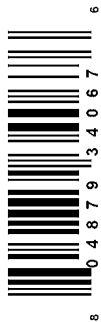

# Local First Arizona Partners with Pipeline AZ to revitalize the rural job market in Pinal County

Local First AZ and Pipeline AZ are pooling their resources to optimize how rural job seekers and businesses in Pinal County connect in an ever-evolving, competitive, and fast-paced job market. The rural employment portal found at [localfirstaz.pipelineaz.com](http://localfirstaz.pipelineaz.com) provides one centralized platform for rural career exploration, posting available jobs, and one-on-one career consultation with intent to keep rural talent working in or near their hometowns.

Over the next 10 years, the Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG) estimates that Pinal County will see between 1,800 and 3,400 new jobs each year as well as a 50% population growth. These numbers mean that an

estimated 4,850 of Pinal County residents may find new employment in their local region instead of relocating to Maricopa County.

LocalFirstAz.PipelineAz.com is working to connect these workers to jobs that match their skills and interests.

"Pipeline AZ is a rural workforce initiative in Pinal County that Local First Arizona is launching to showcase education and career opportunities that exist locally," said Lexie Krechel, rural community development manager at Local First Arizona. "Being from a rural community, I know firsthand that often it doesn't seem possible to get the required training and find a career that you qualify for or are interested in locally. Our goal is to break that cycle. We want those seeking employment in Pinal County to know that local opportunities do exist. Through a quick skills assessment on Pipeline AZ that links candidates directly to local training and career pathways, we are able to show job seekers the track to attain their career goals in their hometown."

Registration is easy for job seekers and employers. For those seeking jobs, the four step process includes creating their candidate profile, taking a skills assessment, and being matched to jobs in Pinal County where their skills can be applied. 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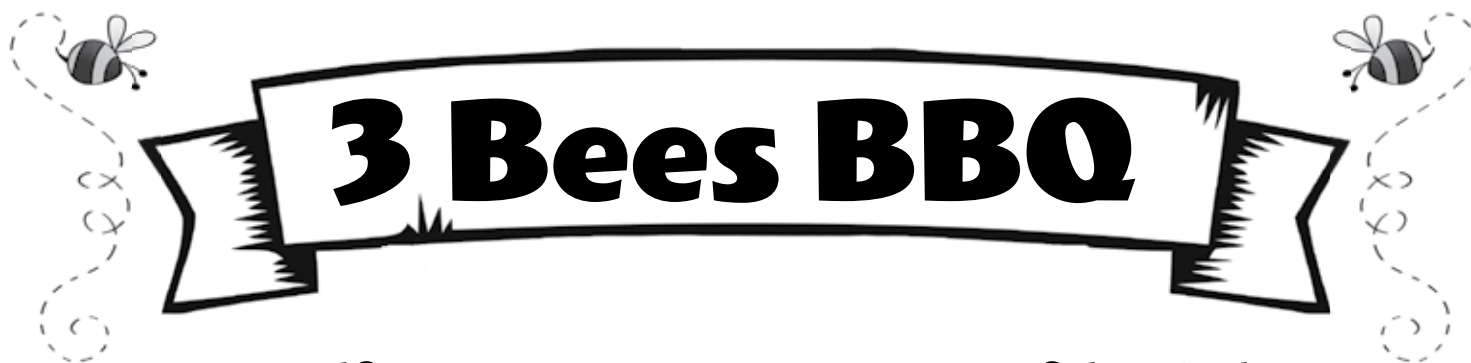
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## Pollinator Gardening is for the Birds ...

... AND for the bees, butterflies, beetles, bats, moths and more. In short, a pollinator garden is a sanctuary for animals that pollinate. Where would we be without them? Hungry, most likely, as around 1 of 3 bites of food we eat are provided by them. And an estimated 90% of the earth's flowering plants need these animal pollinators to reproduce.

At the Oracle Community Learning Garden we've planted our own pollinator garden. Not Oracle's first – the Oracle Community Center has a lovely butterfly garden – but hopefully one of many small pollinator gardens and patches that will be popping up in our area soon. The more the better, as pollinator populations, both native and non-native animals, are declining for a number of reasons. We can help by providing safe, diverse habitat for them.

We started preparing the soil and planting our first pollinator plants in September, 2019, and we are hoping to expand a bit in the months ahead. Working with Carianne Campbell of Strategic Habitat Enhancements in Tucson, we decided to go all native (or near-native) with our plant selections.



