Meet the Superior Unified School

January 2023 starts a new term for Governing Board members at the Superior Unified School District. The five-member board was appointed by the Pinal County Board of Supervisors during the 2020 and 2022 governing board elections. Candidates running unopposed for school board seats are appointed by the county supervisors so the district isn't burdened with the cost of an uncontested election.

Beginning new terms this January are Hector Aparicio and Augustine "Augie" Hing. Ericka Vasquez was appointed during the fall of 2022 after former board member Max Magallanez resigned to allow his wife Elizabeth Magallanez to accept a paid position at the school district. Hank Gutierrez and Nathan Duarte were appointed following the 2020 election cycle, Gutierrez was re-appointed to a four-year term during the 2022 election cycle.

The Governing Board meets the first Wednesday of each month at the John F. Kennedy Elementary School. The board usually meets at 6 p.m. however times and dates may change due to holiday schedules.

Meet the Superior Unified School District Governing Board: **Hector Aparicio** is a graduate of Superior High School. He is a journeyman Heavy Duty Mechanic for Salt River Project. He also has an AAS in John Deere Construction and Forestry Technology. He is married to his wife Dianella Aparicio and they have two children, Hector and Ariel Aparicio, who attend the

John F. Kennedy School. They have a daughter Rhianna who attends school in the Valley.

Aparicio wanted to give back to the community he grew up in, which was one of the reasons he chose to seek election/appointment to the governing board.

"Our biggest strength of the district is that Superior is a big family and we all want to see our youth excel," he stated. His biggest concerns for the district is that "we are missing opportunities to help our children grow. I want to take advantage of everything we possibly can," he explained.

During his term on the board, he hopes to see more opportunities for students and to see the students excel and academically and with extra curricular activities.

Americorps returns to Superior

The Town of Superior will once again host a team of Americorps Volunteers this year. Fire Team 1 has been assigned to Superior to help build fire breaks around town and help to remove invasive species from Queen Creek. NCC-Americorps volunteers are young adults ages 18-26.

The eight-member team will be working under the direction of the Town and local contractors, Extreme Property Solutions. Extreme Property Solutions provides the proper advisement to the team when it comes to removing brush and a variety of weed and invasive species control.

The Town of Superior worked with local officials to design stronger fire breaks to protect the Town from forest fires. This year, the town was awarded grants from the Arizona Department of Forestry and Fire Management to build the fire breaks and remove invasive species from Queen Creek.
