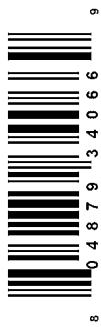

## OBITUARY

# Henry Cartwright

Henry "Hank" Cartwright, 89, passed away of natural causes at Banner Baywood Hospital in Mesa on April 27, 2021. His children were both by his side. He was born in Ray on Oct. 16, 1931, the middle son of John and Minnie Cartwright, who were also blessed with four daughters.

He is survived by his brother, Jack; son, Michael; daughter, Marcia; grandsons, Mike and Steven; great-grandsons, Nathan and Christian; and great-granddaughters, Meghan, Shannon and Karah.

Hank resided in Arizona his entire life, where he earned

his GED. He spent his younger, wilder years raising hell in Coolidge, Winslow, Ray and Superior. With his father and mother busy operating businesses, which ranged from restaurants to retail stores, much of the responsibility of raising Hank fell to his older sister, Catherine, with whom he always had a very special bond. The job of raising younger brother, Jack, however, fell largely to Hank. Jack and Hank developed a deep and lasting friendship with each other and with their sister Betty, who was often part of their adventures.

At the tender age of 18 while skating at an outdoor roller rink near the Galloping Goose in Coolidge he spied a young lady with whom he fell in love at first sight. Her name was Doris Harmon and she was from the neighboring town of Valley Farms. That was the beginning of a beautiful, life-long love affair that would last almost 70 years. They married in 1950 and had two children, Michael in 1951 and Marcia in 1954.

While in Coolidge and later in Winslow, Hank did all kinds of jobs. He worked at a bottling plant, helped his father with construction projects, assisted with farming and ranching, drove, loaded and unloaded delivery trucks and whatever other work he could find. Some say he developed his incredible physical strength by doing these jobs.

As just one example, he could single-handedly load a 500-pound bale of cotton onto the back of a flatbed truck and frequently did so during picking season.

Everyone worked hard and when the sun went down they played hard. When field hands came into town to

unwind after a long day at work, there was frequently trouble. Fistfights were a nightly occurrence and knives and guns were frequently brandished. These were rough times involving the toughest of men.

In 1954 he landed a job as a copper miner in Ray where he became a heavy equipment operator. Marcia was born there the same year he hired on with the Kennecott Copper.

For the next 38 years he worked his hands to the bone in that hot, dusty mine literally moving mountains to provide for his family and slowly worked his way up the ranks to become a Senior Mining Operations Foreman.

Hank never complained. He was the best role model a son or daughter could ask for. After retiring in 1992, he relocated to Apache Junction where he lived for the rest of his life.

Hank feared no man. He never went looking for trouble. However, when trouble found him, which was frequently the case in the rough and tumble towns in which he lived and worked, the situation was usually settled by a single blow or sometimes two from his mighty hands. No man dared to challenge him twice.

Some called him "The Baddest (expletive deleted) in the Valley." But most knew him simply as father, friend, coworker, relative or neighbor. Hank was a man who could tell a story and make you laugh until your sides hurt; a man who loved people; a fair man with a friendly smile, a man who did business with a handshake, a man who would give you the shirt off his back if you needed it; a real person and a real man in the truest sense of the word.

No formal services are planned. Hank let it be known that he did not want a bunch of people looking at him in his weakness or "blubbering, bawling or applauding over his grave." He and wife Doris will eventually be laid to rest at Mountain View Mausoleum in Mesa at which time the family envisions holding a celebration of their lives. Details to follow.

