## Copper Corridor Communities Seeing Increase of COVID-19 Cases

Recently, State and National media have reported an increase in positive COVID-19 Cases and the new Omicron variant is spreading across the globe and has been reported in Arizona. The CDC has now reported that quarantine period for those infected can be reduced to five days, versus the 10-day period. Copper Area News collects this data from the Arizona Department of Health website, these case numbers do not necessarily reflect tests that are taken with at home tests.

The communities of the Copper Corridor continue to see an elevated increase in new cases. The CDC and other health officials warn that those who are not vaccinated should continue to practice physical distancing, wear masks in public and avoid crowded places and is also strongly recommending everyone wear a mask indoors and in group settings. There are also incidences of break through cases where people who have been vaccinated do become ill, however those breakthrough cases generally have been mild cases and the chance of death is not as high as those for unvaccinated. The Omicron variant is showing additional symptoms such a sore throat and runny nose, which is similar to the common cold. It is recommended if you are showing any symptoms of COVID-19 or cold/flu symptoms to get tested.

COVID Vaccines are readily available at local clinics in the region including Cobre Valley Clinics in Superior and Kearny, Pinal County Public Health and Sun Life Clinics. Other chain pharmacies such as Walgreens, grocery store pharmacies and CVS also have vaccines available.

Above is a chart showing the number of total cases for each of the Copper Corridor communities Feb. 7 and Feb. 14. Keep in mind that zip code data also includes unincorporated areas around a community. For instance, Riverside/Kelvin area is included in the Kearny zip code. Aravaipa and Dudleyville are included in the Winkelman zip codes, etc.

Those experiencing COVID-19 symptoms should seek testing and quarantine until they can confirm a negative test.

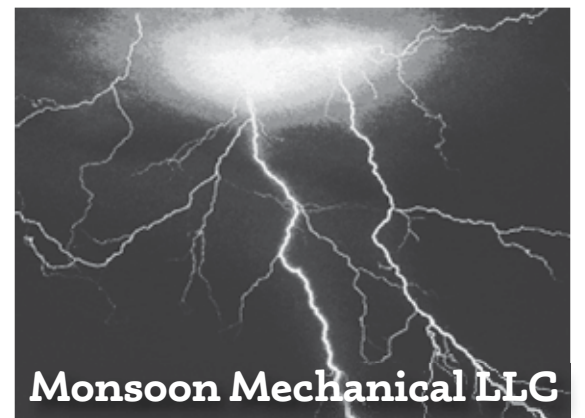

# Public comments sought on changes to Air Force training areas

The Copper Corridor region is used to playing a large role in the practice and training of both US and Arizona air troops. It is not uncommon to see several Air Force jets flying in formation or hearing the jets whiz by over your head on a walk or even an occasional and accidental sonic boom will rock your house. Authorities believe that the Telegraph and Mescal forest fires this summer may have been started by flares that did not extinguish before hitting the ground.

Leaders and land managers that are in the Outlaw, Jackal, Morenci and Reserve Military Operations Areas (MOAs) were notified that the Air Force had filed an Environmental Impact Statement that

was subsequently published in the Federal Register. An Environmental Impact Statement is a series of studies and public comment period which helps to evaluate if the requested actions by a company or government entity would affect public lands, animals, or humans.

On Tuesday, Feb. 8, the Air Force hosted a public meeting at the Superior Town Hall, one of seven public hearings that is designed to help the public better understand the process, learn about what the Air Force is requesting and also allow the public to comment on the proposed plans. Comments must be received by March 4.

The majority of the Copper Corridor is

affected by these plans as the communities of Superior, Miami, Globe, Kearny and Mammoth are located within the Outlaw MOA, with San Manuel and Oracle just outside of the Outlaw district. The Jackal MOA also covers the mountains and canyons such as the Aravaipa Canyon all the way to Safford.

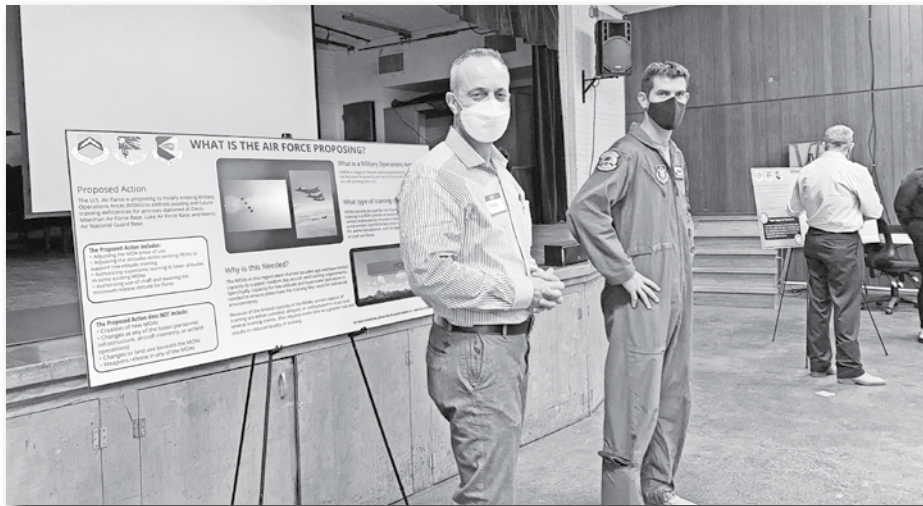
In the scoping document for the EIS, the Air Force explains that in order to continue to train properly they need to utilize existing military air space more aggressively, as other air spaces are more congested. This will also allow airmen to train and practice closer to their home bases. The air spaces are used primarily by Davis Monthan Air Force Base, Luke Air Force Base and Morris ANGB.

