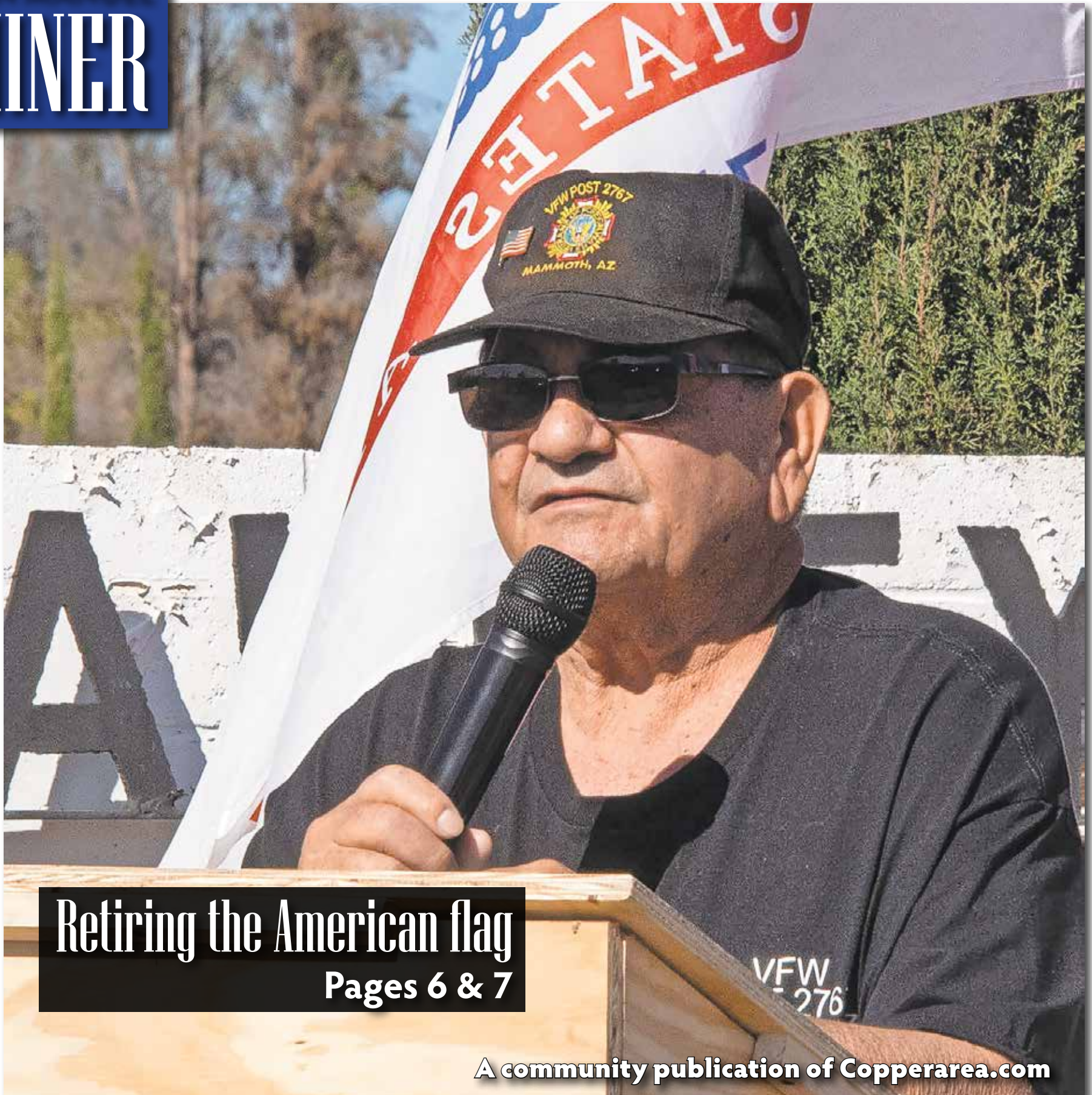

It is with heavy hearts that we announce the passing of
Robert Eugene David (Bob, BobbyGene) at his home in
San Manuel, Arizona on Jan. 7, 2023. Bob had just turned
75 years old a week prior to his passing.

