LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Resolution Copper Project is at Risk!

Friends, Family and Neighbors, I am contacting you today with great urgency and a simple request: please contact our Senators and Congressmen and ask them to not support the "Save Oak Flat" H.R. 1884 bill that has been proposed by Representative Grijalva and the House Natural Resources Committee. This group of federal elected officials are trying to sneak this devastating legislation into the Reconciliation Bill.

We have learned that Rep. Grijalva and the House Natural Resources Committee have submitted the language for the "Save Oak Flat" into the House of Representatives Reconciliation Bill. The \$3.2 trillion dollar budget reconciliation package will bring tremendous opportunities for communities large and

small, urban and rural across America. This bill if passed will need American copper to fulfill its intended benefits. The entire package being proposed in Washington, DC is critically important, and we want our elected officials to support it, but not with the poisoned pills added by the House Natural Resources Committee.

While the nightly headlines often talk of the negotiations taking place between America's political parties in Congress, important details that will impact our lives in negative ways such as the "Save Oak Flat" bill often is unreported.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Only You Can Bring Jobs to the Copper Corridor

Nestled three thousand feet off the desert bottom near Superior, Arizona, sits 2,000 jobs buried under the earth. These jobs are not temporary or seasonal, they are well-paying blue-collar jobs that will last for the next 50 years. And if your voice is not heard now, then these jobs will be gone forever.

Work is one of the most important things we do as residents of Pinal County. Ralph Waldo Emerson said, "The purpose of life is not to be happy. It is to be useful, to be honorable, to be compassionate, to have it make some difference that you have lived and lived well." It is through work that we provide our families with life's necessities. For most of us, we work for someone else, be it a private employer or the state or local government. Some of us have had the fortune to create jobs, which is why the opportunity that I am about to discuss is so rare.

You, yes, every single one of you Pinal County residents, have the opportunity to create 2,000 jobs for the next 50 years. Tucked into the 3.5 trillion-dollar reconciliation bill, that both sides of Congress are debating right now, is a provision to stop the jobs that President Barack Obama approved in 2014, that allows Resolution Copper Mine to open. The provision is called H.R. 1884 and it must be removed from the budget reconciliation bill to get these jobs. I ask each of you to write to your representatives and ask that this language be removed.

Federal Law Requires the Land Exchange

In 2014 President Obama signed into law a land exchange that would allow Resolution Copper to operate outside of Superior, Arizona. Over the subsequent seven years, the United States Department of Agriculture conducted numerous studies with input from the public and various federal, state, and local agencies. Public Law 113-219 authorized the land exchange after the House of Representatives, the United States Senate, and the President all agreed that the land exchange should take place after considering the impact to the environment, the various Tribes, and the compelling government interest in the mine.

The federal law mandates that Resolution Copper shall be conveyed the land, "Not later than 60 days after the date of publication of the final environmental impact statement..." 16 U.S.C. § 539p(c)(3). The Final Environmental Impact Statement was completed on Jan. 15, 2021, which means that Resolution Copper should have been conveyed the land on or before March 15, 2021. Instead, the USDA chose not to follow federal law.

The USDA has become a Law unto Themselves.

The USDA unilaterally decided that it was not going to comply with federal law when it withdrew the Final Environmental Impact Statement on March 1, 2021. It is acting like a rogue agency with the unilateral power to change federal law outside of Congress and the President of the United States. To be clear, 16 U.S.C. § 539p(c)(3) has been the law of the United States since it was approved on Dec. 19, 2014. Here is how it happened, starting from the most recent events, and an explanation as to why the USDA became political when it withdrew the Environmental Impact Statement.

On March 1, 2021, the United States Forest Service withdrew its Final Environmental Impact Statement published Jan. 15, 2021. This occurred in a little-known location called the Federal Register, which is a journal of all federal agency actions. Here is the March 1, 2021, entry:

EIS No. 20210005, Final, USFS, AZ, WITHDRAWN—Resolution Copper Project and Land Exchange, Contact: Mary Rasmussen 602-225-5200. Revision to FR Notice Published 01/15/2021; Officially Withdrawn per request of the submitting agency. Dated: March 1, 2021.