According to their website, the MOAs that are currently used for Air Force training in Arizona, specifically low altitude airspace and airspace that supports supersonic

operations at low altitude, have become saturated with aircraft. While the Air Force manages an extensive network of valuable SUA in the region, including the restricted areas associated with the Barry M. Goldwater Range, the volume and attributes associated with the individual MOA are insufficient to meet the current training requirements. The Air Force is proposing a regional approach that aims at optimizing the existing training airspace to meet current and future mission requirements of multiple users. The airspace proposed for optimization includes the following MOAs: Tombstone, Outlaw, Jackal, Reserve, Morenci, Bagdad, Gladden, Sells, Ruby, and Fuzzy. These MOAs overlie land located throughout southern Arizona and a small portion of western New Mexico.

Specifically for the Outlaw and Jackal

## WHAT ARE THE PRELIMINARY ALTERNATIVES?

### Alternative Selection Process

The Proposed Action and any alternatives must meet the following objectives:

- Only optimize airspace managed by the Air Force. The Air Force cannot modify another service's airspace or rely on its availability to accomplish daily requirements.
- Optimize airspace within a reasonable distance from the bases.
- Increase the existing MOAs to support low-altitude training and operations at lower altitudes.
- Increase variety of terrain in existing MOAs overflown during low-altitude training to improve training realism.
- Adjust the published times of use of existing MOAs to better align with how they are used.
- Reduce use of restricted areas for non-hazardous training to improve availability of the high-demand airspace and low-fine ranges at Barry M. Goldwater Range for hazardous training.

**Your Input is Needed!**

Scoping is the process of requesting input from the public and other stakeholders on the alternatives to include in the Draft EIS. Reasonable alternatives must meet the objectives defined above.

**Alternative 1: No Action**

Under the No Action Alternative, none of the existing MOAs would be modified and training requirements would remain unmet.

**Alternative 2**

Alternative 2 would fully optimize the existing MOAs. Proposed changes include:

- Updating published time of use to how they are currently used.
- Expanding size of Tombstone MOA.
- Lowering the floor of Tombstone, Outlaw, Jackal, Bagdad, and Gladden MOAs.
- Authorizing the use of chaff in the Tombstone MOA.
- Lowering the altitude for releasing flares in Tombstone, Outlaw, Jackal, Bagdad, and Gladden MOAs.
- Authorizing supersonic operations down to 5,000 feet AGL in Tombstone, Outlaw, Jackal, Morenci, and Reserve MOAs.

**Alternative 3**

Under Alternative 3, the horizontal expansion of Tombstone MOA would not occur. The floor of Tombstone MOA would still be lowered. The floor of Jackal MOA would also be lowered. The other proposed changes would be the same as Alternative 2.

**Alternative 4**

Under Alternative 4, supersonic operations would be authorized down to 10,000 feet AGL in Tombstone, Outlaw, Jackal, Morenci, and Reserve MOAs instead of 5,000 feet AGL. While this option would not fully optimize the airspace for supersonic operations, lowering the authorized altitude would improve the current capabilities. The other proposed changes would be the same as Alternative 2.

MOAs, their requested changes would include: flights being operated from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. Monday through Friday. Currently they are allowed to fly until 6 p.m. and from 6 to 10 p.m. but only with certain permissions via NOTEM. They are also requesting to drop flares at 500 feet in elevation. They are also requesting permission to lower the elevation where flares can be released and also lower the elevation of supersonic flying.

Comments can be made online: <https://bit.ly/AirForceEISComments> and must be made by March 4, 2022. You can mail comments directly to: Arizona Airspace, c/o Cardno 501 Butler Farm Rd. Suite H Hampton, Virginia 23666. There are also three additional public hearings: Feb. 22 in Reserve, New Mexico, at Village Hall; Feb. 23 in Morenci at the Clifton Community Center; and on Feb. 24 in Animas, New Mexico at the Animas High School. All of these hearings are scheduled

from 5 to 7 p.m.

