

Aravaipa Running -Copper Corridor Race

The third annual Aravaipa Running Copper Corridor trail run was held this Saturday in Superior. This race consists of a variety of lengths 50k, 31k, 17k, 12k and this year they added a 5k hill climb that used the Legends of Superior Trails Queen Creek Canyon segment to the original US 60 tunnel. The 50K race is the longest race. The course is the entire circumference of Picket Post Mountain through Arnett Canyon and starts and ends in Downtown Superior. The other lengths include the Legends of Superior Trails through Superior and onto the Tonto National Forest.

Organizers mentioned that this year's

race was one of the best attended, and it was obvious to the community with so many out of state license plates on vehicles throughout the community. This year, Superior Police Chief Frank Alanis and his son participated in the 17k race. Chief Alanis reported that he set a goal to finish the race in three hours but finished

ahead of schedule at two hours and 20 minutes.

Aravaipa Running hosts a variety of trail running events across the state of Arizona and the western United States. Following the races, runners enjoyed post race activities and, of course, the local restaurants and shops in Superior.









AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR, ARIZONA,
ADDING ARTICLE 3, OF THE SUPERIOR CODE BY ADDING SECTION 6-3-1
JAIL RECOVERY FEE, 6-3-2 COURT DEFAULT JUDGMENT RECOVERY FEE,
6-3-3 COURT WARRANT ADMINISTRATIVE FEE, 6-3-4 COURT DEFERRED
PROSECUTION FEE, 6-3-5 COURT MONITORING AND PROBATION FEE and
6-3-6 INDIGENT ADMINISTRATIVE ASSESSMENT FEE; 6-3-7 WUNICIPAL COURT
ENHANCEMENT FEE; ESTABLISHMENT OF FUND RELATING TO COURT FEES;
AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council
of the Town of Superior, Arizona, that the Code of Ordinance of the Town of Superior,
Arizona, is amended by adding Chapter 3, Court Fees, Section 6-3-1, to read: ARTICLE
3 COURT FEES 6-3-1 Jail Cost Recovery Fee A. Any person who is convicted of
a misdemeanor criminal offense in the Town Court, and who, as a consequence, is
sentenced to a term of incarceration in the County jail or any other detention facility
authorized by law, shall pay a Jail Cost Recovery Fee to reimburse the Town for its
actual expenses incurred by reason of such confinement. B. A Town judge may waive
all or a portion of the Jail Cost Recovery Fee set forth in subsection (A) after finding
the convicted person has a substantial financial hardship or is indigent based on sworn
affidavits. C. If the prisoner pays some or all of his or her fine, surcharges, restitution or the convicted person has a substantial firancial hardship or is indigent based on sworn affidavits. C. If the prisoner pays some or all of his or her fine, surcharges, restitution or other fees over time, the Jail Cost Recovery Fee shall be collected prior to the payment of any fine, surcharges or other fees except restitution, and the Court Enhancement Fee as established in Superior Town Code, Chapter 6, Article 3. Section 2: Chapter 6 of the Superior Town Code, is amended by adding Section 6-3-2, to read: 6-3-2 Court Default Judgement Cost Recovery Fee a. Default Judgment Cost Recovery Fee in the amount of forty dollars (\$40.00) shall be imposed on each default judgment entered for failure to appear in a civil traffic violation case or for failure to satisfy in full a civil sanction imposed in a civil traffic violation case. Section 3: Chapter 6 of the Superior Town Code, is amended by adding Section 6-3-3, to read 6-3-3 Court Warrant Administrative Fee A. When the judge of the Town Court issues a warrant for non-compliance with court orders, failure to pay a fine, failure to pay restitution or failure to pay any other fees the judge shall impose an administrative fee in the amount of seventy dollars (\$70.00) upon the person for whom the arrest warrant is issued; and this fee shall be added to the amount set forth in the arrest warrant. B. The Town judge may waive all or a portion of the administrative fee set forth in subsection (A) above when in the judge's opinion such waiver would be in the interest of justice or after finding the person has opinion such waiver would be in the interest of justice or after finding the person has a substantial financial hardship or is indigent based on sworn affidavits of the person. C. If the person pays some or all of his or her fine, surcharges, restitution or other fees c. If the person pays some of an of ins or field fine, such