Over 275 CASA volunteers trained in 2020 to

CASA of Arizona has trained over 275 applicants to become the voice for children in foster care in 2020 which includes 7 applicants from Gila County. Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASAs) are volunteers who fight for the best interests of children currently living out of home who have experienced abuse and/or neglect.


Under normal circumstances, in-person training is offered to new CASA applicants across Arizona in addition to virtual training. CASA of Arizona is currently only offering virtual training to new applicants due to physical distancing and safety precautions.

"CASA of Arizona has gone above and beyond to ensure every new applicant who is able to train virtually through Zoom is comfortable and confident with the new training environment," states CASA of Gila County Coordinator Emily Nader. "The state trainers take time to work one on one with volunteers who express concerns and help them through this new virtual reality we are all living."

Virtual training sessions are offered to all CASA applicants in Arizona with multiple days and times to choose from that best fit the applicant's schedule.

CASA of Gila County welcomed three new CASA volunteers through our first virtual CASA Oath ceremony on Dec. 17, 2020 before Hon. Judge Timothy M. Wright. These volunteers have completed 30 hours of preservice training and are now certified to serve in their community as the voice for our children living in foster care. Upon their first assignment, our program will have 27 advocates


serving children from our communities, with 195 children living in out-of-home care.

CASA of Gila County is in critical need to increase the number of dedicated members of the community to step up and become Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteers, and help break the cycle of abuse and neglect, through supporting children and families.

Studies show children with a CASA volunteer receive more services that are critical to their well-being than children without an advocate, and those children are more likely to achieve educational success.

Volunteers come in all shapes and sizes. No specific background or training is needed to become a CASA volunteer. Anyone 21 years of age or older, who can pass a thorough background check and complete 30 hours of free training, is encouraged to apply.



Dear Santa ...

The chief theory is that with the increased population of the world, Santa was using this method of communication to seek out new helpers.

Another theory, somewhat less likely to apply in all situations, is that the newspaper editor had been a very good boy or girl in their youth and Santa felt they deserved an extra present.

"Try for three then."


"You mean right here? Right now?"

Santa nodded.



do you feel when you hear them?"







Copper Area News is committed to providing our readers with as much information as possible. This graph shows the positive cases as of press time on December 22, 2020. We have also included a graph showing the daily counts for the past week. Daily statewide case counts are recording higher than they were during the last peak this Summer and hospitals are becoming overwhelmed by COVID-19 patients.

There are a few points we would like our readers to consider when following this data.

- This will continue to be a rolling total of positive cases. It does not reflect recoveries or deaths. The Arizona Department of Health Services does not break out this data.
- 2. If you see a reduction in numbers from day to day it is most likely due to a data entry error or mis-coding of a zip code (at the state level).
- 3. This is all zip code based data; most of our zip codes include unincorporated areas. There is no way to track exactly which areas each of the positive cases are. Example, Kearny and Winkelman each have small communities in their zip code that are not in the Town's incorporated boundaries.
- 4. If you live in Gila County, please follow the Gila County Health and Emergency Management, Facebook. They have maintained their data on recoveries and current positive cases.
- 5. You can follow other data such as ICU bed use, Ventilator use and hospital capacity online: https://bit. lu/3inh280

EXHIBIT A RESTATED ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT OF ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF BONITA CREEK WATER COMPANY These Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation supersede and take the place of the heretofore existing Articles of Incorporation and any amendments or restatements thereof of Bonita Creek Water Company, all pursuant to the Arizona Nonprofit Corporation Act, Sections 10-3101 through 10-11702 of the Arizona Revised Statutes ("ANCA"). ARTICLE I NAME The name of the corporation is "Bonita Creek Water Company". The corporation is hereafter referred to as the "Cooperative".