Once the public scoping period is over, comments will be categorized and the concerns will be studied and evaluated by a private organization that specializes in these type of studies. Once the study is complete, a Draft Environmental Impact Statement will be released and there will be an additional review and comment period. Once those comments are reviewed a Final EIS will be released and a Record of Decision will be signed. It is not expected that this process will be complete until 2024.

# Pinal County redistricting will break up Copper Corridor

Every 10 years, Pinal County is required to conduct a redistricting process that ensures each County Supervisor district has an equal number of residents per district. In the process, they must also consider the connectivity and congruent connection of the district. The process must also avoid separating municipal communities and should try to avoid having incumbent candidates running against each other.

For many years, District One included eastern Pinal County, Eloy, Florence and Coolidge. During the 2010 redistricting process two additional Supervisor districts were added to balance the number of residents per district. Declining population in the Copper Corridor is affecting the ability to keep the mining communities of Superior, Kearny, Mammoth, San Manuel and Oracle together. Collectively, this part of the Pinal County is known as the Copper Corridor.

Pinal County staff has presented two options for the Board of Supervisors to vote on. Prior to the Board of Supervisors voting on final maps, there are a series of community input listening sessions. Both proposals will chop up the eastern portion of the County.

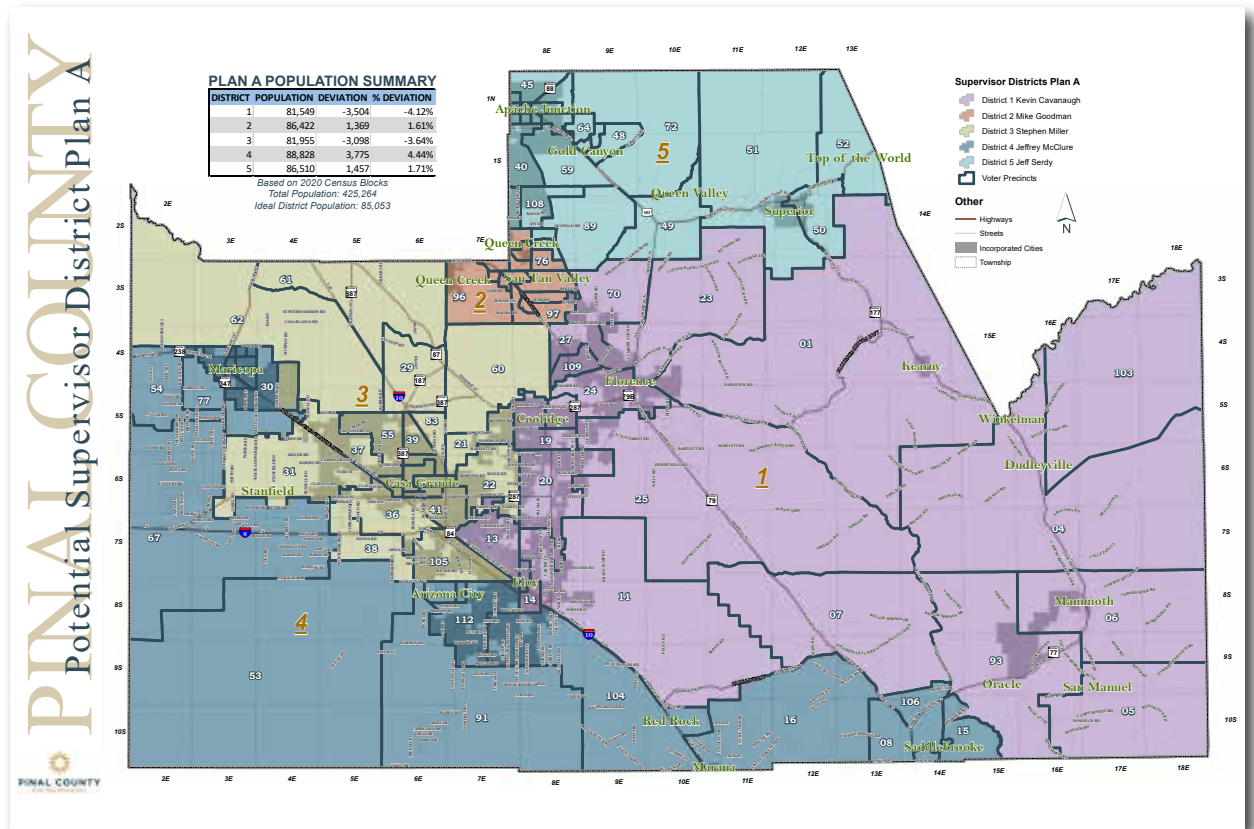
Plan A proposes that Superior join a district with Apache Junction, Gold Canyon, Queen Valley, Top of the World and a small portion of unincorporated population north of the San Tan Valley Area. This district would be known as District 5. Kearny, Mammoth, Aravaipa, San Manuel, Mammoth and Oracle would remain in District 1 with this district also including Florence and Coolidge, along with all the unincorporated areas in between. The communities south of Oracle including SaddleBrooke, Marana and Red Rock will remain in District 4.