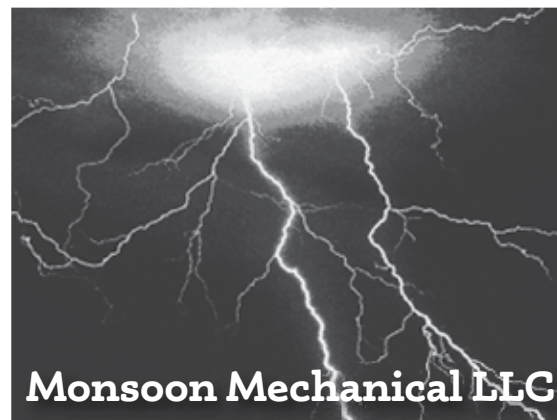

# Town of Superior Announces New Building Permit Process

This year, the town was forced to take over building permits in the town. Pinal County determined they would no longer be able to serve Superior, due to the cost of travel time. This has been a challenging learning experience, and we have encountered numerous difficulties. We are making some adjustments to make the process easier and cheaper, including lowering the inspection fees by 60% and exempting most small repairs from permitting. We will continue to minimize the necessary inconvenience of building code enforcement, and we are taking concerns raised by the public seriously.

There have been many rumors concerning this change. To address the most prevalent, this was not our choice. The county decided to drop the town, much to our chagrin. Given a choice, we would have never taken on this program.

The program requires several components. First, we had to update our building code, as ours was so out of date you can no longer certify inspectors. It also no longer complied with state law, as municipalities are not allowed to adopt a less restrictive code than the State Fire Marshal. We did not reinvent the wheel, and as Pinal County was in the process of updating their code, we copied their exemptions and code adoption. Updating the code takes several public hearings with planning and zoning and the town council, but it was customized and adopted after about six months of work.

Next, we worked on the forms. We obtained the formats from other municipalities, customized them, made them web-fillable, adopted them, and uploaded them to the website. We also adopted a guide to use filling them out.

We also had to adopt fees. Again, Pinal County was in the process of updating their fees, so we copied their ordinance. Pinal County will be finalizing their adoption of these rates soon, so we will be operating under the same fee structure as they are.

We were required by state law to sign an IGA with the

Arizona Department of Housing to give them regulatory authority over all manufactured homes. We also have had to modify our code to conform to the state rules. This took some time, as the state's laws on older models are very restrictive. Fires in manufactured homes built before 1976 are almost three times more likely to result in death, so whenever these are remodeled, they are required to be made more fire safe, and a state permit is required. The town has no leeway to adopt a less restrictive code. We have extended the permit exemptions to these homes, so minor repairs and cosmetic changes do not key this requirement.

Lastly, we have to have an inspector. We have no certified inspectors in-house, and it would take too long to get one certified to be ready on day one. We will continue to train in-house inspectors, but to be prepared by the deadline, we had to hire a contractor. We put out a request for qualifications, and two vendors applied, both out of Phoenix. Colibryn was selected. As neither vendor was local, the costs of inspections rose significantly over the county.

To solve this issue, we have set a scheduled once-a-week inspection. As long as the inspection is on that day, you will only be charged for the inspection itself, and the town will pay the road fees. This drops the cost from \$265 per inspection to \$110. Residents will still have the option to

call for a special inspection if they are on a tight schedule or do not want to wait a week; they will have to pay the road fees for that convenience. If the initial is failed, re-inspections will cost an additional inspection fee, so it is important to verify you are ready before you call for one.

We have also extended the exemptions for projects so that any project that costs less than \$1,500 will not require a permit. If the project requires an inspection but is otherwise exempt, such as for a power panel, they will only be charged for the \$110 inspection. Most routine repairs are exempted.

As we work through this new program, we will continue to make adjustments to make it as fair and reasonable as possible. We also need to ensure that the work is done safely and maintains the homeowner's property value by assuring that the work is code compliant and can be financed by a possible buyer. Unpermitted and non-code-compliant work can jeopardize FHA appraisals and limit financing options, as well as decreasing the appraised value.

A group of concerned citizens have circulated a petition requesting that Pinal County take back over the permitting for the town. The town is in agreement with this petition, and it agrees with the requests that we have made to county management. We would like to thank these citizens for their support.

## Superior Library open again

The Superior Public Library announced that it would reopen on May 3. There are a lot of rules governing the public's visits to the library, all to keep patrons and employees safe.

