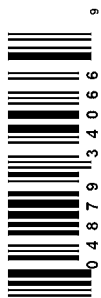
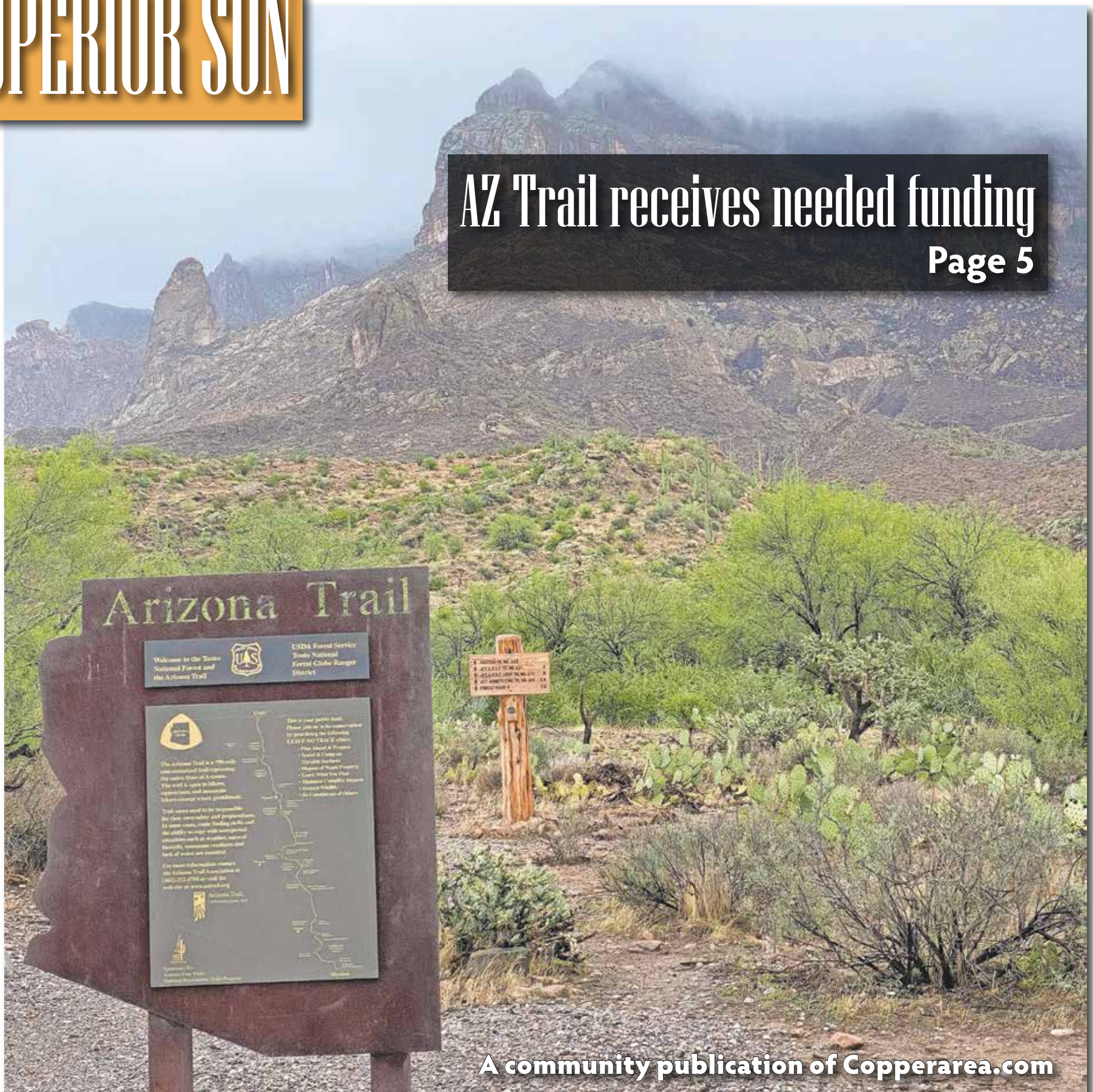

OBITUARY

Criss E. Romero



Criss E. Romero, 92, of Superior, AZ, passed away peacefully in his own home on July 5, 2023, the day of his beloved wife, Mary's, birthday. Criss was born on Dec. 17, 1930, in Pecos, New Mexico to parents Melisandro, better known as Jose, and Matiana (Ortiz) Romero. In 1939, Jose found a job in Superior and the family relocated to the area.

Criss attended Superior Public Schools and joined the U.S. Army in 1946. After serving in the military, Criss returned to New Mexico to find work. It was there in Santa Fe where he met his future wife, Mary Fernandez. He and Mary were married in 1951 and Mary blessed him with 2 beautiful sons together they built a good home to raise their family. Criss made his living working for Magma Copper Company for 31 years followed by working for the Pinal County Sheriff's Department and Homeland Security, where he worked for 10 years.

Criss was very proud of his family's military service. Like Criss, his father and brothers also served their country with honor and courage, and they all volunteered. Beginning with World War I and up to the Vietnam War, the Romero's were involved in every major conflict of the United States.

Criss was a devout Catholic. He held religion high. He was an altar boy in Pecos as well as Superior. He attended Mass weekly until the pandemic. He watched the Catholic Mass daily on TV up until his passing. He was active in the St. Francis Parish, helped Father during Mass well into his later years. He was also a member of the Knights of Columbus.

