## World Music in the Desert, coming soon to the Boyce Thompson Arboretum

At the end of October, the southwestern desert will be transformed into a world music oasis. Playing at the Boyce Thompson Arboretum in Superior will be Traveler, bringing their own unique blend of World Fusion music. Estrella Gloria Vera passed away on Aug. 20, 2022, in Petersburg, VA.




Jimmy enjoyed golfing, watching sports and dancing in his spare time, but most of all he enjoyed spending time



The Kearny Rabies and Licensing Clinic will be held Saturday, Oct. 1, 2022, 8-10 a.m. at the Pioneer Park Ramada, N. Emory Rd., Kearny, AZ. The Mammoth Rabies and Licensing Clinic will be held Saturday, Oct. 1, 2022, 12-2 p.m. at the Pinal County Building, 118 S. Catalina St., Mammoth, AZ. For Gila County residents, you are welcome to have your pets vaccinated either in Kearny or Mammoth, but rabies licenses must be obtained from town offices of your place of residence. Fees are as follows: license fee \$35 unaltered; \$15 altered one year; \$35 altered three years; \$6 senior owner altered one year; \$15 senior owner altered three years; \$20 microchips; \$10 rabies vaccination; \$25 parvo combo; \$15 Bordetella; and \$25 cat combo. Cash or check is preferred. All pets must be on a leash. Special arrangements can be made for cats.