The new rules are:

- Open by appointment only.
- Hours: 12 – 5 pm Monday through Friday.
- Five people allowed in the library at one time.
- There is a 30-minute time limit that they can stay in the library.
- Only the upstairs will be open. Children will be allowed downstairs to browse and select a book and then come up and check it out upstairs. Children 10 and under must be accompanied by an adult. No playing or lingering downstairs.
- No meeting space will be available.

- Patrons will be required to wear a face mask and temperature will be taken upon entering the library by staff at the circulation desk. We urge anyone who is feeling ill to not come in the library.
- Only one computer will be available upstairs. The 30-minute time limit will remain and will not be extended. Staff will have to sanitize and disinfect the computer station after each use. Computer keyboard will be covered with a clear plastic cover to make it easier to clean and disinfect. A person can call the library and request a time slot. If the person does not show at the time requested it will be open for whomever wants to use it.
- Chromebooks will be available for check out to use in the library. There are four chairs where people can sit with their laptops, iPhones or iPads and use the WIFI. Time limit is 30 minutes. They are spaced 6 feet apart. After a person gets up from a chair, staff will have to sanitize chair.
- Newspapers and magazines will be removed to discourage people from lingering. These items are hard to sanitize.
- Copies will be made by staff and fax service will be available. Printing can be done from the computer or devices using Printer - On App and can be picked up at the circulation desk.
- We have installed sneeze guards at the circulation desk. Staff can scan cards and books or DVD barcodes through the plexiglass for lower contact. All returned items will be checked in and will be dropped in the book drop by person returning the item and then will be quarantined for 72 hours following CDC guidelines. After the quarantine period items are wiped with a sanitizing solution before returning to shelves for patron check out. Staff are required to wear gloves

## PERMIT EXEMPTIONS

This Information Bulletin describes the regulations covering construction work that is exempt from building, electrical, plumbing, and mechanical or combination permits in Town of Superior. For further information see the 2018 International Building Code® (IBC), “International Plumbing Code” (IPC), “International Mechanical Code” (IMC), 2011 “National Electrical Code” (NEC), “Town Code”, “Zoning Ordinance”, and Building Safety Department Policy.

*Exemption from the permit requirements shall not be deemed to grant authorization for any work to be done in any manner in violation of the provisions the building code.*

**\*\*NOTE: Construction work may not require a building permit, but it is not always exempt from Planning and from the Development or other public agency requirements.**

### WHEN IS A PERMIT REQUIRED?

In Town of Superior, if the proposed construction work is not listed as exempt in this Bulletin or the codes referenced above, it may require a permit. For clarification or additional grade information visit the Town of Superior engineering department located at 199 N Lobb Ave, Superior, AZ 85173 or call engineering department at (520) 689-5752.

### PERMIT EXEMPTIONS

A Permit will not be required for the following:

#### *Emergency repairs*

Where equipment replacements and repairs must be performed in an emergency situation, the permit application for the Inspections Services only shall be submitted within the next working business day to the building official.

#### *Small Residential Projects*

Project with a value in labor in materials under \$1500 are exempt from permitting in single family residential occupancies. (Market value labor and materials or actual receipts for cost of materials can be provided).

#### *Roofing Replacement*

Roof replacement or roof recover with the same type of material as the original roofing. Replacing or adding gutters or downspouts and replacing or adding soffit, gable, or roof ventilation are also exempt.

#### *Cosmetic Changes*

Painting, papering, tiling, carpeting, cabinets, counter tops and similar finish work are all exempt. More specifically:

1. Flooring of wood, vinyl, ceramic, stone, masonry or carpeting.
2. Installation or removal of non-structural interior wall partitions if no utilities are involved.
3. Adding or replacing insulation in walls, floors, or ceilings.
4. Painting, interior or exterior, and wallpapering.
5. Replacing cabinets or countertops.
6. Nonfixed and movable fixtures, cases, racks, counters and partitions not over 5 feet 9 inches (1753 mm) in height.

#### *Windows*

Replacing existing windows or doors with no structural changes in single family residential occupancies.