Bob was born in Fowler, Kansas on Dec. 31, 1947.
He grew up in Fisher, Arkansas where he made many
wonderful memories with his family and friends. When he
was 8 years old, he got his first hunting rifle that he loved
to use to hunt coons, squirrels, and rabbits by himself. He
used to run down the tracks and swing from many trees.
In high school, he was in track and basketball, and loved
fast cars with his best friend that he called his brother,
Chris Valdez. Bob graduated from Corona High School
in Corona, California in 1965. Shortly after graduating,
he joined the Army and worked in communications from
1968-1973. After Bob was Honorably discharged, he met
the love of his life, Thelma Deanna McCament, while in
the reserves. They got married in Las Vegas, Nevada on
April 20, 1970.

Bob and Deanna moved to Oracle, Arizona with their
first child Shannon. They managed the Chalet Village for
a year. In 1972 Bob began working at MAGMA copper
company as a locomotive mechanic in San Manuel,
Arizona. This is where they decided to grow their family
and had three more kids, Danny (1973), Dean (1980)
and John (1981). Bob worked at MAGMA up until it all
shut down in 1999. Fast forward to 2001, they moved to
Colorado to be closer to their children and grandchildren.
While living in Colorado, he worked at the Yampa Valley
Medical Center where he retired from in 2009. Within
that year Bob and Deanna decided to move back home
and settle in San Manuel, Arizona.

Bob absolutely loved spending time with his family. They
spent a lot of time outdoors (hunting, fishing, camping,
shooting, and taking long rides on four-wheelers and
motorcycles). His indoor hobbies were going out to the

casinos and playing
the slot machines
and bingo. Playing
cards was his favorite
at-home activity, as
well as watching John
Wayne movies. His
family has so many
fond memories of
family vacations,
camping trips, and water fights. In the end, his family is
what he enjoyed the most.

who was strong willed. He was a pillar of strength with a
heart of gold. He always gave the best advice, and he was
there for us no matter what.

David; his mother Tha Dennis-David; his three siblings,
Calvin, Jack, and Betty; and his grandson Robert Charles
Donelson (Bobby).

Bob is survived by his wife, Deanna; daughter, Shannon
(Charlie) Donelson of Gravois Mills, MO; sons, Danny
David of Steamboat Springs, CO, and Dean David and
John David (Jessie), both of San Manuel; grandchildren,
Christopher (Paige), Preston, Max, Owen, Alina, Kiersten,

Additionally, Kevin became a certified food handler so that he could help with various lunches and he participated in fund raisers and community events such as preparing the Viper Fire truck as a display during Christmas, the annual Free Brush Dump Day, the Oaks Festival set up for the booths, parade and car show.

And, if that wasn’t enough, he was meticulous in his monthly inventory and maintenance checks of the CERT van and trailers, with his trusty co-Chair, David Harris.

The Oracle Rodeo

In February 2025, it will be the 100th Anniversary of the Fiesta de los Vaqueros/Tucson Rodeo. This is one of the top 25 professional rodeos in the country. What is little known is that Oracle and ranchers of the lower San Pedro Valley have a connection to the rodeo's history and a rodeo in Oracle may have influenced the start of the first Fiesta de los Vaqueros in 1925. In fact, the late rancher George Stone Wilson said that the Tucson Rodeo was created because of the success of the Oracle Rodeo.

George Wilson was the owner of Rancho Linda Vista and an Oracle pioneer. In a series of biographical articles that he wrote titled, "Saga of Oracle, Mountain Cow Town," published in 1965 by the *Arizona Cattlelog*, George insinuates that Tucson stole the rodeo from Oracle and there is some historical evidence to support his allegations. He also alleged that Tucson took away Oracle's health resort business.

