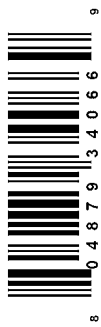
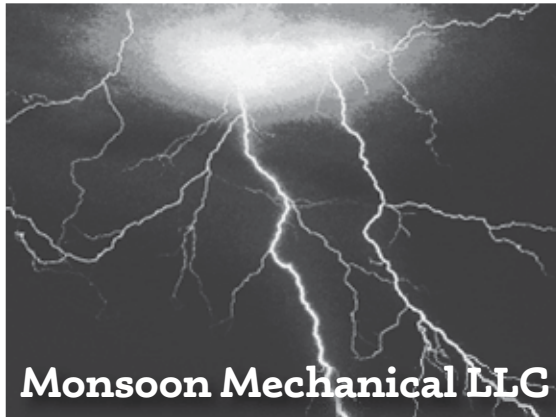

Robert "Bob" Bohrn, beloved husband, father, papa, and friend to all, passed away on Tuesday, May 17, 2022, after battling stage IV colon cancer for two and a half years. Bob was born on Aug. 19, 1957, in Ely, Nevada. He spent most of his childhood in Winkelman, Arizona and resided in Dudleyville, Arizona for the last 42 years.

Being a lover of the outdoors, Bob grew up an avid hunter and fisherman. He graduated from Hayden High School as class salutatorian in 1975 and began working at Kennecott in 1978. On April 12, 1980, he married his high school sweetheart, Germain Verdugo, and together they had three children.

Bob was very active not only in his own children's lives, but in the lives of most children in the Hayden/Winkelman community. He was a lover of sports and

Bob retired after 41 years from his job at Asarco as a maintenance engineer in October 2019. LeRoy 'Bugs' Lewis

LeRoy "Bugs" Lewis, 86, passed away Saturday May 21, 2022. Bugs was born in Kemmerer, Wyoming, May 17, 1936, to Doris and Leeroy Lewis.

Bugs graduated high school in Kemmerer in 1954 with a basketball scholarship to Casper Junior College and played for two years at Casper. He then transferred to University of Wyoming, playing basketball on a scholarship. Bugs graduated from the University of Wyoming with a Bachelor of Science degree, majoring in physical education and minoring in social studies. After moving to Arizona, he attended Northern Arizona University, obtaining his master's in physical education.

Bugs married the love of his life, Loretta Dibler, July 15, 1959. Bugs and Loretta were to celebrate their 63rd anniversary in July. They were blessed with two children, Lana and Larry, both of whom graduated from Ray High School.

Bugs began his teaching career teaching at the junior high level, transitioning to teaching high school. After teaching in Big Piney, Wyoming, for 8 years, in 1967 Bugs and his family moved to Kearny where he taught History, Social Studies and Physical Education. He eventually became the

Dean of Students at Ray High School. Mr. Lewis coached football, basketball and track. He was one of the founders of the girls' Meet of Champions track meet. He taught driver's ed in the summers. He retired from Ray High School in 1997 after 30 years of mentoring and teaching the students at Ray High School.

While in Wyoming, Bugs was an avid hunter and loved everything the Wyoming mountains had to offer. He loved camping and fishing with his family and friends.

Bugs was a loyal member of the Elks. He joined the Elks in 1967 in Rock Springs, Wyoming. After moving to Kearny, along with a group of other members, he helped establish the Kearny Lodge No. 2478 in 1972. He went through the ranks as an officer in the Kearny Lodge, eventually becoming the President of the Arizona Elks Association. He then became Elks National Youth Activities Chairman and in 2011 became the Elks Grand Lodge Esquire. He was always involved in the Arizona Hoop Shoot and was known to all as the Junk Food King.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a sister, Carol Jean Larson. Surviving in addition to his wife, Loretta (Dibler) Lewis, are daughter, Lana Fonts;

son, Larry Lewis and his wife Nancy of Camano Island, WA.; grandchildren, Tiffany Noble and Ted Besch; four great-grandchildren, Michael, Matthew, Gabriella and Ted; one brother, Frank Lewis of Dickenson, ND; two sisters, Sidney Edlund Allen and her husband Cory of Hyrum, UT, and Betty Kay Moseka of LaBarge, WY.

Danny Jay Besich

Danny Jay Besich "Bronto" passed away May 1, 2022, at 4:20 a.m. at Central Wyoming Hospice following his battle with stage 4 cancer.

He was born June 28, 1955, and raised in Superior, where he had a phenomenal group of friends and family. They gave him support while his father and mother were splitting as a young boy, and he lived for a time in the home of his cousins, Steve, Paul, and Tina Besich. These cousins were like siblings to him and, as such, had their differences at times as brothers and sisters do. He had a brother, Ross, who was like a father figure to him and took him fishing often. He lived with Ross's family for a time and took care of the daughters who were babies then so became real close to all. It caused him anguish when they moved to Idaho.