According to the United States Forest Service (USFS), it was required by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) to withdraw its Final Environmental Impact Statement. The USDA justified the withdrawal by citing a Presidential Memorandum from President Joe Biden dated Jan. 26, 2021.¹ Strangely, the Presidential Memorandum makes no mention of Resolution Copper, Arizona, the land exchange, Oak Flat, or anything to do with the aforementioned project. The Presidential Memorandum merely reiterates President Obama's Policy on Strengthening Tribal Relationships that had been in place since 2000:

To this end, Executive Order 13175 of Nov. 6, 2000 (Consultation and Coordination With Indian Tribal Governments) charges all executive departments and agencies with engaging in regular, meaningful, and robust, consultation with Tribal officials in the development of Federal policies that have Tribal implications...The Presidential Memorandum of November 5, 2009 (Tribal Consultation), requires each agency to prepare and periodically update a detailed plan of action to implement the policies and directives of Executive Order 13175. This memorandum reaffirms the policy announced in that memorandum (emphasis added).

In other words, the Presidential Memorandum demands that all executive agencies act in accordance with President Obama's policies. Interestingly, it was President Obama that signed the Resolution Copper land exchange into law, so who in the USDA is holding 2,000 jobs and 113 million in tax revenue² to Arizona hostage? The USDA clearly is using the Presidential Memorandum as a subterfuge to refuse to follow the law. The United States Forest Service followed President Obama's directives in getting Tribal input throughout the entire land exchange process over the past seven years. The United States is a nation of laws that should be followed and enforced, and it certainly is not the job of the USDA to choose which laws to follow and which ones it can brush aside on the Federal Register.

Copper is an Absolute Necessity.

The Resolution Copper mine will not only bring thousands of jobs for the next 50 years, but it will also supply as much as 40 billion tons of copper. A couple more numbers for comparison: domestic mine production of copper was 102,000 metric tons year-to-date through

Recently, State and National media have reported an increase in positive COVID-19 Cases. The communities of the Copper Corridor have also started to see an increase in positive cases. The new Delta variant of COVID-19 has been reported as highly transmissible. The CDC and other health officials warn that those who are not vaccinated should continue to practice physical distancing, wear masks in public and avoid crowded places and is also strongly recommending everyone wear a mask indoors and in group settings.

Governor Doug Ducey has signed executive orders that prohibit Cities and Towns from mandating mask wearing, limiting restaurant capacity or other enacting other physical distancing requirements. At this time there is no indication that there will be any restrictions put into place. Local schools are also prohibited from requiring masks be worn on campus.

COVID Vaccines are readily available at local clinics in the region including Cobre Valley Clinics in Superior and Kearny, Pinal County Public Health and Sun Life Clinics. Other chain pharmacies such as Walgreens, grocery store pharmacies and CVS also have vaccines available.

We last reported daily COVID-19 case increased on Sept. 20, 2021. Above is a chart showing our last reported number and the current number of total cases for each of the Copper Corridor communities through Sept. 27, 2021. Keep in mind that zip code data also includes unincorporated areas around a community. For instance, Riverside/Kelvin area is included in the Kearny zip code. Aravaipa and Dudleyville are included in the Winkelman zip codes, etc.

Those experiencing COVID-19 symptoms should seek testing and quarantine until they can confirm a negative test.

Working together, we can slow the spread of the virus across the Copper Corridor. Wear a mask in public, remain physically distant (6ft apart or more), practice good hygiene (wash your hands frequently, sanitize high touch areas) and stay home if you are not feeling well.

