Ray School District to host pre-kindergarten registration and child find

Ray School District will have its Pre-Kindergarten registration forms available online at rayusd.org or registration can also be done at the Elementary School Office Monday through Thursday from 8-4.

In order to register your child for Pre-Kindergarten for 2021-2022 school year, they must be for (4) years of age prior to Sept. 1, 2021. You must have a complete immunization record and a birth certificate in order to register for school. If you do not have a birth certificate you can get one for a small fee, from the Bureau of Vital Statistics in the state in which your child was born (those addresses are available at the Elementary School Office). Your child's physician or clinic may also provide an immunization record.

The Ray School District also offers a Pre-

Kindergarten Program for students with special needs. This provides services to children, ages 3 and up with disabilities. If you suspect your child has a disability, please contact Elementary Office.

The tuition cost for 2021/2022 school year is \$100 per semester which averages out to approximately \$1.80 per day. Tuition must be paid in advance of each semester (before Aug. 5, 2021 for the first semester and before Jan. 3, 2022 for the second semester). If payment is not made by the first day of each semester, your child will not be eligible to attend. Refunds must be requested by Sept. 4, 2021 for the first semester and Feb. 5, 2022 for second semester.

The Hayden softball team had a rocky start to last week's games.

Competing against the San Manuel Miners for the second time this season, the Lady Lobos were once again unable to secure the win.
