Hayden Police seek information on shooting in Winkelman Flats

One person was injured early Sunday morning after a shootout at the Winkelman Flats Park.

According to Hayden Police Interim Chief Brian Marquez, police were dispatched to the Park at 2:30 a.m. on Sunday, April 17, in response to a shooting that had just occurred. Upon arrival, responding officers secured the scene and began an immediate search for the suspect and any potential victims.

Officers learned that one victim had sustained a gunshot wound from a shooting that took place inside the park. The victim was transported to a hospital by ambulance with wounds that were significant but considered non-life threatening at this time. The suspect, however, fled on foot prior to the officers' arrival.

"Through their initial investigation, officers learned the victims and suspect had earlier engaged in some type of altercation, which later led to a confrontation with a large group," Marquez told the Copper Basin News. "During the confrontation, the suspect

victim and possibly others. There were other shooters that exchanged gunfire with the suspect."

Air Unit (Ranger) was called to search for the suspect and additional victims, but

The Hayden Police Department processed the scene, interviewed witnesses, and immediately begin investigative follow-up.

"Officers will continue to work to conduct their investigation," Marquez added.

The suspect was described as an unknown male adult, wearing dark clothing with a beard or face mask that fled on foot to the east of the scene.

Marquez thanked Kearny Police, Cobre Valley Ambulance, Pinal Rural Fire and Medical District, Arizona Rangers (Pinal Company), Department of Public Safety, and DPS Helicopter Ranger 1 for their assistance at the scene.





Ray Schools to host Pre-Kindergarten registration and child find

Ray School District will have its Pre-Kindergarten registration forms available online at rayusd.org or registration can also be done at the Elementary School Office Monday through Thursday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. In order to register your child for Pre-Kindergarten for 2022-2023 school year they must be four (4) years of age prior to Sept. 1, 2022. You must have a complete immunization record and a birth certificate in order to register for school. If you do not have a birth certificate you can get one for a small fee, from the Bureau of Vital

Statistics in the state in which your child was born. Those addresses are available at the Elementary School Office. Your child's physician or clinic may also provide an immunization record.

The Ray School District also offers a Pre-Kindergarten Program for students with special needs. This provides services to children, ages 3 and up with disabilities. If you suspect your child has a disability, please contact Elementary Office.

The tuition cost for 2022/2023 school year is \$100 per

semester which averages out to approximately \$1.80 per day. Tuition must be paid in advance of each semester (before Aug. 5, 2022 for the first semester and before Jan. 3, 2023 for the second semester). If payment is not made by the first day of each semester, your child will not be eligible to attend. Refunds must be requested by Sept. 7, 2022 for the first semester and Feb. 3, 2023 for second