Right now our pollinator garden has 20 species of native plants and this year we'll add another 20 or more species. On Campbell's advice, we have been able to stagger the timing of the flowering of plants so that we have plants blooming almost throughout the year, as well as

# Local teen plans benefit concert to help grandfather

He sat down at the piano bench. His back was straight, his right foot on the pedal and his hands resting on the keys, his eyes fixed on the handwritten music in front of him.

Then the teenager began to play the music he had written last November when his family was facing COVID-19 and had found out his grandfather, Daniel Tineo of San Manuel, had a tumor on his pituitary gland – brain cancer.

The notes he wrote were inspired by The Sound of Silence (by Paul Simon). The melody was quiet, thoughtful and written from the heart and soul. It had a depth to it that most would not expect to find from a 14-year-old boy.

Isaac Tineo has studied piano with teacher Elaine Helzer of Oracle for seven years – half of his life – and told her he wanted to do something to help his tata. She suggested a concert as a fundraiser asking for donations, rather than selling tickets. Fellow student Annalupe Rodriquez, 17, who has studied with

Helzer for 11 years said she would perform as well.

Dr. Stephen Cook, the founder and artistic director of the Oracle Piano Society and a concert pianist and piano teacher who has a Doctor of Music Arts degree from Arizona State University, recently had the opportunity to meet Isaac and to listen to the music he had written. Cook said he was “very impressed by the Isaac’s talent, drive and motivation” as well as his “potential and promise.” He added that Isaac plays very expressively and is the type of candidate that the Oracle Piano Society wants to help through its programs to encourage talent and will be sponsoring advanced lessons for him.

Isaac said he had to be “forced” at first to take lessons, but after about two years he began to really like what he was doing.

“Playing gave me a challenge and then everything just took off,” he grinned.

After four or five years of lessons, he began playing the offertories at Living Word Chapel and now plays every Sunday for the service.

With a sparkle in his brown eyes, he said classical music is his favorite type of music

to play, especially Beethoven, and that he plays nearly every day. But that he also enjoys building things with Legos and taking care of the family chickens.

When asked why he chose music, he replied, “I didn’t just want to do sports.” Eventually he would like to perform regularly and then maybe teach.

Helzer said she expects to see great things from him.

“I’m very proud of him and what he has accomplished and look forward to even bigger things from him. As he grows and understands more about life, the emotions will come out in his playing,” she said.

“He is a pleasure to work with. He is quiet, respectful; he listens and he is great to work with and he is great with his younger siblings,” she added.

A GoFundMe account has been established for Daniel, who needs the surgery as soon as possible. A goal of \$55,000 has been set to cover the surgery, hospital and recovery costs.

This proposed increase is exclusive of increased primary property taxes received from new construction. The increase is also exclusive of any changes that may occur from property tax levies for voter approved bonded indebtedness or budget and tax overrides.

The lockdown continued for nearly two months. When Gov. Ducey finally gave the go ahead to reopen, businesses slowly began the road to recovery. Even those listed as "essential" had a challenge with this economic recovery.

Many small businesses and non-profits in Arizona didn't survive the lockdown. The businesses that did survive are hanging on as best they can. *Copper Area News* wanted to give something back to the local business community. The restaurant offers Mexican food and does party catering in house. They also offer some of the best breakfast burritos around (at least according to the *Miner* staff).

They are located at 501 S. McNab Pkwy., San Manuel, and are open Wednesday through Saturday, 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and additionally, 4-7:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday.

The Romos will be taking a little bit of a summer break.

"We will be closed starting this Sunday, June 20. We will be open again on Wednesday, July 21. Thank you as always."

# Trophy cases dedicated to Allen Ingram, SMHS Class of '67

A dedication ceremony for two new trophy cases was held at the San Manuel High School gymnasium on Saturday, June 19, 2021. One of the cases was dedicated to Allen Ingram who was killed in the Vietnam War in 1968. He was a member of the San Manuel High School Class of 1967. The other case was dedicated to the SMHS Class of 1967. Family members and friends of Allen Ingram were in attendance as well as SMHS Governing Board members and staff.

The ceremony started with speeches from Superintendent, Julie Dale Scott and Bob Acton, who donated the trophy cases and was a good friend of Allen Ingram. Other speakers included friends of Allen: Chuck Tiller, Lou Beneitone and John Roybal. Ms. Scott spoke about how the trophy case honors Allen as a hero but also as a San Manuel Miner.

"It allows his memory to live on," she said.

She thanked Bob and the trophy committee "for helping us get through the trophy incident."

