Mayor's Minute - Following the Legislature

n August 2022, it was an honor to be elected by my peers to the officer position of Treasurer for the Arizona League of Cities and Towns. As Treasurer, I also serve on the organization's Executive Committee, and along with other public sector officials, serve as a steward not only for our Town of Superior, but equally important, for Arizona's other 91 cities and towns.

Currently, there are several bills proposed by our State Legislature that will have devastating effects on our communities. It is often concerning to me how disconnected many of our legislators are from the day-to-day lives of the people of Arizona. Some of the bills that are making their way through the legislative process range from imposing zoning restrictions to repealing grocery and rental taxes for cities and towns. Of course, these bills are praised by their sponsors and supporters as a means to provide inflation relief and increase affordable housing. Unfortunately, as they are written, these bills will only hurt cities and towns and can destroy the character of our unique and often historic neighborhoods. Ending the ability for cities and towns to levy rental and food taxes will be unfair for all residents of Arizona, as not every city and town has a rental or food tax. SB 1117 - This bill would create byrights zoning across Arizona, which would mean the local planning and zoning

process would no longer be applicable and developers could build whatever they wanted to build in any particular neighborhood. This bill is supposed to help increase affordable housing opportunities, but what is means is there will be little to no checks and balances to ensure that new development helps to maintain or enhance a neighborhood. A developer could build up to 10 residences on one acre which might be fine and acceptable to some neighborhoods but could be harmful to others.

SB 1063/SB1098/HB2061/SB1184/ HB2067 - These bills eliminate critical local revenue and do not provide meaningful relief to all consumers because not every city or town has grocery or rental taxes. These bills propose that cities and towns can no longer levy a food tax or rental tax. If these bills are approved by the Legislature and Governor, they would cause a huge hit to the revenues and budgets of communities across the Copper Corridor. While Superior does not levy a tax on groceries, we do charge a rental tax that is charged to the owner of rental properties. Just for starters, if the rental tax is eliminated Superior will lose around \$11,000 in the beginning and as the years progress, that number will increase up to \$65,000. For our neighboring communities, the cost of losing revenue from grocery taxes and rental taxes will truly affect their ability

to maintain quality public safety, parks and recreation and other important community infrastructure. The loss of food tax revenue for the City of Globe will be \$931,462, which is 15.6% of their general fund revenue; Kearny will lose \$22,311 or 2.9% of their general fund budget; Mammoth will lose \$77,653, which is14.8% of their general fund and Winkelman will lose 5.8% of its general fund or \$8,917.00. General fund revenues for cities and towns in our state are the most flexible revenues that can go to parks, public safety and administration; they are not restricted for example, to only pay for road work.

These are only the bills that affect revenues to cities and towns, there are countless other bills that can hurt our public school systems and much more. There is some hope that a bill to appropriate transportation dollars will provide funding for our much-needed Panther Drive low water crossing. The Copper Corridor is represented by Legislative District 7 elected officials, Senator Wendy Rodgers, Representative David Cook and Representative David Marshall. It never hurts to reach out to them to share your concerns.

You have probably noticed some construction at the airport and throughout town, all of that digging and trenching is part of our wastewater treatment plant improvements and renovations. This

project took us several years to begin construction with engineering delays, COVID and of course inflationary costs. These improvements will be a cost savings to the town as the plant will function with much better energy efficiency, provide a backup system to ensure our sewer system is always able to function properly and also improve access to sewer mains in older neighborhoods. We began the funding and preliminary engineering for this project, in 2015. Yes, too often, progress on these types of essential projects is very slow, but we are excited to see this project under construction. Another fun project that will be starting






