Newton Swift Terry was born April 8, 1923, in Oracle, Arizona. His parents were Lesley Clay Terry and Florence Adeline Bangs Terry. Lesley "L.C." Terry was one of the owners of Terry and Lawton General Mercantile in Oracle. This store was the hub of Oracle and included the post office. Lesley would become the Postmaster of Oracle. Like many Oracle boys, Newton enjoyed exploring the outdoors. He rode horses, hiked many trails in the Catalina Mountains, hunted, camped and enjoyed picnics in the hills. He also participated in the small fiesta rodeos and horse races put on by local ranches such as Rancho Linda Vista. He attended grade school in Oracle and graduated from Tucson High School. In 1942, he was attending the University of Arizona when he decided to enlist in the Army.

In December, he was ordered to report to a doctor in Tiger, Arizona for a physical exam. On Jan. 13, 1943, Newton's parents drove him to Florence, Arizona. He took a bus from there to Phoenix where he was inducted into the Army and sent to Fort MacArthur, California for basic training. Following basic training, he was granted leave and visited family in California and in Oracle. He then

reported to Camp Toccoa, Georgia and then Fort Benning, Georgia and Camp Polk, Louisiana where he became a member of the 511 Parachute Infantry Regiment, 11th Airborne Division. During this time, Newton's older brother Clay Terry was serving as an Army officer overseas. Before the war's end, three more members of the Terry family would be serving: Harold in the U.S. Navy, Jack in the Merchant Marines and Nancy as a Wave in the Navy.

In February 1944, Newton was granted a short leave and visited family and friends in Oracle. He reported to Camp Stoneman in California where his regiment was preparing to be transported to New Guinea in the Pacific. In May, the regiment was loaded on the SS Sea Pike, a transport ship, and delivered to New Guinea where his parachute regiment trained for the invasion of the Philippine Islands.

In November 1944, the 11th Airborne Division was sent to the Philippines to join the Battle of Leyte which began on Oct. 17, 1944. On Nov. 27, Newton's regiment engaged in combat with Japanese troops on steep heavily forested jungle terrain in support of Army units attempting to take the town of Ormoc in the Leyte Valley. They met heavy resistance from the Japanese troops.

Newton was reported as missing in action and notice was sent to the Terry family in Oracle.

Months went by with no news of Newton. In May 1945, Mr. and Mrs. Terry received the good news that their son Captain Clay Terry was back in the United States after 34 months overseas. Captain Terry had been wounded and was in Stark General Hospital in Charleston, South Carolina. He had seen combat in seven campaigns including action in North Africa and the D-Day landings. He had received the Silver Star with cluster and a Bronze Star with cluster for valor.

It would be over a year before Newton Terry would be declared dead. His body was never found and he is listed in the National Archives WWII Army Casualties for Arizona as FOB as type of casualty. FOB stands for Findings of Death. Under Public Law 490, in the absence of a recovered body, after at least one year of Missing in Action, there is either conclusive proof that the person is dead or overwhelming evidence that under the circumstances the person could not have remained alive. Over 6,000 families would go through the agony of their loved one missing with no body found then declared dead during World War II.

Newton Terry is memorialized in the Manila American Cemetery and Memorial in the Philippines by a simple white cross made of marble with his name, rank, unit and date of death inscribed on it. This cemetery has the largest number of graves (17,206) for U.S. personnel killed during World War II.

Rest in Peace, Newton Terry, who never made it home. There are approximately 130,000 American military personnel buried in foreign lands.

CAC receives \$2.8 million Title V grant

PINAL COUNTY, Ariz. – Central Arizona College (CAC) recently received a new five-year, \$2,894,780 Developing Hispanic Serving Institutions (Title V) grant from the Office of Postsecondary Education at the U.S. Department of Education. Ninety-seven percent of the project is funded by this federal grant and the remaining 3% (\$100,210) is supported by Central Arizona College funds.

CAC will use the Title V grant funds to increase the retention rates of its Hispanic and other traditionally underrepresented students. The college will provide

resources and educational opportunities to help these students complete their education at CAC and transfer to four-year institutions.

The grant will support:

• Revising general education courses to address relevancy and offer students classroom experiences that will help to deepen their learning and increase their likelihood of graduating and transferring to a four-year institution.

• Providing students with financial literacy workshops.





Rabies incident a reminder to keep pets vaccinated

The Arizona Game and Fish Department reminds the public to protect themselves and their pets by keeping a safe distance from wildlife, especially animals that may be behaving abnormally, such as those that appear overly aggressive and/or lacking a fear of humans.

The reminder comes after a recent incident in which a dog infected with the grev fox strain of rabies bit a child in the town of Whiteriver on the Fort Apache Reservation in eastern Arizona.

"The weather is warming up and people are outside," said Dr. Anne Justice-Allen, AZGFD wildlife veterinarian. "At this time of year, we often see an uptick in the number of wildlife submitted for rabies testing as a result of contact with people or their pets."

Rabies is a preventable viral disease most often transmitted through the bite of a rabid animal. The rabies virus attacks the central nervous system, causing encephalitis (swelling of the brain) and is almost always fatal once symptoms appear. It can be prevented in persons who have come into contact or have been bitten by wild animals through prompt administration of anti-rabies vaccine and rabies immune globulin.

Pets such as dogs and cats, as well as livestock such as horses, should be vaccinated regularly against rabies. In addition, dogs should be on leashes when outdoors and a veterinarian consulted if any domestic animals are injured by wildlife. Unvaccinated animals exposed to wildlife with rabies must undergo a four-month quarantine and vaccinated animals need to be guarantined for 45 days.

"In Arizona, the principal rabies hosts are bats, skunks and foxes," Justice-Allen said. "These animals carry their own distinct strains of the rabies virus. When rabies activity within these animal

groups increases, rabies can impact other mammals, such as bobcats, coyotes, javelina, cats, dogs, horses or cows.' Often, infected animals may appear disoriented or intoxicated, salivate heavily, or appear thirsty.

The Arizona Department of Health Services (AZDHS) offers some precautions to avoid exposure to rabies: Keep people and pets away from wild animals.

• Do not pick up, touch, or feed wild or unfamiliar animals, especially sick or wounded ones.

 Do not "rescue" young wild animals you believe to be abandoned. In most cases they are not abandoned. Leave wildlife alone.

 Never leave pet food in your yard because it will attract wild animals.

· Vaccinate all dogs and cats against rabies.

 Keep pets on a leash or in a fenced yard. • If you have been bitten or scratched, wash the wound or area well with soap and water, and report it immediately to animal control or health officials.

 Take precautions when camping. hunting or fishing. Avoid sleeping on the open ground without the protection of a closed tent or camper.

• Wear impermeable gloves when skinning carcasses.

• Do not disturb roosting bats.

• If you find a bat on the ground, don't touch it. Place a box over the bat to contain it. Try to preserve the bat so it is intact for testing at a laboratory. Report the bat and its location to animal control or health officials.

According to the AZDHS website, approximately 30 people are exposed to rabid animals in Arizona annually. People who are exposed must receive vaccine and anti-rabies serum treatment to prevent infection.