His Dad's sister, Katherine Coxon, had children with whom he became close. He enjoyed time spent with his cousin Mark Coxon due to their being closer in age than the others (Dick, Ron, and Marilyn). Dan's father Andro (Andy) preceded him in death as did his aunts and uncles and his cousin Steve Besich. He was so happy to grow up in Superior among people who gave him lots of support. The Townsend Family treated him like family as did the Bryant Family. Guy Bryant gave Dan a job at his gas station and he became best of friends with Guy Bryant Jr. They texted each other frequently until the end. Dan always remembered all of the people there for him in the start. He frequently mentioned Tony Donlin and the Tameron's who owned and operated his favorite restaurant "Los Hermanos". He had great memories of home and the many people he knew.

He gained the nickname "Bronto" short for Brontosaurus due to his stature. As an adult, he was 6'3", wore a size 13 shoe, and had a big heart to match. He went on to work for a defense contractor completing tasks required in the mining of copper to be used

chiefly for the Dept. of Defense which included transporting and using various explosives while at the Magma Copper Mine by Superior. He operated pneumatic machinery at the mine and acquired extensive First Aid Training-Assisted with Rescue and Recovery Operations following a fatal accident at the Magma Copper Mine in Arizona-He received a Certificate of Participation from Arizona State Mine Inspector. In addition to completing mining in Arizona, he did such in Douglas, WY, Tooele, UT, and then to the Silver Valley in Idaho. He and wife met in Idaho as both had moved up there from their home states about the same time. They instantly fell in love, got married in a small church in the forest of Pinehurst, ID on Feb. 14, 1980, with his brother Ross and Ross's then wife Sandy as witnesses. They moved to Dan's home state of Arizona where they lived in Superior, Mesa, and then Apache Junction.

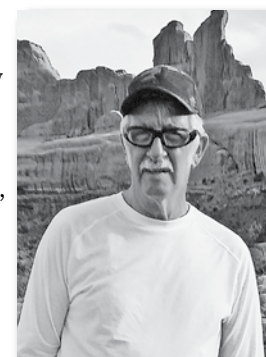
When the Magma Copper Mine closed, Dan held a variety of jobs. He worked at General Motors Desert Proving Grounds where he test drove various G.M. vehicles; Assisted and researched product design and production of automobiles with automotive engineers; Logged and reported critical data on a daily report and received the General Motors R1534 Durability Test Certification. He worked construction and completed tasks for the Prince of Tonga who owned property being built on in Arizona. Dan served as a labor foreman for the prince, supervising six laborers where he trained personnel in equipment operation and maintenance; assigned personnel to complete assignments fitting their needs and capabilities; consulted with operators in other departments and performed trouble shooting. He completed Interstate Commodities Transportation and was flexible and knowledgeable to undertake other positions.

Dan and wife decided to move to Colorado to be between Dan's family in Arizona and Suzy's family in New Mexico and Wyoming.

Colorado got too chaotic so moved to Wyoming the last quarter in 2016. Suzy's family thought highly of Dan. With his great personality, he easily obtained friends and made several after he and his wife moved back to her home of Casper, WY. They traveled to New Mexico when could to spend time with Suzy's brother Dick Farmer, his wife Jean, and their kids Jules and Jackie. Jules developed a deep connection with Danny as a child. They had a shared interest in football. While living in Colorado, he took the kids of a friend to a Broncos Event. Dan had plans to see brother Ross, but Ross died in November 2021.

Dan was genuinely wholesome, cared deeply about people, projected light, had a good sense of humor, was thoughtful, and respectful. He's one of those "ONE OF A KIND" people you meet in your life. Dan's love of the outdoors gave him many opportunities. He water skied in Arizona. He enjoyed hunting whenever the opportunity presented itself. He was a hiker and fisherman. His love of sports included playing baseball as a youth. After high school, he went on to join the Marines.

Dan is survived by wife of 42 years, Suzanne "Suzy" (Farmer) Besich, who did her best to comfort him. After cremation, a celebration of his life in Superior, AZ and one in Casper, WY are being planned. The Superior event will be held next spring when the family gets together for their annual cleaning of the cemetery in Claypool, AZ at which time, Danny's ashes will be placed next to his Father's.



LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Celebrating a Copper Corridor High School Graduation

Dream big, travel and open yourselves for new journeys and opportunities.

Throughout my life, I've been fortunate to have people who influenced my life as an adult. No matter where I go, near or far, their advice has followed me.

Pete Rios inspired me (and continues to inspire me) through his pursuit of seeking elected office and most importantly for not giving up. Even after his first political loss, he was unrelenting. Stop signs weren't a part of his drive toward accomplishing his aim to serve.