Criss was an avid rock collector with museum quality pieces on display. He enjoyed looking at his rock

collection every day. He also enjoyed automobiles, especially classic cars. His dream car was the GTO Judge which was basically a race car. He settled for the regular GTO which he purchased in 1969. He was proudly featured with a photo of him and his GTO in the Arizona Republic in the 1990s. Criss was a lifelong poker player and loved playing with his family.

Criss is preceded in death by his parents, Jose and Matiana; sisters, Vangie, Maria, Antonia, Herlinda and Teresa; brothers, Jose, Pitacio, Silviano and Melisandro; and by his beloved wife, Mary, who passed away in 2021.

Criss is survived by his sons, David (Alfreda Tsosie) and Criss Jr. (John Melichar); sister, Eulalia Maldonado; his sister-in-law, Juanita Valdez; and his one and only granddaughter, Avenicia Romero. He also leaves behind numerous nephews, nieces, cousins, and all those who were blessed to know and love him.

Services for Criss will be held on Saturday, July 22, 2023, at St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church in Superior, AZ. Visitation is set to begin at 8:30 a.m. followed by Rosary at 9 a.m. and Mass at 9:30 a.m. He will be laid to rest at Fairview Cemetery.

Town Council votes on CDBG projects

The Superior Town Council met for its July meeting. One of the main agenda topics for discussion was how the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding would be used. The Town receives this funding every three years. This year's allocation is \$225,123.00. The funding is administered by the Central Arizona Governments (CAG) and the Arizona Department of Housing.

This federal funding has some limitations on the use which often times restricts the use of the funding. At the June meeting, the council discussed a variety of projects

Stuck crane closes on ramp



A driver of an 18-wheeler, low boy trailer, hauling a large scale industrial crane found itself high-centered Monday. The driver, trying to navigate the left turn from State Highway 177 onto US 60, was stuck for several hours as another crane was called into help get the rig unstuck and moved. These types of incidents happen several times a year, as that turn requires a certain level of skill. Drivers who cannot make that turn based on the size of their load often detour through Main Street. Superior Police and Arizona Department of Public Safety were on scene and handled rerouting traffic while the on ramp was closed.

including repairs and renovations to the Magma Club, limited street repairs, fire hydrants for the airport and the installation of a Ninja Warrior playground at the swimming pool park.

CAG staff informed the Council that using the CDBG funding for the Magma Club may not be an eligible use because previous councils in Superior had used the funding for repairs at the Magma Club and they were not all completed as per the grant specifications. CAG did suggest that some of the new repairs to add a kitchen and bathroom could maybe be funded. One of the issues with using the funds for the improvements to the Magma Club is that significant repairs to the foundation is needed, which the grant will not cover. The Town will need to fund those repairs using other funding or general fund monies.

After discussion amongst the council and the public, the council voted to request the funding to go to the Magma Club and if the funding is not able to be used, direct the funding to do street repair to Stansberry and Lime streets. If the funding is used for the street repairs, it will only be a segment of the street because the funding can only be used to fully grind the street down and repave and the grant

funding is not sufficient enough to do a full street. These are the last roads listed on the Town's immediate road repair list. It was mentioned that Porphyry Ave. is still on the list for repairs, but the cost is well over \$1 million, which prevents the town from doing a full repair.

Another notable approval for the council was approval of appropriated funding from the State of Arizona, in the amount of \$2.4 million to construct a low water crossing over Queen Creek at the Panther Drive crossing. The Town has been submitting requests for funding for several years which were mostly denied. Mayor Mila Besich thanked Sen. Wendy Rodgers for finding a way to ensure this project was included in the funding packages in the 2023-24 state budget.

The Council also approved the annual tax levy and also recognized the outgoing Town of Superior Youth Council and introduced the incoming Youth Council leadership. New Youth Council members are: Leia Jimenez (President), David Drennan (Vice President), Katelynn Commissaris (Secretary), Liliana Fritz (Treasurer) and John Tomerlin (Member - Representative to Community Development Committee).

Arizona Trail Association receives support from Governor and Legislature

The 2023 Arizona budget includes a historic \$500,000 investment in the Arizona National Scenic Trail. The bipartisan budget shows the dedication of elected officials to support outdoor recreation and conservation efforts.

CASA donates bench to Town of Superior

Recently the Town of Superior accepted a new bench for downtown donated by CASA. The benches are part of a countywide effort to educate and attract volunteers to the CASA program. The new bench is located right outside the Senior Center on Main Street.

It is expected that the information on the bench will change from time to time, to help share information on the important program. CASA volunteers are needed in Superior and throughout Pinal County.

CASA stands for Court Appointed Special Advocate. CASA volunteers are everyday citizens appointed by a judge to speak up for abused and neglected children in court. CASA volunteers serve as fact-finders for the judge by researching the background and circumstances of a child's case. To access the information needed for the volunteer to advocate effectively, he or she must build a relationship with the child and speak with a variety of people involved in the child's life.

The CASA volunteer will then make a recommendation to the court, which represents the best interests of the child. Volunteers are closely screened and highly trained. They are also given background checks and interviewed to ensure the highest level of professionalism. On average, a child who has been appointed a CASA volunteer spends less time in foster care and has a greater chance at finding a safe and permanent home. In the community of Superior alone, 18 children have been removed from their homes in the last 24 months.

In Pinal County, there are an average of 900-1,000 children in foster care. CASA of Pinal County has approximately 80 volunteers but more is needed. Find out how you can become an advocate. No special background is required. All training is free and trained staff mentor volunteers along the way.
