The Superior Baseball team competed in the 36th Annual Joe Padilla Baseball Tournament last week. The Panthers started off the tournament with a 9-4 victory over Florence. The following day, the boys played against Santa Cruz Valley, and walked away with a close win of 6-5. Later that day, the Panthers played against Estrella Foothills, where they suffered a tough loss of 2-19. The next day, they took on Hayden, and lost in the 3-12 game. Marcos Galindo batted .571 on plate appearances with 4 hits, 4 RBI, 1 BB, 1 HBP. Antonio Lopez batted 1.000 with 2 bits 1 RBL 4 BB Zach Duarte batted .556 with 5 bits

"Overall, we went 2-1 in pool play, made the main tournament, lost to Hayden but we started better this year than we did last year. We have to clean up some things and keep working to get better. I am proud of how we played but we are not done yet," commented head coach Manuel Ortega.

The Lady Panthers will kick off their season on March 7, against Hayden. Head coach Alfonso Lopez stated, "After a stellar season last year we start a new season with high expectations. Big shoes to fill after graduating four seniors from last year but we have a great group of freshmen this year and learning fast, combined with our returnees we should be able to compete. 



and Mayor John Thompson, Coolidge. Pinal County and the City of Globe were represented by staff members. During the round table meeting, a variety of issues were discussed: a key point discussed was transportation funding not only for larger road projects like I-10 but also the need for funding for neighborhood streets. Supervisor Woody Cline along with Mayor Davis discussed the needs for veterans. Sinema has been supportive of the development of the Gila County Veterans Retreat center in Young. Another topic discussed was wildfire prevention and the need for funding for post fire support to prevent funding and repair fences used by ranchers. Currently funding available comes with so many restrictions that it is often impossible to spend with the grant requirements.

Another topic of importance to the region was the need for responsible mining of American minerals. Mayor Besich thanked Sinema for her support of the Resolution Copper project and expressed frustration that the Federal **Environmental Impact** Statement still has not been re-released. Sinema shared that she has been working with the Arizona Manufacturing and Defense Council to identify areas in Arizona where critical minerals can be mined.