From Pete, I learned there's a difference between a politician and a political leader. By the time I was in seventh grade, I joined a group of kids who walked and knocked for his campaigns in Nogales, Coolidge, San Manuel and many places in between. He served in the state senate, house of representatives and as a Pinal County supervisor.

Another take-away was the idea of possibility—that even from growing up in poverty to challenging the powerful—a dream of public service was attainable. He proved it time after time. Pete would go on to make history as the first Latino who served as president of the Arizona state senate.

Stop and think of the people who motivated you like teachers or coaches and recollect their guidance and their best consejos (advice). Your turn is coming to care for and inspire others. Pay it forward by being a person that infuses positivity and fuels confidence.

Life is life, and it can be tough. Know you will have failures. From them, you will gain knowledge and

strength. In the course of your life there will be barriers and difficulties that may seem unfixable. You may feel lonely, anxious and go to a dark place. You might begin to have dark thoughts. Seek help. Talk to someone. Don't let pride or the opinions deprive you of healing and hope—and life.

In our world there remains the ugliness of bigotry. Whether on social media or on the streets, don't let it infect you or lead you astray into hating. Equality means everyone regardless of their background or who they love. Meanness won't feed your soul; it will sour your personal joy.

Be a good human and remember you're from the heart of Arizona.

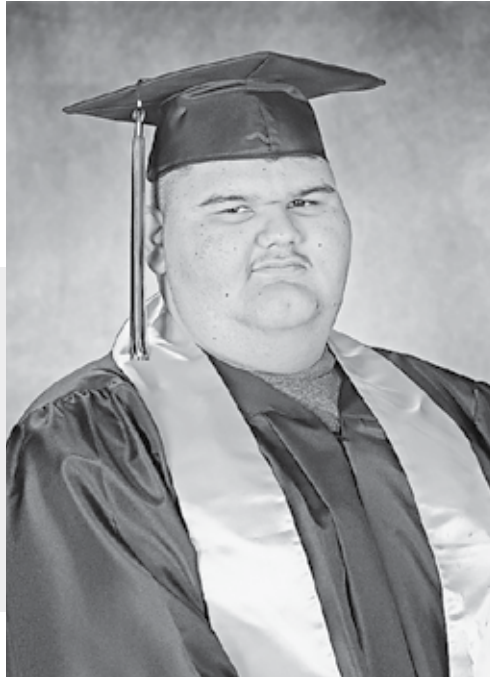

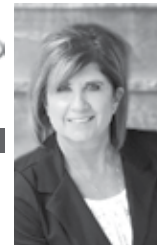

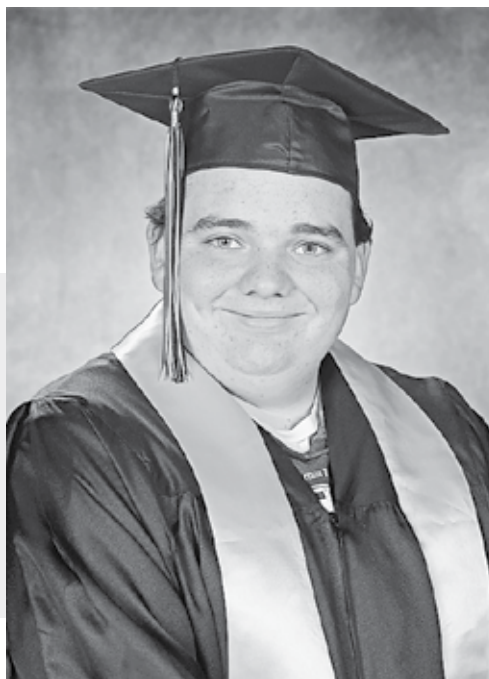

Free soil screening for Superior homeowners

Bring a soil sample from your home garden or outdoor child play area on June 4 to the Superior Town Hall, 199 N. Lobb Ave. in Superior to have it tested for arsenic and lead.

Anyone from the Superior region is welcome to visit from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and learn about your own soil, the best practices to avoid lead and arsenic exposure, gardening in residential soils and childhood lead poisoning prevention resources. While you wait for your results, enjoy food and games and learn about past soil studies in the area!

To collect soil samples, choose between five to 10

random spots in the garden, play area or other non-garden area. If you have a very small area, select three random spots, instead.

In your garden area, collect all soil from the surface down six to eight inches deep per spot. Mix soil from all spots in a clean container. Remove pebbles, rocks and roots and air dry. Do not use any flame, fire, heat gun, or oven to dry the soil.

Transfer 1-2 cups of the mixed soil into a clean quart-sized freezer bag. If you do not have a measuring cup, the bag should not be more than half full or weigh more than half a pound. Be sure to label your sample bag with

the location where soil samples were taken and how many soil samples were taken.

