Hayden Police seek information on shooting in Winkelman Flats

One person was injured early Sunday morning after a shootout at the Winkelman Flats Park.

According to Hayden Police Interim Chief Brian Marquez, police were dispatched to the Park at 2:30 a.m. on Sunday, April 17, in response to a shooting that had just occurred. Upon arrival, responding officers secured the scene and began an immediate search for the suspect and any potential victims.

Officers learned that one victim had sustained a gunshot wound from a shooting that took place inside the park. The victim was transported to a hospital by ambulance with wounds that were significant but considered non-life threatening at this time. The suspect, however, fled on foot prior to the officers' arrival.

"Through their initial investigation, officers learned the victims and suspect had earlier engaged in some type of altercation, which later led to a confrontation with a large group," Marguez told the Copper Basin News. "During the confrontation, the suspect produced a firearm and shot the known victim and possibly others. There were other shooters that exchanged

gunfire with the suspect."

The Arizona Department of Public Safety Air Unit (Ranger) was called to search for the suspect and additional victims, but none were located.

The Hayden Police Department processed the scene, interviewed witnesses, and immediately begin investigative follow-up.

"Officers will continue to work to conduct their investigation," Marquez added.

The suspect was described as an unknown male adult, wearing dark clothing with a beard or face mask that fled on foot to the east of the scene.

Marquez thanked Kearny Police, Cobre Valley Ambulance, Pinal Rural Fire and Medical District, Arizona Rangers (Pinal Company), Department of Public Safety, and DPS Helicopter Ranger 1 for their assistance at the scene.

2022, including new funding that will directly strengthen rural Arizona and small First District towns. Among this direct funding I requested is \$2 million in a new investment for Superior's Entrepreneurship and Innovation Center. I'm looking forward to continued work with local leaders to bring this project to fruition," said Rep. O'Halleran.

The \$2 million appropriation will aid the town in funding the construction of elevators to improve handicap accessibility and renovate spaces for the library and senior center operations. The appropriations will be funded through the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). The town of Superior expects to begin the construction on renovations this Summer and have some of the Town's operations moved in in early 2023.