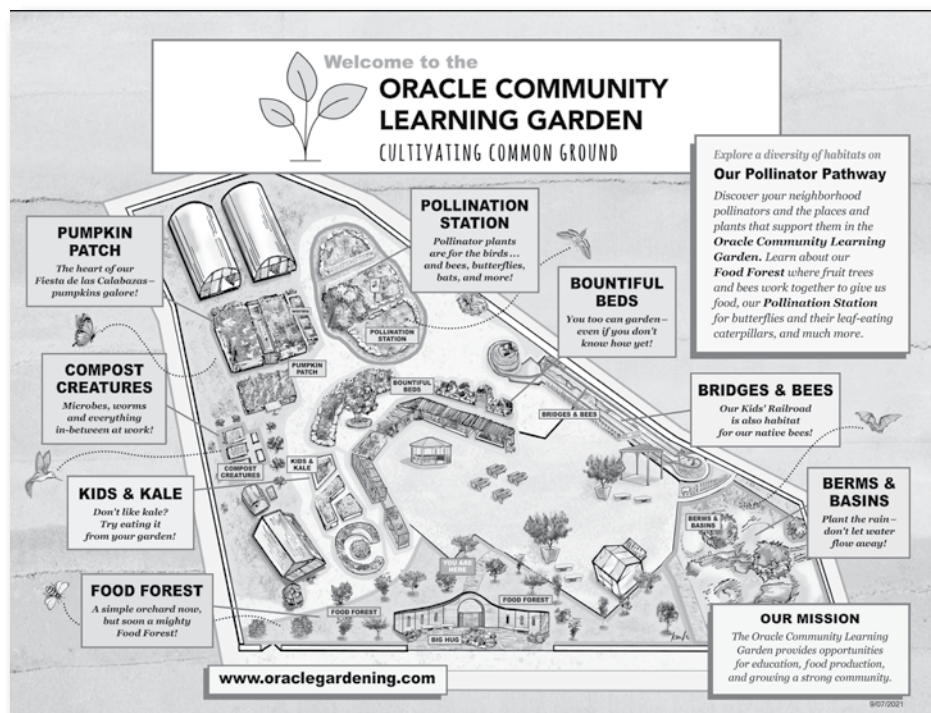

Head coach Ernie Ivy praised Noah Huerta and Nico Velasquez for playing a good game. Coach Ivy also gave

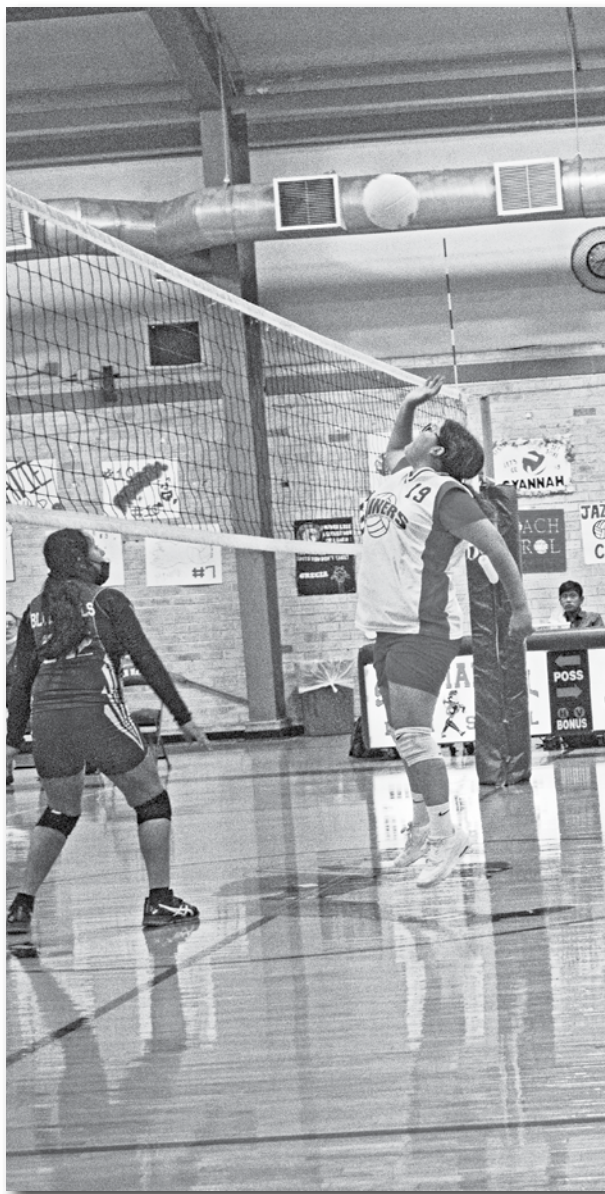
recognition to the offensive line, for opening holes for the running-backs and giving the quarterback more time to throw the ball.

In one highway closure, ADOT completes multiple projects; ADOT avoids future travel delays during US 60 closure for bridge project

