## Superior Food Bank re-energized

Hunger is everywhere. There isn't a community or neighborhood that doesn't have residents who are dealing with hunger issues. According to United Food Bank, 798,790 people are facing hunger, of those people 269,610 are children. Superior is not exempt from hunger and for generations, Superior has served the hungry through the Superior Food Bank which had humble beginnings within the community when the program operated as Project Happy Face, which provided food during the holidays.

Throughout the pandemic, the need for the services of the Superior Food Bank grew and a small but tireless group of committed residents ensured the food boxes were filled and distributed monthly. That group also served Superior through a variety of economic downturns and labor strikes. While the group was able to maintain the day-to-day operations of food distribution, managing the organizational operations and reporting was often daunting. During the pandemic, the Superior Food Bank and Rebuild Superior Inc. formed a unique partnership where Rebuild Superior Inc. would manage the organizational management and reporting for the Food Bank, which allowed the leadership of the food bank to focus on food distribution. The Superior Food Bank merged into a program of Rebuild Superior Inc. which has allowed the services and operations of the food bank to expand and grow.

"I am excited to see the next chapter unfold as we bring in paid staff support. We're all deeply grateful to our volunteers who give selflessly in many different ways," explained Manny Guzman, who serves as the president of Rebuild Superior Inc. and the Superior Food Bank. The food bank was awarded funding to hire staffing to build capacity for the organization.

The first position created was funded through the Alliance for Arizona Non-Profits through the Americorps programs. Local resident Saundra McGarry was hired to serve in the position, where she will be responsible for developing systems that will help to make the food bank and Rebuild Superior work more efficiently. She will also be focused on volunteer recruitment and management. During the food distribution and stocking days, the food bank needs at least a dozen volunteers. Saundra will be responsible for helping to increase volunteers at the Food Bank.

The second position created was a Pantry Manager. This position was also funded through a grant from the Arizona Food Bank Network. Patty Ann Taylor, a lifelong resident of Superior, accepted the position. She will be focused on managing the food systems and distribution. Superior was one of two food banks selected for the program, which in addition to funding for the position, there is a two-year coaching program to help the food bank build additional capacity.

"The food bank has endured some tough losses in the past year with the unexpected deaths of key leaders but the strength of our mission has kept us going to make sure our neighbors have the their most basic of needs met," said Guzman.

Currently the food bank board is led by Guzman who serves as President, Vice Chair Sandy Van Gorp, Secretary Angel Preciado and board members Richard Tameron and Mable Cox.
