Pinal County Supervisors cancel elections, appoint new members to several boards

At its regular meeting last week, the Pinal County Board of Supervisors approved a resolution cancelling several regular elections and directly appointed candidates filed to run in those elections to their respective boards.

According to the Arizona Revised Statutes, in any election held, if the total number of persons who file nomination petitions or write in candidate nomination papers is less than or equal to the number of seats to be filled, the county board of supervisors may cancel the election and appoint the candidates directly. This helps smaller school districts and other governing boards avoid the cost of an election.

In the Copper Corridor, fire, school and sanitary districts were affected by this ruling. Directly appointed were:

- San Manuel Fire District Dan Riekofski (4 years) and Parrish Traweek (4 years);
- Oracle Sanitary District Ernest Gonzales (4 years) and Rodolfo Moreno (4 years);

- Queen Valley Sanitary District Pam Bennett (4 years), Leonard Lucas (4 years) and Robert Langefield (4 years);
- Queen Valley Domestic Water Improvement District -Gregory Mecsey (4 years) and Carol Schumacher (4 years);
- Cobre Valley Institute of Technology (CVIT) Louie Rabago (4 years);
- Pinal County Community College District District none filed and none were approved (seats will go vacant);
- Mammoth-San Manuel Unified School District No. 8 - Michael Carnes (4 years), Louis Madrid (4 years) and Terry Newman (4 years);
- Ray Unified School District No. 3 Tino Flores (4 years), Jay Wernett (2 years) and Ashely Bravo (4 years);
- Superior Unified School District No. 15 Henry "Hank" Gutierrez (4 years), Hector Aparicio (4 years), Augustine Lou-Hing (4 years) and Ericka Vasquez (2 years).

Voters in the Oracle Elementary School District No. 2 will see four candidates running for two 4-year seats on the Nov. 8 General Election ballot: Jeri Taylor, Donna Pedota, Wendy Biallas-Odell and Gary Terrell. Three of the four have filed candidate statements, which can be read online at https://bit.ly/OracleStatements.

If no nomination petitions for a candidate and no nomination papers for a write-in candidate have been filed to fill the position for which the election was being held, the position is deemed vacant and shall be filled in accordance with laws governing the filing of those vacancies.


