Support Local: Kearny Golf Club

n April 2020, COVID-19 brought much of Arizona's economy to a screeching halt. All businesses not deemed "essential" were ordered closed by Arizona's governor Doug Ducey.

The lockdown continued for nearly two months. When Gov. Ducey finally gave the go ahead to reopen, businesses slowly began the road to recovery. Even those listed as "essential" had a challenge with this economic recovery.

Many small businesses and non-profits in Arizona didn't survive the lockdown. The businesses that did survive are hanging on as best they can. Copper Area News wanted to give something back to the local business community as a thank you for supporting us through these troubled times. Our newspapers (Copper Basin News, Superior Sun and San Manuel Miner) have been featuring local businesses and non-profits since the beginning of 2021, encouraging our readers to Shop at Home, stay local and support our local businesses. To date, Copper Area News has featured 134 businesses and groups in the Copper Corridor.

The Kearny Golf Club is the oldest nonprofit in the Town of Kearny. Established in 1961, it is 60 years young.

Because it is an outdoor sport where social distancing is feasible, not even the pandemic shut it down. It has remained open for 60 years apart from 1983 and 1993 when the floods hit. During the floods, several fairways were under water. It only took two to three weeks for the course to reopen.

"We had to play with only seven holes because of the mud and water on three holes," said Tommy Bryce, one of the club members.

The course is looking really nice, thanks to the many volunteers who spend many hours per week doing odd jobs - mowing, watering, trimming trees, maintaining equipment and maintaining irrigation. There are no full-time employees and the course hasn't had one in more than two years.

"The course is run and operated by a club president and eight board members," Bryce explained. He offered a "great big thank you" to all the board members and the many volunteers who keep "this great place" running.

A fair number of the members are winter visitors who come to Kearny specifically for the golf course. Several of them spend a lot of time helping with care of the course

and playing plenty of golf. If anyone is interested in joining the Kearny Golf Course Family, membership is \$50 per month and includes all the golf you and your immediate family desires to play (you, your spouse and any child under