George said that in 1924 "the people of Oracle wanted to put on a rodeo." He was selected along with Jack Jamieson and Jack Frieborn to organize the event. Jamieson owned a large sheep ranch in Oracle and Frieborn was the game warden and forest ranger for the Catalina District of the Coronado Forest Reserve. Charles Gilliland a wealthy businessman agreed to underwrite the rodeo and cover any losses. Gilliland owned and built El Rancho Robles and financed the construction of St. Helen's Church in Oracle.

The rodeo and barbecue were scheduled for Sunday, April 13. It would be a one-day event. Two noted rodeo performers were hired to manage the event, Tex Parker and "Scout" Maish. Tex Parker was a famous rodeo clown and bronc rider. He had also appeared in a few silent movie westerns. Frank Maish received the name Scout from the famous western movie idol Tom Mix when they worked together on the 101 Ranch in Oklahoma and were part of the 101 Wild West show. Scout was also a world champion bull dogger and steer

roper. He was the second "white man" to bull dog a steer. He was taught bull dogging (now known as steer wrestling) by the man who invented the sport, Bill Pickett, an African-American cowboy who was also part of the 101 Wild West show.

The rodeo grounds were set up on the Jamieson ranch along with some barbecue pits. Five steers weighing 500 pounds each were selected for the cook out which would include barrels of beans. Some of the best broncos were brought in from associates of the Prescott Frontier Days Rodeo and the Florence Rodeo. E.E. Gill the advertising manager for Steinfeld's department store

in Tucson handled the promotion and directed the events.

The advertising campaign went well as cowboys from the southwest began pouring into Oracle. Many of them came in a week early. The hotels in Oracle could not accommodate all the cowboys and many cowboys could not afford a hotel so tents were set up at the Jamieson ranch. Cooks from the area's ranches shared the cooking chores for the rodeo contestants. Over 154 contestants came to compete in calf tying, team steer tying, bronco riding, bull dogging, Maverick race and cow pony



race. The original prize money for the rodeo was \$750 but, with the unexpected number of entries and when a number of cowboys arrived from California at the last minute, it was raised to \$1,200.

The advertising campaign included newspaper ads, posters and post cards mailed out to different locations. The newspaper ads in Tucson included information that patrons would be greeted by best-selling author Harold Bell Wright. Mr. Wright was riding a wave of popularity with his current book, *The Mine with the Iron Door*, and the Rialto Theater in Tucson was showing the movie, *When a Man's a Man*, based on one of Wright's books. It was also announced that filming of the movie, *The Mine with the Iron Door*, would begin in July in Oracle, Tucson and the Cañada del Oro.

It was also advertised that the University of Arizona band would be performing during the barbecue. Six movie cowboys from Los Angeles would be in attendance and Tom King, the famous outlaw bucking horse would be there to "toss the boys". An ad also hinted that a steer would be bulldogged from an automobile. Patrons were urged to bring their own plate, knife, fork, cup and spoon for the barbecue.

George Wilson said they would have been happy with 500 people showing up to watch the rodeo and that is what they expected. Over 3,200 tickets were sold and because kids were allowed in free, the *Tucson Citizen* reported that about 5,000 people were in attendance. This was probably more than 10 times the population of Oracle at the time. The cooks served up six steers, 200 pounds of beans and 1,200 loaves of bread. They ran out

of food and only about half of those in attendance got to eat. Despite this, the Oracle Rodeo was well received and was successful. The *Citizen* noted "that practically all the pioneer cattlemen of the county were brought together for the first time in years, and by many of these it was declared that the attendance was larger than has ever

been drawn to a rodeo in this county."

Several local cowboys did well at the rodeo. With 52 teams competing, John Rhodes and a cowboy named Antonica took first in steer tying. O.R. "Ope" Parker and Jesus Lopez took third. O.R. Parker also took third in calf tying. E.E. Gill said that the rodeo committee "was highly pleased with the results and the response was far greater than had been anticipated." They would be better prepared next year for what they had believed would be an annual event. The event had turned a good profit which was put in the bank to be used for next year's planned rodeo. This was not to be as shortly Tucson would steal their thunder. Tucson businessmen seeing how successful a rodeo held in a small town had been, decided to put on one of their own.

