to be heard on issues that are important to them. Be sure to take the time to read up on each of them before you choose yes or no. Some will take away your rights and leave choices in the hands of politicians, not the people.

Each choice you make will affect your future in Arizona. Please choose wisely.







The Lady Panthers ended their 2022 season with a final record of 3-15.

It's Senior Night at Ottawa University Football field for Superior native, Brandon Tomerlin Jr.

Former Superior resident and current Ottawa University graduate student and Co-Captain of the OUAZ football team, Brandon Tomerlin Jr. will be putting on his #53 football collegiate uniform for the last time on OUAZ home field, this Saturday for Senior night, Nov. 5, at 7 p.m. in Surprise, AZ, against Wayland Baptist.

Tomerlin, a 6-foot-2, 245-pound linebacker, was signed in 2018 with the in-state Ottawa University, located in nearby Surprise, AZ. Head coach for Ottawa University is Mike Nesbitt and Defense Coach, Jerry Dominguez.

Although, Tomerlin graduated from Ottawa in May with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Human Resources, he is taking advantage of the extra year, due to Covid cutting their Junior season short. It was a no-brainer for the student-athlete, who's education expenses are covered by earning himself a couple of scholarships due to his hard work ethic, his good-student standing on campus and athletic talents on the field, to suit up for one more year to play the sport he loves, while working on his master's degree.

Last year, Tomerlin broke Ottawa's football school record for all-time leader in tackles and he still leads the Spirit defense with 220 total career tackles, 126 solo and 94 assisted. This season alone, he holds 40 solo tackles, 15 assisted, totaling 55 tackles, 1 forced fumble, and 2 deflected passes for the graduate student. He is ranked nationally in the 2022 NAIA, SAC and NCCAA football overall statistics in defense. For example, he's currently at No. 2 for NCCAA defense leaders in sacks (7.5 for 60 yards), number 2 in tackles for losses (25.5 tackles for losses totaling 108 yards) and ranked 4th in defensive leaders in tackles at 55. In his game against Texas College on Oct. 8, he was named NCCAA Defensive Player of the Week. In that game, he led the Spirit defense that recorded a 56-o shutout of Texas College. Tomerlin had a team-high 10 tackles with 1



tackle-for-loss, 1 pass break up, and 1 forced fumble. His stats that game week: 10 tackles, 1 TFL, 1 PBU, 2 QBH (quarterback hurries) and 1 forced fumble. OUAZ team record is 5-2, needing this win against Wayland Baptist to keep playoff hopes alive. In his career at OUAZ, they hold 2 SAC Conference Championship titles, 2019 and 2021. They received their Championship rings earlier this year, Brandon had his Tata, Nacho Villaverde, try them on for his 86th birthday. With his Tata's passing in August, he has another reason for this season to finish strong. Brandon wants one more Championship ring and a title to add to his 15 year football career.


Tomerlin told the Superior Sun's late Andrew Luberda in 2018 that he chose Ottawa University, because they were the only school that was willing to give him a shot and they believed in him. He said, "I'm not going to let them down." He was looking forward to another exciting chapter in his life and making a brotherhood and family at Ottawa, just like he did at Desert Ridge." After moving from Superior in 2008, during the middle of second grade, Brandon has persevered in his pursuit of playing football throughout his early years in pop-warner tackle football leagues at just 6 years old on the Predators-winning a couple of championships in that league, then on to AJ's Black and Gold Youth football league, making the All-Star team, to traveling to Las Vegas in 2010 on Thanksgiving and winning 1st in their division of the National Youth Football Championship with the Chandler Diablos. While a student at Desert Ridge Junior High, being there was no tackle football, he played for the Queen Creek Bulldogs (they also won a championship) until his high school career began as a freshman playing for Desert Ridge. "Competing at Desert Ridge High School taught me

toughness and how to compete for what I want." Tomerlin said. "I won't let anything stop me from reaching my goals."

Despite moving away from the mining town in 2008, family and friends still motivate Brandon on and off the field. Brandon told Andrew, "I couldn't have done this without my family pushing me and my coaches along my way. I am doing this for my family and all of my friends from Superior. I'm representing them every time I step on the field."

Tomerlin still feels the same way he did in 2018, when he spoke to Andrew. This Saturday, when he steps on his home turf, his sanctuary, that beautiful Ottawa University football field that was a field of dirt just 6 years ago, wearing his #53 jersey for the last time, he knows what's on the line, who he's representing on that field and the journey it's been as a 6-year-old boy wanting to play football, like his Dad, like his Tata and his cousins who played. He is representing his family, his friends, his hometown of Superior, the brotherhood of football players he's formed throughout his years playing, and for his legacy at Desert Ridge. He doesn't want to let Ottawa University down for believing in him, he wants to win for Mac and finish his collegiate football career with several more victories and another ring. He will have a cheering section full of proud family and friends, so get your tickets early if you plan on attending, the game will be sold out.
