

Central Arizona College receives \$2.8 million Title V grant

PINAL COUNTY, Ariz. – Central Arizona College (CAC) recently received a new five-year, \$2,894,780 Developing Hispanic Serving Institutions (Title V) grant from the Office of Postsecondary Education at the U.S. Department of Education. Ninety-seven percent of the project is funded by this federal grant and the remaining 3% (\$100,210) is supported by Central Arizona College funds.

CAC will use the Title V grant funds to increase the retention rates of its Hispanic and other traditionally underrepresented students. The college will provide resources and educational opportunities to help these students complete their education at CAC and transfer to four-year institutions.

The grant will support:

• Revising general education courses to address relevancy and offer students classroom experiences that will help to deepen their learning and increase their likelihood of graduating and transferring to a four-year institution.

Providing students with financial literacy workshops.
Providing structured learning assistance to first-year non-STEM track students taking Math 141, allowing more students to successfully pass the course and persist in their studies.

• Assisting faculty in applying Universal Design Principles to their courses and using technology to support equity and other improvements in learning.

• Providing faculty with professional development opportunities that foster greater student engagement, improved learning, and enhanced retention of students.

Implementing a coordinated approach to addressing students' basic needs.

Recently Rochelle Pacheco, long time administrator for the Ray Unified School District, announced that she would be retiring, meaning the Ray Unified School District Governing Board would need to hire a new Superintendent for the 2023-24 school year.

After an extensive search, the board hired Anthony Morrison who has been working as the Superintendent for the Wyndmere Public School in Wyndmere, North Dakota. The Wyndmere district is larger but the school he worked for had about 255 students pre-k through 12.

Morrison was born and raised in Seattle, Washington. After college he began his teaching career in Arizona, working at the **Bisbee and White River** school districts before moving to New Mexico. He has extensive experience working in Title One schools and school districts within Native American Communities.

He is currently working on his Doctoral degree in **Educational Leadership** and has a masters degree in **Educational Administration** and Secondary Education. He and his wife Nelly

wanted to return to Arizona to raise their family, since their two children were born in Arizona. The family will move to Kearny and reside in the community.

"We wanted to move to a small town, with a community feel, and not be too far from a bigger city," he explained. They have a son, Frederick who will enter sixth grade and a daughter Riley will be starting kindergarten this vear.

Morrison sees a lot of potential for RUSD and hopes to engage some of his strategic planning skills and educational training to help the schools improve their





Hayden High School students learn more about mining at 2023 Mining Career Fair

On Tuesday, May 2, several local mining companies and representatives from the University of Arizona's College of Mining and Mineral Resources and the Cobre Valley Institute of Technology descended on Hayden High School with information on careers available in the mining industry.