#### *Free-Standing Shade Structures and Accessory Buildings.*

Free-standing ramadas, gazebos, livestock, hay and similar structures, one single-story detached accessory structures used as tool and storage sheds, playhouses and similar uses, shall be exempt from building permits provided they are not greater than 200s.f. in area and set back requirements are not encroached. Shade cloth structures constructed for nursery or agricultural purposes, not including service systems. Swings and other playground equipment accessory to detached one- and two-family dwellings.

#### *Fencing and Small Retaining Walls*

Fences not over 6 feet (1829 mm) high. Retaining walls that are not over 4 feet 40 inches (1219 1016 mm) in height measured from the bottom top of the footing to the top of the wall, unless supporting a surcharge or impounding Class I, II or IIIA liquids. Wall heights shall not exceed 10 feet above finished grade maximum wall height of then feet above finished grade.

#### *Replacement of HVAC Equipment (“Like for Like”)*

The repair or replacing of electrical HVAC equipment such as a furnace, condenser unit, and evaporative cooler with the same type and rating in the same location.

1. Steam, hot or chilled water piping

within any heating or cooling equipment regulated by this code.

2. Replacement of any part that does not alter its approval or make it unsafe.
3. Portable evaporative cooler.
4. Self-contained refrigeration system containing 10 pounds (4.54 kg) or less of refrigerant and actuated by motors of 1 horsepower (0.75 kW) or less.
5. Portable heating appliance.
6. Portable ventilation equipment.
7. Portable cooling unit.

#### *Paving and Platforms*

Platforms, walks and driveways not more than 30 inches above and not over a basement or story below are exempt. This includes concrete walkways, not in a Town right-of-way, and patio slabs.

#### *Patio covers Decks and Awnings*

1. Patio and porch cover structures, built as additions to one- and two-family dwellings and subject to all of the following conditions are exempt:
  - a) Up to 120 square feet and extend a maximum of 8 feet from the dwelling.
  - b) The attachment to the dwelling is supported on bearing wall of the existing structure and not fascia.
  - c) Required yard setbacks are not encroached upon.
  - d) Use a minimum of 2” X 6” rafter material and a minimum of 4”x6” Beams.
  - e) Structure must be securely fastened.
2. Decks not over 30” above finished grade, less than 200 sq. ft., and with no structure on the deck.
3. Attached engineered Aluminum Awnings that do not exceed 1000 sq.ft. roof area.
4. Window awnings supported by an exterior wall which do not project more than 54-inches.
5. Retractable Awnings shall be exempt from building permits if the awning area does not exceed 120 sq.ft. and does not extend more than 8 feet from the structure.

#### *Plumbing*

1. The stopping of leaks in drains, water, soil, waste or vent pipe. If any concealed trap, drainpipe, water, soil, waste or vent pipe becomes defective and it becomes necessary to remove and replace the same with new material, such work shall be considered as new work and a permit shall be obtained and inspection made

as provided in this code in all occupancy types except single family residential. In single family residential occupancies, the replacement of “like for like” plumbing shall be exempt.

2. The clearing of stoppages or the repairing of leaks in pipes, valves or fixtures and the removal and reinstallation of water closets, provided such repairs do not involve or require the replacement or rearrangement of valves, pipes, or fixtures.
3. Replacing like for like or repairing existing plumbing fixtures such as toilet, tub, sink, garbage disposal, water heater, or faucets.
4. General landscaping including lawn sprinkler systems, subject to water conservation requirements.

#### *Electrical*

1. Satellite dishes and residential antennas for wireless communications.
2. Reinstallation of branch circuit overcurrent devices of the required capacity in the same location.
3. Electrical wiring, devices, appliances, apparatus or equipment operating at less than 25 volts and not capable of supplying more than 50 watts of energy.
4. Replacing existing appliances or internal light fixtures.
5. Installation of low-voltage wiring for security alarm systems.
6. Minor repair work, including the replacement of lamps or the connection of approved portable electrical equipment to approved permanently installed receptacles.

#### *Small Above Ground Pools*

Prefabricated swimming pools accessory to a Group R-3 occupancy that are less than 18 inches (457 mm) deep, are not greater than 5,000 gallons (18,925 L) and are installed entirely above ground.

