

# Sen. Kelly touts funding for public safety in Pinal County with law enforcement, local officials

Last week, Arizona Senator Mark Kelly visited the Pinal County Emergency Operations Center which will receive \$187,000 from this year's government funding bill. The Kelly-secured funding will support technology upgrades at the Emergency Operations Center, which will enhance operational coordination, communication, and public safety efforts throughout the county.

During his visit, Kelly toured the facility and met with the county's emergency management team and local officials to discuss how the funding will support public safety and law enforcement. Kelly was joined by the Chairman of the Pinal County Board of Supervisors Jeffrey McClure, Pinal County Emergency Manager Chuck Kmet, Pinal County Attorney Kent Volkmer, and Town of Superior Chief of Police Frank Alanis.

Kelly, a former EMT and the son of two police officers, has continued to work in the Senate to deliver the federal funding and resources first responders and law enforcement need to keep Arizonans safe. Earlier this year, Kelly helped secure over \$4.4 million in this year's government funding bill for police departments and public safety efforts in cities and towns across Arizona.

### Pinal Board of Supervisors approve election for transportation tax

The Pinal County Board of Supervisors voted last week to approve calling an election to allow the voters of Pinal County to approve a 1/2 cent sales tax to fund transportation improvements across the county.

Voters will see this new ballot measure on the Nov. 8, 2022, ballot. If approved, all purchases in Pinal County will have an additional half cent sales tax added to each purchase. The funds collected from the PRTA tax have been held in escrow by the Arizona Department of Revenue due to legal challenges posed by the Goldwater Institute.

This past spring, elected officials from throughout Pinal County were dismayed Continued on page 6

(PRTA). While the Supreme Court, agreed that the PRTA transportation plan was valid and that the voters approved the plan, the taxing method was not legal. When voters approved the 1/2 cent sales tax in November of 2017, there was a two-tier taxing method, any purchase over \$10,000 would not require payment of the tax. The Supreme Court ruled that the PRTA and the county could not develop a tiered tax system without approval from the State Legislature.

The original tax approved by voters in 2017 planned for the communities of Superior, Mammoth, Kearny and Eloy to each receive upwards of \$300,000 a year to fund road maintenance projects in their communities. The Pinal Regional Transportation Authority (PRTA), formed to manage the funds collected, was the local authority tasked with ensuring the projects move forward. The board was composed of Mayors or elected officials from Pinal County and the local municipalities.