In November, Tucson newspapers announced that a wealthy businessman from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania was planning on sponsoring a big rodeo for Tucson. Leighton Kramer had been a regular winter visitor in Tucson since 1918 and owned a home and property in Tucson. Kramer was forming the Arizona Polo Association of Tucson. The Polo Association along with local businessmen would organize a large rodeo to attract wealthy tourists to Tucson. The *Tucson Citizen* reported that Major John B. Johnson, professor of military science and tactics at the University of Arizona and an expert polo player, was chosen as one of the vice-presidents, while Charles Gilliland, an enthusiastic sportsman who was a chief factor in putting over the big rodeo at Oracle last summer, was named as the other vice-president.

George Wilson said, "Since Mr. Gilliland decided that we did not want to compete with the Tucson show we never had another rodeo in Oracle." The money saved from the Oracle Rodeo was used for local improvements in town. Despite the loss of an annual rodeo, the ranchers and people of Oracle and the surrounding area supported the Fiesta de los Vaqueros. The Oracle dude ranches arranged for tickets and transportation of its guests to Tucson for the Rodeo. Local cowboys competed in and won rodeo events. Ranchers, local groups and businesses participated

in the annual rodeo parade and local ranchers provided live stock for the events. Oracle and lower San Pedro Valley cowboys and ranchers continued to hold rodeos, roping contests, horse races and equestrian events. Although these events were never as big as the Oracle Rodeo, these cowboys and cow girls are to this day keeping their western traditions alive.

Whether or not you believe that Tucson stole the rodeo from Oracle, it certainly was influenced by the 1924 Oracle Rodeo and over its history the Fiesta de los Vaqueros has connections to Oracle and the lower San Pedro Valley and its rich western heritage.