For the play or other non-garden area, collect all soils from surface down one to two inches. Otherwise, the protocol is the same. Do not mix soil from this area with garden soil.

Each person or family may bring up to two samples, which will need to be submitted by noon, to allow time for analysis.

recreating and before getting on the road. Make sure your vehicle is in good working order, check the tires, secure tow chains, and never pull the vehicle off into tall

vegetation as the catalytic converter can ignite the fuel. Do not toss cigarettes out of the window; use an ashtray instead.

Fire conditions, restrictions, and localized closures are subject to change. Tribal, federal, state, and local mandates can vary from agency to agency. For a more detailed explanation in regard to agency restrictions, general fire information and prevention tips, contact the land management agency you plan to visit at: WildlandFire.az.gov.

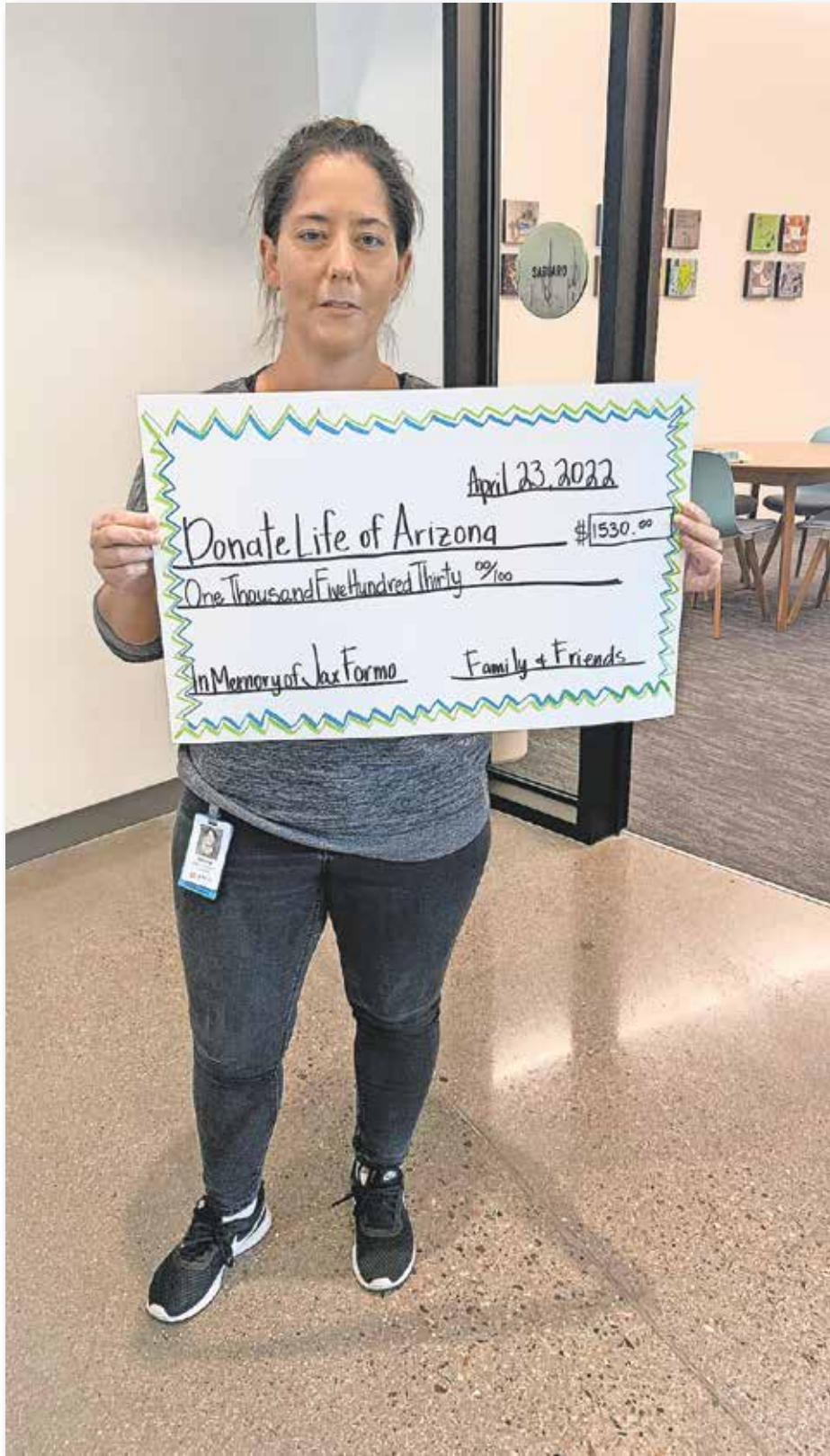
