Gila County to celebrate National County Government Month

Gila County will celebrate National County Government Month (NCGM) during the month of April to showcase how the county achieves healthy, safe and vibrant communities.

Rollover crash briefly closes Highway 77 Friday

One person was transported to a Tucson trauma center Friday after a rollover accident sent the vehicle plunging over an embankment near the San Pedro River.

At 8:30 a.m. on Friday, April 16, 2021, local firefighters from Pinal Rural Fire and Medical District and Mammoth Fire Department were dispatched to the scene of an accident not too far from the PRFMD fire station.

When firefighters arrived at the crash scene near milepost 116 on Highway 77, they found a vehicle had left the road near the river and rolled at least one time before coming to rest down the side of an embankment.

Emergency crews worked swiftly to treat and prepare the driver of the vehicle before carrying the driver to a waiting helicopter

for transportation to a local trauma center.

Highway 77 was closed briefly in both directions to allow air medical transportation to land on roadway. It was not clear what caused the accident and Arizona Department of Public Safety Troopers do not suspect alcohol was a factor in this incident. Highway 77 was reopened at 10:15 a.m.

“I am pleased by the swift actions and cooperation of all the emergency crews at this incident to rescue the single occupant of the truck. We train for incidents such as this and our firefighters performed well today,” said Bobby Apodaca, Fire Chief of Pinal Rural Fire and Medical District.

Also at the scene were Mammoth Police Department, AMR Ambulance and Air Evac.

The Hayden softball team had a tough two games last week.

The Lady Lobos started off their week playing against their neighbors at Ray. The Lobos were unable to put any points on the board until the fourth inning, and by the end of the fifth inning they were ahead by two points. It wasn't until the seventh inning that the Lady Bearcats were able to bring themselves back, beating the Lobos by only one point, with a final score 5-6.

The Lady Lobos continued their week with a Friday game against Bisbee, another tough loss for Hayden, 12-17.

The baseball team turned it around last week, and were able to pull themselves out of their two-loss streak. Playing against their rival neighbors, the Ray Bearcats, the boys played tough the whole game. The Lobos ended the first inning ahead of the Bearcats by one point, but continued to put points on the board for every inning, except the fifth. The final score was 16-8, with the Lobos emerging victorious.

Adriano Cruz pitched seven strikeouts, with 20 first

pitch strikes. Other notable players were Damien Smith with 2 hits and 2 RBIs, and Manny Guillen with 3 hits.

The Lobos secured their second win of the week against Bisbee, ending that game with a 16-8 score.

The Ray softball team was busy last week, pulling themselves out of their losing streak, and receiving their first wins for the season.

They played against their rival neighbors the Hayden Lobos, and came out on top. It was a close game, with a final score of 6-5, but the Bearcats finally found a win. Notable player Jocelyn Ruiz pitched 6

strikeouts and had 19 first pitch strikes; she also had 3 RBIs.

The Lady Bearcats' following game against Fort Thomas started out a bit bumpy, with the 'Cats down by two points

at the end of the first inning. Gaining a two-point lead by the end of the second inning, the third inning ended with a 4-4 tie. Fort Thomas gained a one-point lead at the end of the fourth. The 'Cats came up to the plate hard for the fifth inning scoring 11 points, and kept putting points on for the remainder of the game. The final score was 26-13, giving the girls their second win.

The girls had a close loss against Mogollon on Friday, April 16. The first inning ended with a 2-2 tie, but during the second inning Mogollon started to gain their lead. Only down by one point by the start of the fourth inning, the Bearcats were unable to close the gap, and spent the rest of the game trying. By the end they fell short by only one point, with a final score of 14-15.

The Lady 'Cats will play two games during the week, facing Morenci and then Superior.

The Bearcat baseball team had another busy week with three games. The first game of the week was a tough loss against neighbors Hayden. Starting the second inning down by one point, the Bearcats struggled to close the gap the Lobos were creating. The final score of the game was 6-14.

The boys shook off their Tuesday loss, and were able

to come out with a win against Tempe Prep, 10-3. Isaac Dowler-Robles lead the team with 2 hits and 3 RBIs, followed by Cody Hickingbottom with 2 hits and 2 RBIs. Isaac Dowler-Robles also pitched 7 strikeouts, and 15 first pitch strikes.

Finishing off the week was a close victory against the tough Mogollon. Down by eight points at the start of the fourth inning, the Bearcats came alive, scoring five points by the end of the inning. Still down by three points at the start of the sixth inning, the Bearcats were able to put four points on the board, giving them the lead by one point. The final score of the game was 9-8. Mark Rodriguez lead the team with 2 hits, 2 walks, 2 RBIs, and 4 QABs. Both Derek Figueroa and Tracon Naranjo pitched 5 strikeouts for the game, with Naranjo have 14 first pitch strikes.

"After taking a tough loss, our guys really came together and played gritty baseball to beat Tempe Prep and Mogollon," said assistant coach Scott Warren. "We played solid team defense, had phenomenal pitching, and our bats came alive, resulting in two big wins, heading into another tough week of games."

The Bearcats will face Tempe Prep again on April 19, followed by Morenci and then Superior.

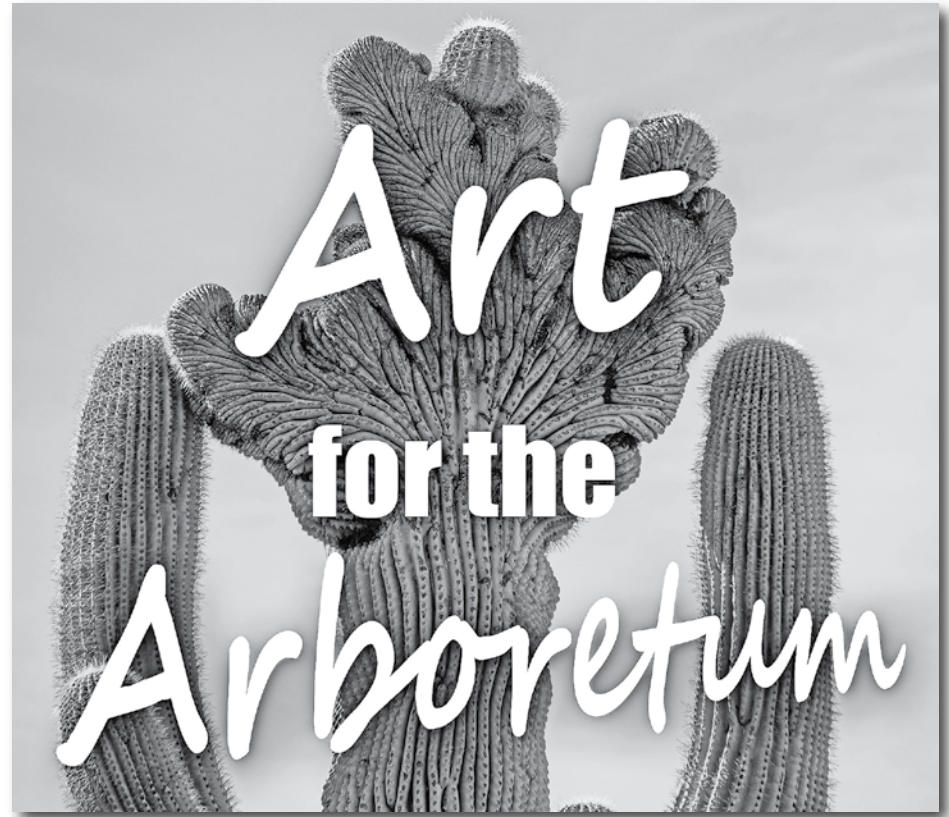