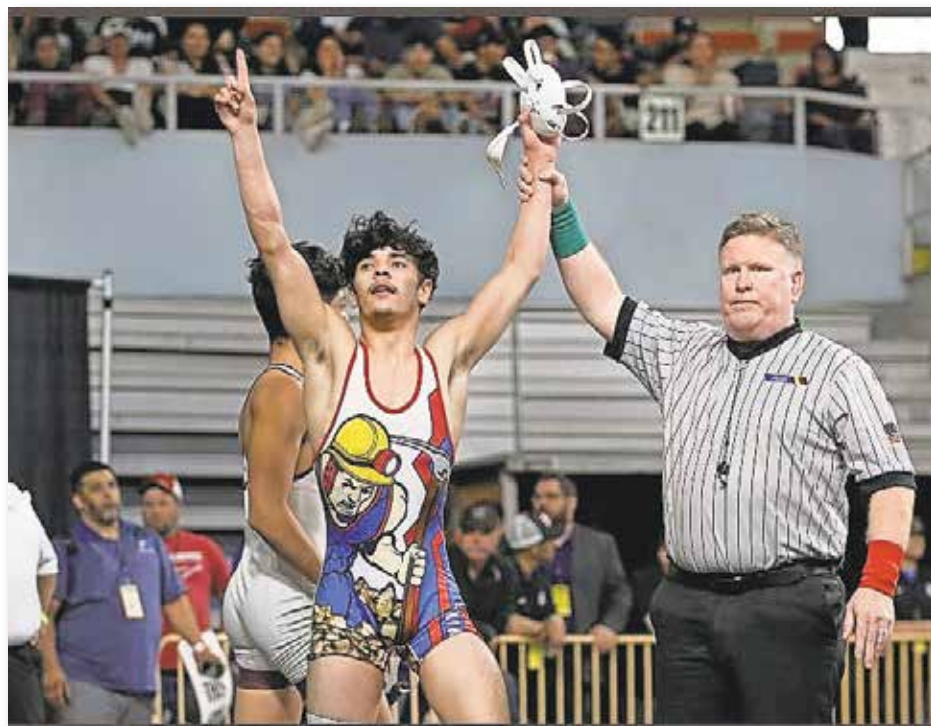

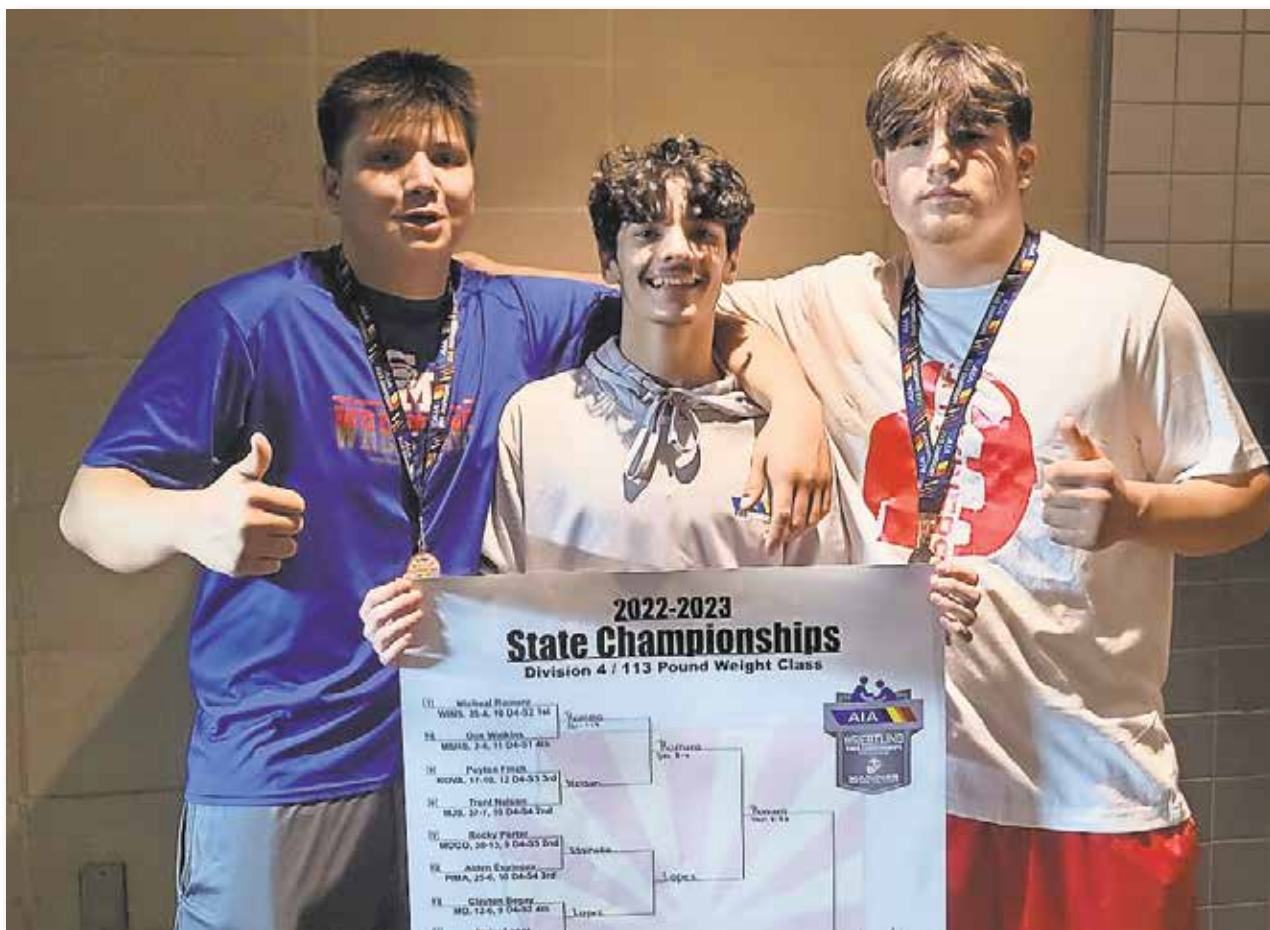
Lozoya and Garcia are now two-time, all state placers. Garcia, Lozoya, and Morris all eclipsed the 50-win mark this season.
