## Community Working Group changes location, sets next meeting for Aug. 17

The next Community Working Group (CWG) meeting for the Resolution Copper mining project, located in Superior, Arizona, will be Wednesday, Aug. 17, 2022. On the agenda will be a report on a Queen Creek Working Group study in Superior and an update on the Good Neighbor Agreement.

Monthly meetings of the group have been moved from the Superior Chamber to the Town of Superior Offices, Library Room at 199 N. Lobb Avenue, Superior. Note: if you have trouble finding the room, please text Jody Lomenzo at 804-852-5388.

The group will hear a report from GSA, a consulting firm working with the Queen Creek Working Group, about their findings around past and predicted flows for Queen Creek through Superior.

The group will also discuss the status of a Good Neighbor Agreement being drafted between Resolution Copper and the local community. The agreement is intended to be a consensus driven, binding agreement that will meet the environmental, social, educational and economic needs and interests of the community as well as the operational needs of the mining company. It's expected that the agreement will help prevent disputes and maintain an ongoing open dialogue between the company and community.

### **About the Community Working Group**

The CWG focuses on potential environmental impact issues, science and policy, economic development and growth, and the pros and cons of the proposed development of the Resolution Copper mine, which could become one of the world's largest copper mining ventures. Members include residents and stakeholders from the Town of Superior, Queen Valley, and nearby communities. Monthly meetings of the group are now held in the Town of Superior office complex library at 199 N. Lobb Avenue in Superior. Topics include environmental stewardship,

transportation, education, health, safety, natural resource issues, air quality, community investments, recreational changes and other related subjects.

### **About Resolution Copper**

The Resolution Copper project is a proposed underground mine 60 miles east of Phoenix, Arizona, near the town of Superior. The project is a joint venture owned by Rio Tinto (55%) and BHP (45%). The ore deposit lies nearly 7,000 feet below the earth's surface. It represents one of the most significant untapped copper deposits today. The mine has the potential to supply nearly 25% of US copper demand.
