### Americorps completes fire break for Town of Superior

Since the Telegraph fire in 2021, the Town of Superior has been working proactively to protect the town from forest fires. Recently the Town of Superior received a grant in the amount of \$162,215 from the Arizona Department of Forestry and Fire Management (DFFM) to build a fire break, protecting the Town from the south.

To complete the project the Town was able to utilize the work of an Americorps NCCC crew, to help build the fire break. The eight young adults lived in Superior for eight weeks working on the fire break, which was both on Town of Superior property and on the Tonto National Forest.

The team working alongside local contractor Extreme Property Solutions, created a fire break that is approximately 33.5 acres and is 100 feet wide and 14,000 inches long. The Town of Superior designed the fire break in consultation with Pinal County Community Wildfire Protection Plan and DFFM. The fire break is located at the Golf Course Road on the west and travels east to Highway 177, providing a full break for the south side of Superior. The Americorps Team arrived in

early January and worked through the end of March on the project.

There was a slight delay in finalizing permits with the Tonto National Forest which allowed the team to also work on invasive species removal and fire break work at the Boyce Thompson Arboretum.

While the Americorps Fire Team 1 was in Superior they also volunteered with the LOST trail to work on trails in Haunted Canyon and assisted with both the Superior Chamber of Commerce Home Tour and Mining Festival. During bad weather days, several team members also assisted with some of the remodeling work at the original Superior High School.

"This team was very instrumental in helping us move our projects forward efficiently," explained Mayor Mila Besich. "We are all going to miss them" she said. During their time in Superior many of the local organizations such as Rebuild Superior Inc., Superior Optimist Club, Legends of Superior Trails and Rotary Club hosted the team for meals and activities to help them get to know the community better.

Fire Team 1 departed Superior on

March 31 and they will be heading to Greely, Colorado to work with Habitat for Humanity to build homes in that community.