Family members put together a display of Allen's which included photos, his military medals including his Purple Heart and his San Manuel High School Letterman's sweater.

# Sea Lions open season against tough competition

The 2021 swim season opened for the Sea Lions against the 2019 League Champion Aquabears in Tucson on June 12. The Tucson Aquabears won with 1655 points, the Sea Lions finished 2nd with 495 points and the Maricopa Seals finished 3rd with 46 points. The Sea Lions looked sharp at the meet and won 22 events, but did not have the number of swimmers to keep up with the Aquabears.

Jocelyn Hudson was named Beast of the week for June 12 Meet as a result of her great week of practice, best times in every race, and winning every one of her 6 events.

On June 19, the Sea Lions travelled to the new Aquatic Center in Coolidge. It is an 8 lane competition pool that will host the League Championship in July. It was an honor for the Sea Lions to be chosen for the first swim meet in the pool. Coolidge won the meet with 909 points, the Sea Lions finished in 2nd with 544 points, and the Globe Piranhas finished 3rd with 97 points.

The Sea Lions won 40 of the 88 events at the meet, but did not have enough swimmers to win against a very large team like Coolidge this early in the season with limited practice.

The Sea Lions looked very sharp in the Individual Medley (IM) events, the all-around events in swimming where swimmers compete in all four competitive strokes (Butterfly, Backstroke, Breaststroke, Freestyle) in one race. The following swimmers won the IM in their age groups: Gabriel Hudson (6), Anabelle Sloan (8), Jocelyn Hudson (11), Juliana Ramirez (13), Cooper Dale (13), Mia Dale (16), and Evan Apuron (18).

Mia Dale and Evan Apuron won all 8 of their races at the meet.

The following swimmers competed for the first time as a Sea Lion in the past two weeks:

Teddy Olson (5), Bea Olson (7), Ben Simons (9), Lucy Olson (10), Remy Simons (11), Isaac Olson (12), Jordan Simons (13), Will Simons (15). They all swam well and earned ribbons.

Evan Apuron (18) broke 2 team records at the meet. In the 100 Backstroke he swam a time of 1:00.50 bettering the previous record of 1:00.69. In the 50 Freestyle he swam a time of 21.97 which improved on the previous record of 22.13. Evan previously held both records.

The Sea Lions will host a meet against the Florence Sharks at the Mammoth Pool on Saturday, June 26.

providing a diversity of flower colors. We know what each plant contributes to our pollinators.

For instance, milkweed

plants contribute nectar to dozens of insect species, and are hosts to monarch butterflies. We have 4 species of native milkweeds planted in the garden, and have become one of many Monarch Waystations

throughout North America to help support monarch butterflies on their migration. In the Desert Southwest, 104 species of native bees have been found on milkweed flowers, bees that are critical to the success of many of our crops.

The pollinators that show up for the plants in our pollinator are some of the same that will pollinate the food crops that our gardeners are growing, as well as those of our neighboring gardeners. We hope that our efforts will help our native pollinators to once again thrive. Yes, we're a small step in that direction but as more of us take these small steps to help, the more we'll see pollinator populations recover.

Come visit the OCLG and take a walk on our soon-

to-be-completed Pollinator Pathway. You can learn all about the pollinators of the garden's plants as well other garden features that we've been working on for the past couple of years! Take a little rest on our beautiful wooden bench in the pollinator garden that was built by San Manuel High School students through their INTERACT program sponsored by the SaddleBrooke Rotary Club.

June 21-27 is NATIONAL POLLINATOR WEEK! Why not add to the growing group of people worldwide who are doing their part to keep our native pollinators thriving.

just a pot or 2 with a mix of species. Planting a number of species helps attract a wide range of pollinators. Use the contact info below to let us know if you need help with selecting plants.

Make a watering station for pollinators. Water is often scarce in our summer heat and drought. Add a shallow bowl or dish to your yard filled with rocks, marbles or pebbles and a shallow layer of fresh water. The rocks will give your pollinators somewhere to land without drowning. Keep the water station out of direct sunlight and monitor the water level to make sure that it's full.

Provide natural habitat for native bees. A majority of our native bees live in the ground. Leave some leaf litter and organic material in your garden bed that they can use to make nests or use for shelter. Leave some areas of soil uncovered so bees can create or access their tunnels.

