

Ricardo "Pro" Provencio graduated from Superior High School in 1965, earned his Bachelor's Degree from Arizona State University and earned his Master's Degree from the University of New Mexico. He enlisted in the Army and served a full tour of Vietnam, where he was awarded the Purple Heart. Pro worked for Chandler, Gilbert and Glendale Community Colleges, then at Arizona State University, and finished his career of educating and guiding young adults to their dreams at South Mountain Community College.

He had many hobbies and interests. Pro loved being outdoors, hiking, fishing, hunting and just enjoying nature. He loved his Sun Devils, Phoenix Suns, Cardinals and Diamondbacks. He was a born storyteller, which is the oldest form of communicating events, beliefs, traditions, values and goals that people have. Many have had the pleasure and lasting memories of him at speaking events, reunions, parties, or simply around the dinner table. You always walked away with another life lesson and a little more wisdom.

Town of Superior Youth Council to attend national conference

The Town of Superior Youth Council is raising funds to attend the 2023 National League of Cities Conference in Washington D.C. in late March.

During the trip the youth leaders will have the opportunity to learn additional leadership skills, network with other youth councils and visit Washington D.C. Youth Council President, Nathan Taylor reported that five students from Superior are scheduled to attend the conference: Taylor, Natalie Price, Mira Estatico, Jasmine Ortega and Leia Jimenez.

The Town of Superior began sponsoring a Town Youth Council in 2016. Since 2016, students in grades 8 through 12 were eligible to participate in the council following an application process. The program is student-led with Valerie

Garcia-Denogean serving as the advisor. The Youth Council has helped to plan and design the playground at the U.S. 60 Park and Swimming Pool Park; they are also responsible for planning the Fourth of July and Trunk or Treat events each year.

During COVID, the youth group found ways to offer activities that would be safe for the community and still volunteered at the Senior Center as needed. The youth group attends the League of Arizona Cities and Towns conference every year and this year the Juniors and Seniors, who have been participating in the program and volunteering, will be attending the National League of Cities and Towns Conference in Washington D.C. LOST hosts first Hashbrowns, History and Hiking event



Friday, Feb. 17 – Geological History of Superior: Have you ever wondered how the copper was formed in the mountains? Join ASU Geology professor Dr. Steve Semken as he gives an in-depth presentation on the geological history of Superior. Following his presentation, guests will hike on the Queen Creek Canyon segment of the LOST for an up-close explanation of the formations. Local historian and retired ADOT Engineer Rick Powers will provide an in-depth presentation on the highway and its history. Following his presentation, guests will hike from the chamber office to the Queen Creek Canyon segment for additional learning and presentations. Superior's Nathan Taylor among 39 Flinn Scholarship finalists

Nearly 40 Arizona high-school seniors will interview in March for a chance to be named a Class of **2023** Flinn Scholar.

The 39 Flinn Scholarship Finalists, who represent 35 traditional public, charter, and private high schools from six Arizona counties, were selected from about 80 Semifinalists who interviewed earlier this month.

The four high schools with two Finalists each are Basha High School of Chandler, BASIS Tucson North, Campo Verde High School of Gilbert, and Hamilton High School of Chandler.

The Flinn Scholarship, a merit-based award given by

the Phoenix-based Flinn Foundation since 1986, includes funding for tuition, housing, meals, and study abroad at an Arizona public university—a value of more than \$130,000.

Twenty Arizona high-school seniors are selected each year as Flinn Scholars and attend the Honors colleges of Arizona State University, Northern Arizona University, and the University of Arizona.

The Flinn Scholars Class of 2023 will be announced in April.

"We started with nearly 1,050 applications from students who excel in the classroom and as leaders on campus and in the community. These 39 rose to the top, and I know our Selection Committee will be challenged to select just 20 students to become our next class of Flinn Scholars," said Anne Lassen, Flinn Foundation vice president, scholarship and education initiatives. "We look forward to getting to know our Flinn Scholarship Finalists more and having them learn about the opportunities that could await them at Arizona's outstanding public universities."

Nathan is one of two Pinal County students named as a finalist. He joins Riley Biter who attends Poston Butte High School in San Tan Valley.

Volunteers needed for Foster Care Review Board

The Foster Care Review Board (FCRB), a program within the Dependent Children's Services Division of the Arizona Supreme Court, is seeking volunteers. Statewide, the FCRB has about 108 Boards and a little over 500 volunteer positions filled by dedicated board members who have a desire to advocate on behalf of children in Arizona's foster care system. In Gila and Pinal Counties, the FCRB facilitates 10 boards which are each comprised of 5 citizens from the community. The Board members are appointed by the Presiding Judge of each county's Juvenile Court.

"We have an urgent need to fill vacancies in both counties," explained Gioia Kaid who works for the Arizona Supreme Court. Currently there are five vacancies in Gila County and 15 in Pinal County.

Foster Care Review Board volunteers commit to meeting one weekday per month to review the cases of children who are in out-of-home care. The meetings are completed via video conference. Each Board reviews its assigned cases until permanency is achieved. As children return home, are adopted, have guardianship granted or age out of the system, new cases are added to the Board's review day. The Board makes recommendations to the Juvenile Court and interested parties involved in the case. Currently, Boards in Gila and Pinal Counties are reviewing the cases of about 900 children. Volunteers receive the training needed to serve in this role.

Jesse Leetham is starting his third term serving on the Foster Care Review Board in Gila County. Leetham is an active member of his community, serving on the Globe City Council and several other boards.

"I enjoy serving on this board, it is a great feeling to help both the children and parents, and be advocates to ensure they get what they need," he explained.

Leetham also explained that the board members receive training and serving on the Foster Care Review board isn't as demanding as serving as a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA).

"For those wanting to be service in these roles, but maybe don't have enough time to serve in a CASA role, this might be a better fit," he explained.

In preparation for a board meeting, volunteers receive court documents and other case materials via a secured website about 10 days before the review date. Board members prepare questions to clarify and gather information with the attending interested parties (case managers, attorneys, parents, foster parents, counselors, licensing workers, Court Appointed Special Advocates, etc.).

On the day of the review, an FCRB staff member (program specialist) facilitates the case reviews. Interested parties for each case have an opportunity to appear before the Board and speak about their concerns, successes, wants and needs. The Board asks questions and considers all information available before making recommendations. The program specialist prepares a written report which includes the Board's recommendations and statements given by the interested parties. The report is distributed to the Juvenile Court and all case participants.

To become a volunteer, you must be at least 21 years of

age and pass a fingerprint background check. You can request an application by going to the FCRB website at: www.AZFCRB.org or by calling 520-388-4300. You can also email FCRBT@courts.az.gov to request an application.

Another way to get involved is a program with similar requirements called Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), in which volunteers are appointed by the Court to advocate for a specific child with whom they are paired. 