#### *Water Tanks*

Water tanks are exempt when not exceeding 5000 gallons in capacity, supported directly on grade, and the ratio of height to diameter or width is equal to or less than 2 to 1.

#### *Inspection Only*

If it is determined an inspection required for an otherwise exempted project, the applicant shall only be charged for any necessary inspections and plan reviews.

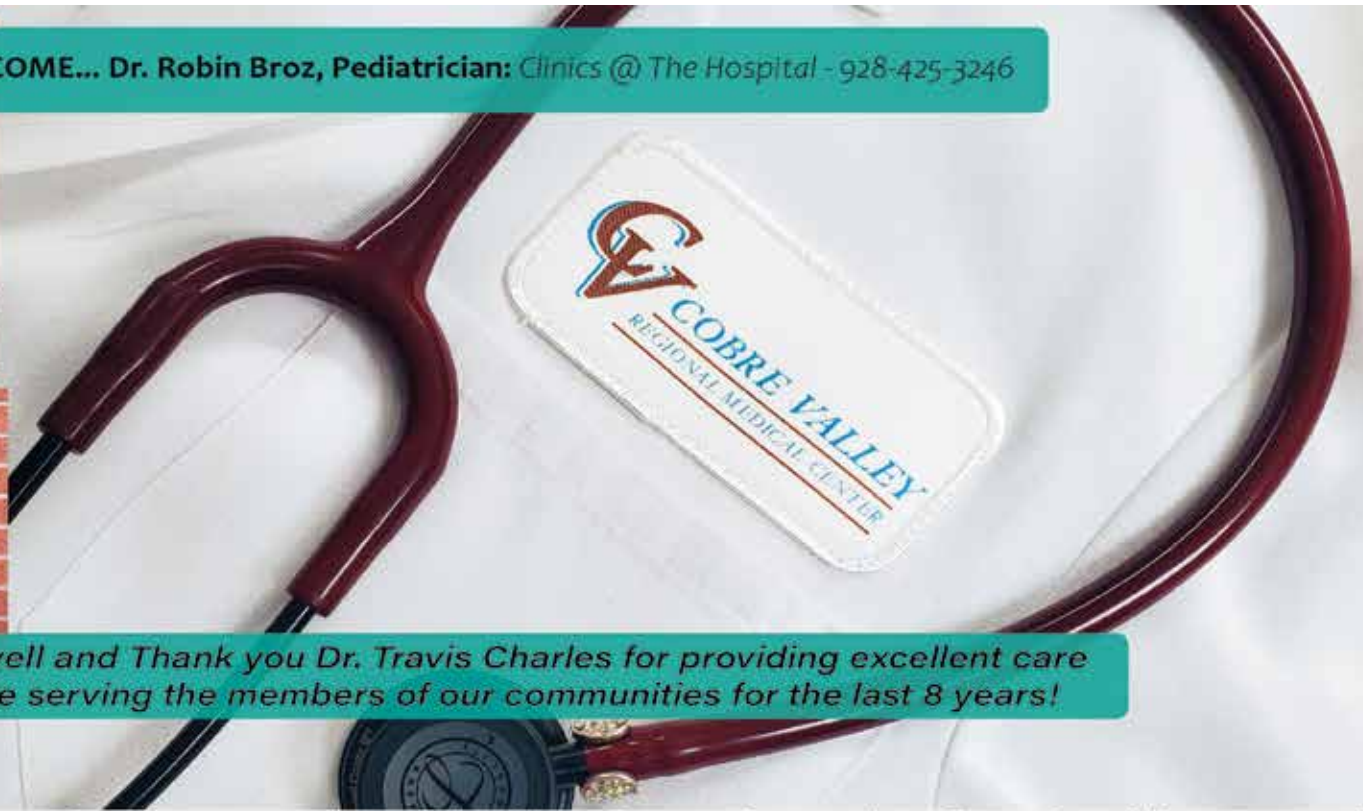