argues, restitution of other fees over time, the Warrant Administrative Fee shall be collected prior to the payment of any fine, surcharges or other fees except restitution, as established in Superior Town Code Section 6-3-1 through 6-3-6. Section 4: Chapter 6 of the Superior Town Code, is amended by adding Section 6-3-4, to read; 6-3-4 Court Deferred Prosecution Fee A. A Deferred Prosecution Fee in the amount of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be imposed in each criminal charge for which the Court defers prosecution pursuant to Rule 38 of the Arizona Rules of Criminal Procedure (or its substitute). The Town Judge may waive all or a portion of the fee set forth in subsection (A) when in the judge's opinion such waiver or a portion of the fee set forth in subsection (A) when in the judge's opinion such waiver would be in the interest of justice or after finding the person has a substantial financial hardship or is indigent based on sworn affidavits of the person. Section 5 Chapter 6 of the Superior Town Code is amended by adding Section 6-3-5, to read: 6-3-5 Court Monitoring and Probation Fee A. The Town Court shall assess each defendant placed on probation or a period of deferred prosecution a fee of thirty dollars (\$35.00) per month. or part of a month which the defendant remain on probation or deferred prosecution. B. The Town Court shall assess each defendant, not on probation or deferred prosecution but ordered to complete education, treatment, counseling and/or screening, a one-time fee of thirty dollars (\$30.00). C. The Town Judge may waive all or a portion of the Court Monitoring and Probation Fee established in subsection (A) and (B) after finding the defendant has a substantial financial hardship or is indigent based on sworn affidavits. D. There is hereby created a Probation/Deferred Prosecution Administration Fund account. E. The Probation/Deferred Prosecution Administration Fund account. designated fund account with the Town Finance Director. The Town Court shall collect said fees and deposit them in the Probation/Deferred Prosecution Administration Fund account. The Town Finance Director shall invest the monies in the Fund in the same manner as Town funds. Interest earned on Fund monies shall be deposited in the Fund. F. The Town Court shall administer the Fund and may make expenditures from the Fund F. The Town Court shall administer the Fund and may make expenditures from the Fund for the purposes provided in this Section. Monies from the Fund shall supplement monies already provided to the Town Court for the administration of Court monitoring duties as stated in this section. D. If the defendant pays some or all of his or her fine, surcharges, restitution or other fees over time, the fee created herein shall be collected prior to the payment of any fine, surcharges or other fees, except restitution, as established in Superior Town Code Section 6-3-1 through 6-3-6. Section 6; Chapter 6 of the Superior Town Code, is amended by adding Section 6-3-6 to read; 6-3-6 indigent Administrative Assessment Fee. A. in addition to court appointed attorney reimbursement costs, the Town Judge may order indigent defendants to pay an administrative assessment fee in an amount not to exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), when the Town Judge has appointed legal counsel pursuant to the Arizona Rules of Criminal Procedure. B. The administrative assessment fee collected pursuant to subsection (A) shall be paid into the general fund of the Town and used to defray the costs of court appointed counsel. Section 7: Chapter 6 of the Superior Town Code, is amended by adding Section 6-3-7, to read; 6-3-7 Municipal Court Enhancement Fee A. A person convicted of a criminal offense, petty offense, found responsible of a civil offense or placed in a count-authorized diversion program in the city court shall pay a Municipal Court Enhancement Fee in the offense, petty offense, found responsible of a civil offense or placed in a court-authorized diversion program in the city court shall pay a Municipal Court Enhancement Fee in the amount of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each offense which they were convicted, found responsible or the prosecution suspended. B. A Town judge may waive all or a portion of the Municipal Court Enhancement Fee set forth after finding the convicted person has a substantial hardship or is indigent based on sworn affidavits. Section 8: The above established fees shall be collected effective BLANK, 2023.