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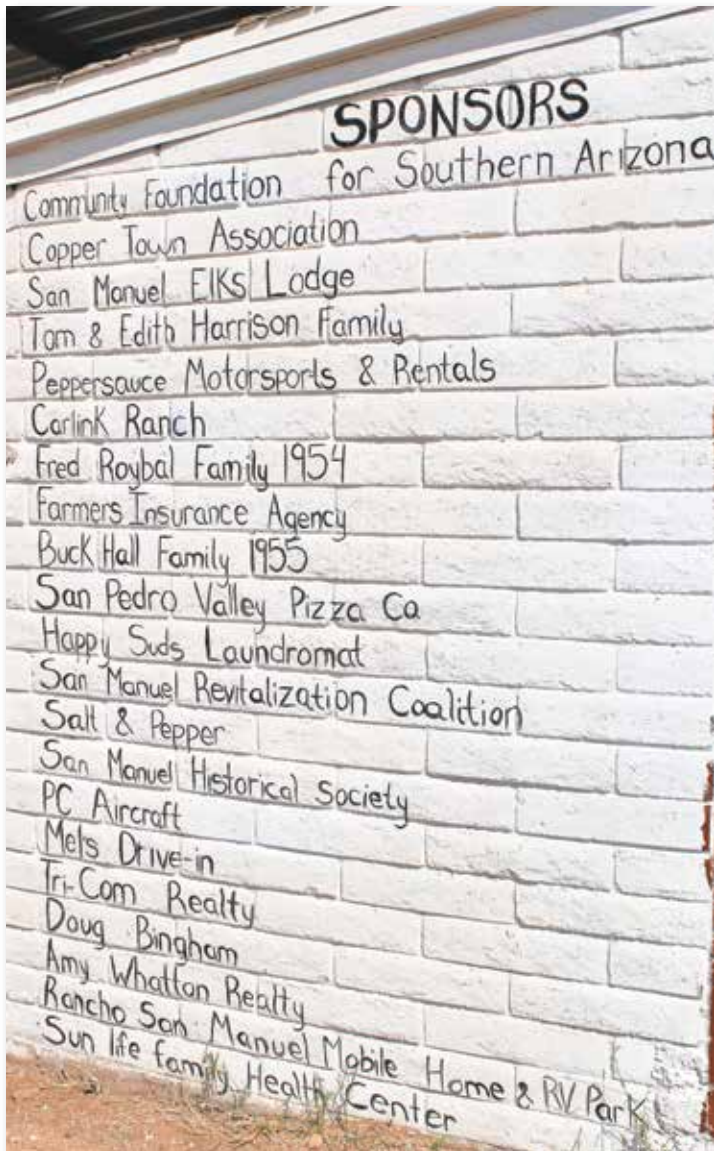
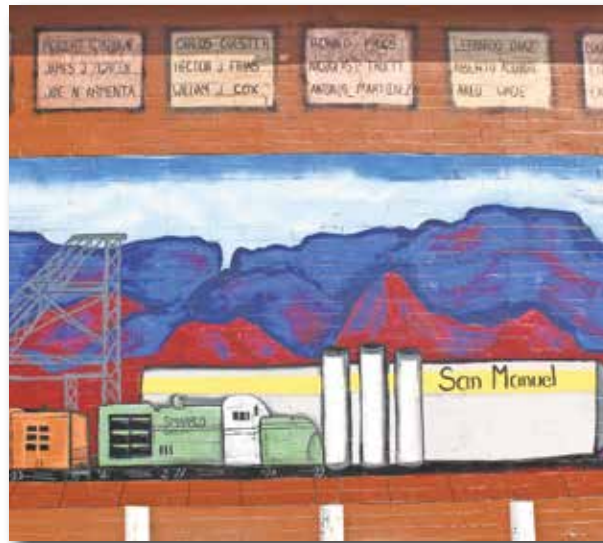
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# The Mural is Complete!

This will allow the staff to clean the computer station before the next patron uses it. There will also be plenty of hand sanitizer available for use while in the library. Patrons will be allowed to search for their favorite book, DVD, etc and use the wi-fi.

Library fines have been waived during the

closure and curbside service. This will change on July 7. Fines will be imposed beginning on July 7.

Many of the Library's patrons have inquired about donating books, DVDs, etc. to the Library. While the Oracle Public library does appreciate donations which support the library via the Book Sales, storage space is limited. The Oracle Library will no longer take textbooks, encyclopedias or other large sets.

Because the Oracle Public Library is a volunteer-run library, there is always a need for volunteers. Applications are available at the Library.

The volunteers of the Oracle Public Library appreciate the patience of our patrons this year. Many have used the curbside service and the wi-fi while the library has been closed. We look forward to seeing you in the library.
