Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission makes final decision after nine days of deliberation

Arizona's Independent Redistricting Commission has decided on the Congressional and Legislative Maps that will last Arizona for the next 10 years. The final phase of the map-making process was completed after nine days of deliberation. Congressional District Map 13.9 vote 5-0 and Legislative District Map 16.1 vote of 3-2 were approved Dec. 22, 2021. The five-volunteer members of the Commission, chaired by

Dr. Erika Neuberg, have spent the last seven months listening to in-person public comments from over 1,700 in-person and online comments recorded. There were also thousands emailed and mailed comments, about 17,000 comments submitted through the website portal and maps submitted by online and paper submissions. The Commission held 68 statewide sessions over the past 5 months inviting Arizona residents to provide input into the redrawing of the maps. These meetings were in all 15 counties from remote locations to large cities, municipalities, tribal communities attended by over 4,000 residents, city mayors, council members, tribal government officials, Latino community members and various organizations.

The creation and redrawing of the nine Congressional and 30 Legislative districts were an enormous undertaking for five commissioners. Pursuant to Article IV, part 2, §§ 1(14)-(17) of the Arizona Constitution, the Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission (IRC) is responsible for drawing final Legislative and Congressional electoral maps for the State of Arizona and providing certification to the Arizona Secretary of State. Arizona's county election administrators have traditionally been invited, near the end of the process but before final certification, to suggest minor, mostly technical changes intended solely to facilitate election administration in the counties. Once the IRC does vote, each county will have seven calendar days to provide to the IRC any suggestions for minor accommodations for election administration purposes.

"From day one this has always been a very organic process," stated Erika Neuberg, Chairwoman of the Independent Redistricting Commission.

Income Requirements Pursuant to the Code and State law, a purchaser's income may not exceed 115% (100% for families of less than three) of the greater of the applicable county or statewide median gross income, except that in Targeted Areas the purchaser's income may not exceed 140% (120% for families of less than three) of the greater of the applicable county or statewide median gross income, provided however, that in any case, the purchaser's income shall not exceed 150% of the statewide median income limit determined by the State. Such income limits may change over time. In April 2020, COVID-19 brought much of Arizona's economy to a screeching halt. All businesses not deemed "essential" were ordered closed by Arizona's governor Doug Ducey.

The lockdown continued for nearly two months. When Gov. Ducey finally gave the go ahead to reopen, businesses slowly began the road to recovery. Even those listed as "essential" had a challenge with this economic recovery.

Many small businesses and non-profits in Arizona didn't survive the lockdown. The businesses that did survive are hanging on as best they can. *Copper Area News* wanted to give something back to the local business community as a thank you for supporting us through these troubled times. Our newspapers (*Copper Basin News*, *Superior Sun* and *San Manuel Miner*) have been featuring local businesses and non-profits since the beginning of 2021, encouraging our readers to Shop at Home, stay local and support our local businesses. To date, *Copper Area News* has featured 130 businesses and groups in the Copper Corridor.

It's been said about the United States Postal Service: "Neither snow nor rain nor heat nor gloom of night stays these couriers from the swift completion of their appointed rounds." It's not their official motto – they actually have no motto at all (<https://facts.usps.com/no-official-motto/>).

Perhaps if we were to add a sentence about the COVID-19 Pandemic, it would be even more accurate.

The USPS, along with other delivery services, became a lifeline for many Americans locked down during the initial days of the pandemic. They didn't have the option to shut down. They were some of the unsung heroes – the frontline workers

– tasked with keeping the economy going.

According to the United States Postal Service, "The Postal Service's mission is to provide the nation with reliable, affordable, universal mail service. The basic functions of the Postal Service were established in 39 U.S.C. § 101(a): "... to bind the Nation together through the personal, educational, literary, and business correspondence of the people. It [the Postal Service] shall provide prompt, reliable, and efficient services to patrons in all areas and shall render postal services to all communities." The Postal Service delivers to more than 150 million addresses six days a week and picks up pre-paid letters and packages at the time of delivery. It provides mailing and shipping services through more than 36,000 retail outlets and usps.com."

San Manuel's Post Office has been serving the residents of San Manuel for more than 67 years.

A little history ...

San Manuel is a former mining town built in 1953-54 for the Magma Mining Company. The builders were Del E. Webb Construction Company and M.O.W. Homes Inc.

In April 1954, Joe Cittadini was appointed Postmaster. Joe was from Ray-Sonora where he owned El Charro restaurant and bar in Sonora and was the acting Postmaster there. He served as an aircraft mechanic with the Air Force in the Pacific during World War II.

Today, the Post Office continues its excellent mail courier services. They also sell money orders and accept passport applications.

The Postmaster is Don Pusch. The window hours are from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. The post office is located at 430 South Avenue A. The post office is reachable at (520) 385-9341.
