





Telegraph Fire proves relentless

The Telegraph Fire that started in the early afternoon of Friday, June 4, 2021, south of Superior in the Tonto National Forest has consumed 104,755 acres and at press time was 68 percent contained. There are more than 1,000 people fighting this fire. The fire lost some containment after the fire expanded aggressively

Sunday night.

The fire has kept residents throughout the Copper Corridor on their toes as Set and Go evacuations orders were issued for Superior, Top of the World, Miami, Globe and on Monday, the areas of El Capitan and Dripping Springs were ordered to GO. Highway 60 between Superior and Miami reopened on Friday evening and Highway 177 reopened on Thursday morning. Highway 77 re-opened briefly, but was closed again on Sunday due to the expansion of the Telegraph fire.

At press time Superior, Miami and Globe have returned to Ready. Top of the World, and many of the canyons near the Pinal Mountains remain on Set.

As the fire traveled east through the Tonto National Forest it burned through the Pinal Mountains; and as the vegetation turned from Sonoran Desert to tall pines and manzanita the fire grew. Lack of humidity and high temperatures have not been in the favor of the crews fighting the fire. Speaker of the House, Rusty Bowers lost his cabin South of Pinto Valley and Rep. David Cook lost his vacation cabin in the Pinal Mountains. Over 20 structures have been lost, but there have been no significant injuries or deaths.

The fire and its footprint have been visited by Governor Doug Ducey, which followed a press conference where the Governor promised to call a special session of the legislature to address and

provide funding for the communities affected by the Telegraph and Mescal fires. His speech focused on the needs of Gila County. Pinal County officials have said that the special session will also include support for the areas of Pinal County affected by the fire. Additional media reports have indicated the Governor is going to ask for \$100 million dollars for relief and recovery efforts. Mayor Mila Besich has declared an emergency to cover any recovery efforts the town may need to cover.

Senator Mark Kelly also visited the area and received in person briefings from the Incident Commands of the Telegraph and Mescal Fires. He also met with elected officials of Superior, Miami, Globe and San Carlos.

The Telegraph Fire has become one of the top 10 largest fires in Arizona's history. Copper Area News provides a variety of updates regarding the fire on our Facebook pages; residents can also follow the Telegraph Fire Incident Command Facebook page and website for additional information.
