





The voters of the Town of Kearny in 2018 adopted an alternative expenditure limitation - home rule option. The purpose of this election is for the continued use of the alternative expenditure limitation. At the general election to be held on 8 November 2022 the voters of the Town of Kearny will vote on the question of an alternative expenditure limitation - home rule option.

rule option. With voter approval, the town shall be limited to the expenditure of estimated available revenues whether such expenditures are less than or exceed the State imposed limit. As an example, in 2022-2023, the state-imposed limitation plus applicable constitutional exclusions will allow expenditures of \$8,304,346. Under the proposed alternative expenditures of \$9,066,631.

If the voters approve, the additional expenditure authority will be used for all local budgetary purposes including general government, public safety, public works, utilites, cultural and recreation, and capital improvements. Revenues received from federal, state and local sources will be used to fund such expenditures. (The city/town property tax shall be limited to the amount prescribed in the Arizona State Constitution.)

n April 2020, COVID-19 brought much of Arizona's economy to a screeching halt. All businesses not deemed "essential" were ordered closed by Arizona's governor Doug Ducey. The lockdown continued for nearly two months. When Gov. Ducey finally gave the go ahead to reopen, businesses slowly began the road to recovery. Even those listed as "essential" had a challenge with this economic recovery.

Many small businesses and non-profits in Arizona didn't survive the lockdown. The businesses that did survive are hanging on as best they can. Copper Area News wanted to give something back to the local business community as a thank you for supporting us through these troubled times. Our newspapers (Copper Basin News, Superior Sun and San Manuel Miner) have been featuring local businesses and non-profits since the beginning of

2021, encouraging our readers to Shop at Home, stay local and support our local businesses. To date, *Copper Area News* has featured 140 businesses and groups in the Copper Corridor.

Here's a twist on supporting your local businesses and organizations: Saint Vincent de Paul (SVdP), asked for information for an article on how their community can support them, wrote a letter to the Copper Basin News which, right near the end, stated, "We would like to assist you if you are going through a difficult time. Please call 520-356-6046. Leave a clear message with your name and phone number where we can contact you." This is followed by a quote from Saint Mother Teresa: "It's not how much we give but how much love we put into giving."

Who and what is Saint Vincent de Paul? The Saint Vincent de Paul society is a worldwide Catholic organization that brings Christ's love and caring to those in need in our community.

St. Vincent de Paul, the man, was a priest during the 17th century. He had great compassion for the poor in rural France. He visited families and gave them food and clothing. The society was founded in 1833, 150 years after Saint Vincent's death.

That's what they say in their letter, and they wrote it so well, we feel helped already. So helped, this whole article is pretty much just going to be from their letter, plus a little extra.

Their letter begins "Good deeds are prayers in action." So, at the beginning of the letter, prayer, and at the end, an offer of action. What form does the offered help take, though?

In their letter SVdP states, "We usually help with basic necessities of food, rent or utilities. We occasionally help with other bills, if a majority of the society members agree to the situation."

If SVdP is going to be supporting others, how do you support this organization? Calling the phone number and volunteering might work. Giving a donation is bound to work at least as well, if not a whole lot better. Or, taking a page from their book in seeing what you can help with so that they don't have to.

Even if you need help yourself, sometimes you can trade chores or fulfillment of needs with others in the area, give of your time, cut back on some small pleasure to better utilize resources. Or assess your needs against another's and decide who needs help most. Remember, there is more joy in giving than in receiving.

How is SVdP, all the way from France, considered local? Local happened in 2007 when 27 people began a local conference. The letter states, "Over the years, we have lost many members and yet we still continue to serve. Thankfully, we have been blessed with many generous donations from families and organizations and we have had many successful fundraisers."

The SVdP members make home visits, traveling in groups of two, to pray with and listen to those in need. The visits are kept confidential and each case is considered on its own merit.

"There are rules our organization must follow. We have regular meetings and we have a yearly report where we account for the money, time and resources spent in helping others."

Consider helping Saint Vincent de Paul help others, and possibly yourself, in your local community. Keeping it local and friendly makes for a better community for everyone.

# Hayden-Winkelman students take once-in-a-lifetime trip to Boston

A chance to visit historical sites and experience a slice of America's past sent several Hayden-Winkelman students and their chaperones "wicked far away" to Boston, Massachusetts.