Plan B proposes that Superior and Kearny join District 5, which would also include a small portion of prison population in Florence, Apache Junction, Queen Valley, Gold Canyon, Top of the World and a small area north of San Tan Valley.

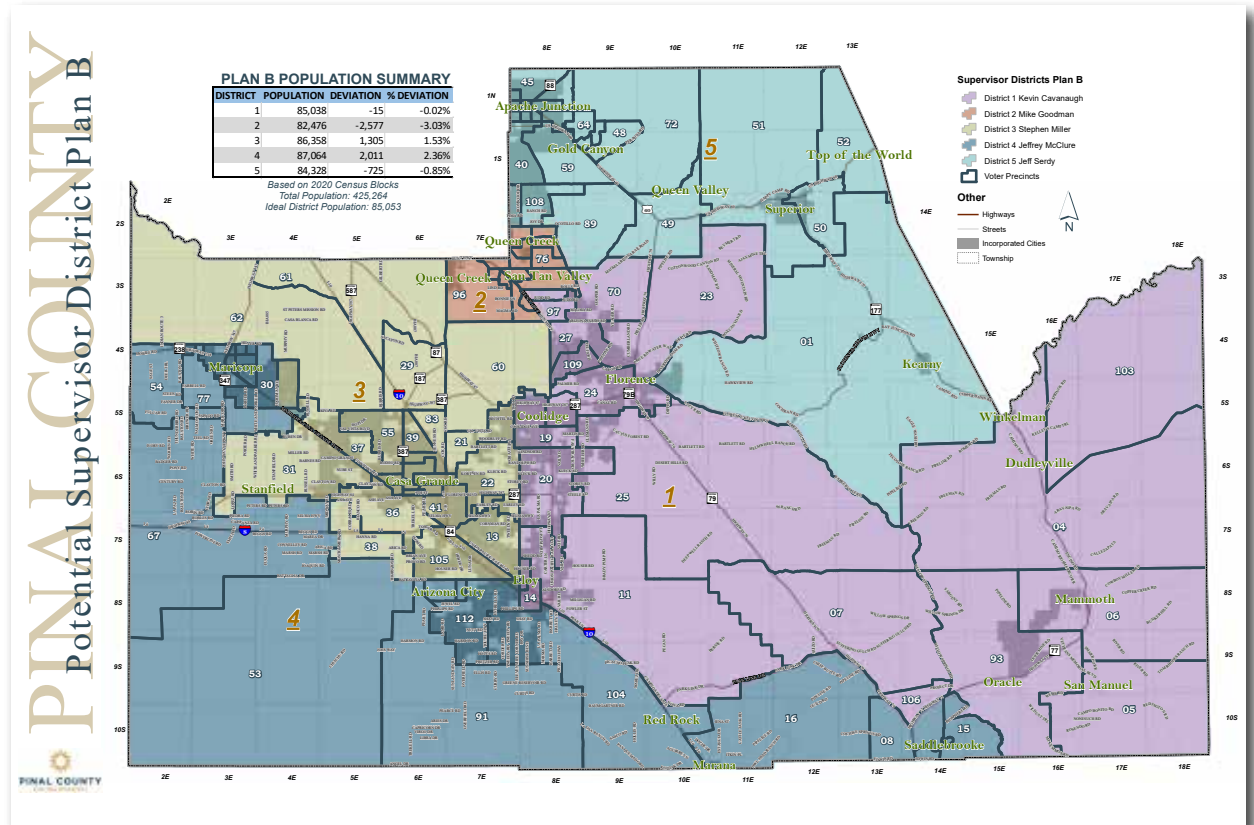
The Copper Corridor communities historically have been in one Supervisor District which helps to maintain interest among like communities. Both plans will place communities of the Copper Corridor into districts where they will be combined with much larger and more urban districts.

Residents of Pinal County are urged to participate in the public comments. There will be a public hearing in San Manuel on Thursday, Feb. 17, at the San Manuel Community Center from 6 to 7 p.m. The community center is located at 111 W. 5th Avenue. Following the community outreach events, the Pinal County Board of Supervisors will vote on a final redistricting map. The Board of Supervisors are expected to vote on the final maps in early March. The redistricting will not take affect until the next election in 2024. This will allow for voters to either vote for incumbent or another candidate.

We respect their views and will continue our efforts to understand, address and mitigate these concerns.

We are grateful for your support and eager to get to work building a new engine for the local economy and creating new opportunities for Arizonans to build the nation's clean energy future.
