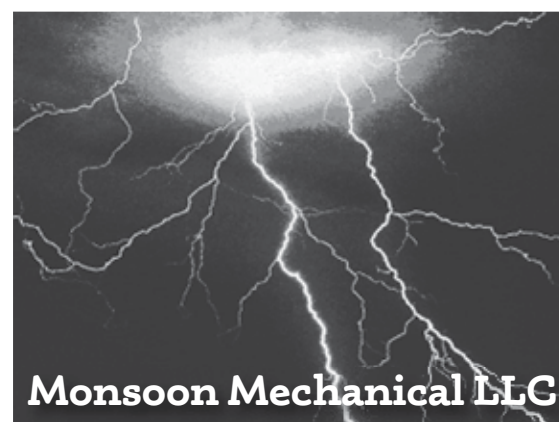

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR AUTHORIZING THE SETTING OF FEES FOR CEMETERY SERVICES
WHEREAS, THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR pursuant to Article 9-15-1 of the Superior Town Code with the duty or authority to establish fees and regulations regarding the sale, use and maintenance of the cemetery lots in order to maintain administrative control and preserve said property; and **WHEREAS, The Town of Superior** periodically sets and adjusts fees for Town Cemetery pursuant to Section 9-15-1 of the Town Code; and **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Superior, Arizona:** **SECTION 1:** The Town of Superior hereby sets the following fees for sale and use of cemetery lots:

An applicable Sales Tax and credit card use and processing fee of 2.5% will be added to the charges set forth above. A fee of \$25 shall be charged for any payment by insufficient funds. *O/C means Opening and Closing of a cemetery plot. **SECTION 2:** The Town of Superior hereby sets the following additional rules and regulations for the sale and use of the cemetery lots as a condition of sale or use of cemetery lots requiring a purchaser to: a. Provide or Submit the copy of identification for each plot at the time of purchase or reservation to verify the resident or non-resident status. b. Any deeds issued to cemetery plots will be clearly marked Resident or Non-Resident. c. The name of the person to be interred must be on the title for each plot and an appropriate resident or non-resident fee paid for the plot. d. Non-residents interred in a resident plot must pay the cost of the non-resident plot purchase fee less any amount paid for the residential plot. e. Starting their week off with a double header against Gilbert's Leading Edge Academy, the girls claimed the first win with a final score of 27-4. Analise Hollenbeck led on the mound, collecting 8 strikeouts. Leading at the plate was Hollenbeck with 5 hits, followed by Alianna Lopez with 4 hits. Danika Bryant had 9 RBIs, and hit 2 home-runs.

The second game ended with a similar result, the Lady Panthers won 25-8.

Hollenbeck once again led at the plate with 4 hits, followed by Danika Bryant, Juliana Navarro, and Myika Cruz with 3 hits each. Danika Bryant hit 1 home-

run, and had 5 RBIs. Juliana Navarro had 4 RBIs.

The girls ended their week with an away game against Ray. The Lady Panthers displayed their dominance on the field, as they only let 2 runs get past them. The game ended with a 13-2 victory for the girls. Myika Cruz led at the plate with 4 hits, followed by Juliana Navarro with 3 hits, one of them being a home-run. Myika Cruz had 4 RBIs followed by Mira Estatico with 3 RBIs.

The Superior baseball team had a rough start to their week, with a 3-13 loss to Ray. The Panthers followed that game with one against San Manuel the next day. The game against San Manuel ended at the sixth inning with a 10-10

FAIR HOUSING RESOLUTION**
A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR, ARIZONA, ADOPTING A FAIR HOUSING POLICY, MAKING KNOWN ITS COMMITMENT TO THE PRINCIPLE OF FAIR HOUSING, AND DESCRIBING ACTIONS IT SHALL UNDERTAKE TO AFFIRMATIVELY FURTHER FAIR HOUSING. WHEREAS, the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended, requires that all applicants for Community Development Block Grant funds certify that they shall affirmatively further fair housing; and WHEREAS, the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (commonly known as the Federal Fair Housing Act) and the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 declare a national policy to prohibit discrimination in the sale, rental, leasing and financing of housing or land to be used for the construction of housing or in the provision of brokerage services, on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, disability, familial status or national origin; and WHEREAS, fairness is the foundation of the American system and reflects traditional American values; and WHEREAS, discriminatory housing practices undermine the strength and vitality of America and its people; **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** THAT the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Superior, hereby wish all persons living, working, doing business in or traveling through this Town know: That discrimination in the sale, rental, leasing and financing of housing or land to be used for construction of housing, or in the provision of brokerage services on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status or national origin is prohibited by Title VIII of the Fair Housing Act Amendments of 1988; and THAT it is the policy of the Town of Superior, Arizona, to implement programs, within the constraints of its resources, to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status or national origin; and That with available resources the Town of Superior will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against in housing issues on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status or national origin to seek equity under existing federal and state laws to file a complaint with the Arizona Attorney General's Office or the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and That the Town of Superior shall publicize this Resolution and thereby encourage owners of rental properties, developers, builders, and others involved with housing to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 and any applicable state or local laws or ordinances; and That the Town of Superior shall undertake the following actions to additionally "affirmatively further fair housing." Mail this resolution to the real estate, banking, and development communities. Mail this resolution to the media regarding issues relation to Fair Housing. Post copies of this Resolution at the Town Hall and Superior Library.