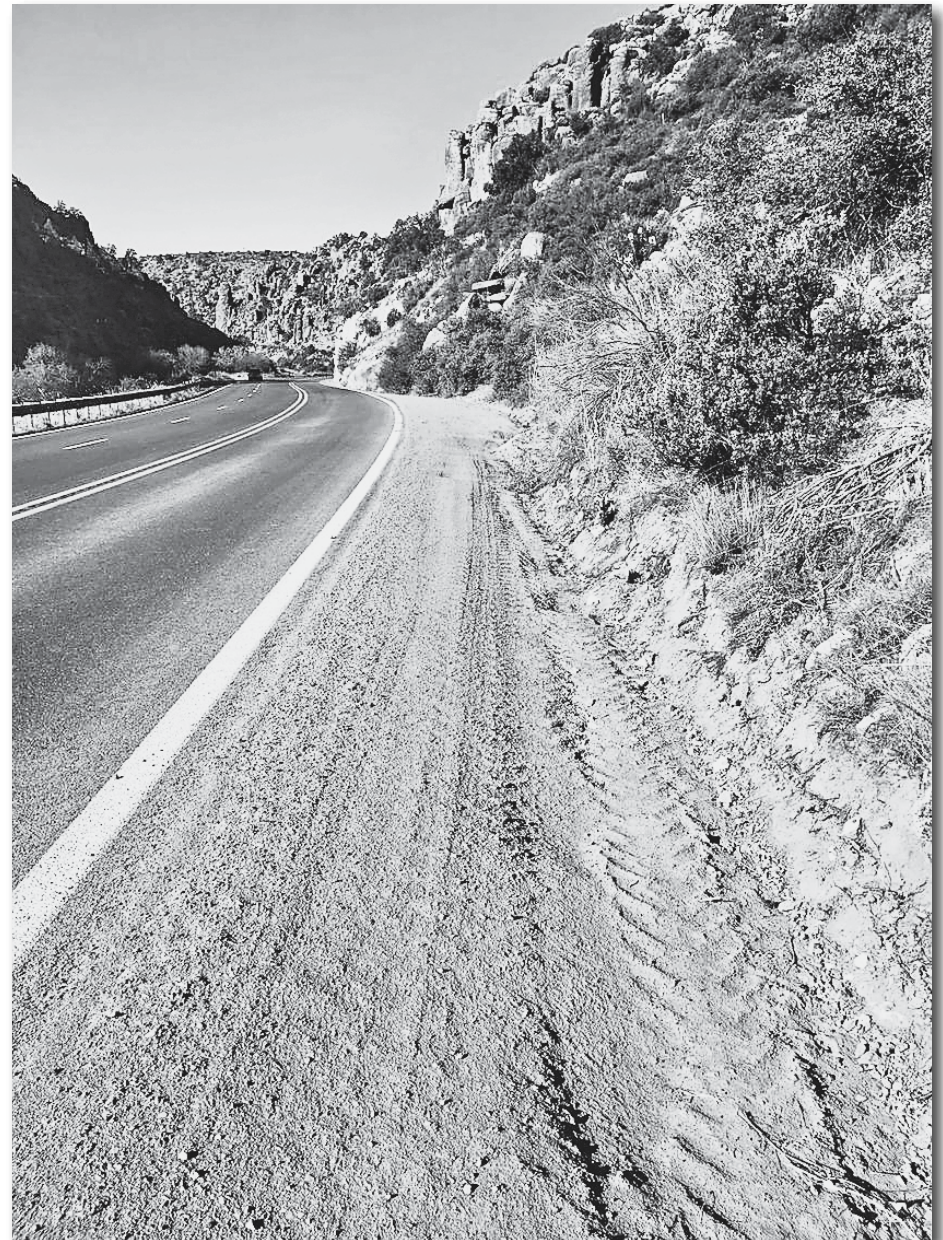
GLOBE – While motorists who routinely travel between Superior and the Globe-Miami area may not know what's involved with maintaining and repairing the only highway between the communities, they've come to know even small projects can mean big travel delays.

So when the Arizona Department of Transportation planned the most disruptive local project in recent memory - a five-day closure of US 60 for a bridge replacement project - work crews planned ahead to take advantage of a nearly traffic-free road.

From the time the highway closed late Sept. 12 to when it reopened midday Sept. 17, ADOT maintenance crews based in Superior and Globe spread out across the roughly 15-mile closure to take on multiple maintenance and repair projects at the same time.

Nearly all the work along this two-lane highway, which cuts through rugged terrain and lacks shoulders in many areas, would have required lane restrictions and delays for the safety of work crews and the public. With the public off the roadway,

crews could perform all kinds of work more quickly and more safely than when sharing the road with traffic.

Best of all, the work means ADOT - and drivers - will avoid multiple future projects that would require disruptive restrictions or even closures.

ADOT crews performed work on and off the highway over five days. The most visible improvement was a chip seal project that started at Top-of-the-World and extended 4 miles to the east.

Other work included:

- Repairing damage from this summer's Telegraph Fire, which burned along miles of US 60
- Removing rocks at risk of falling onto the highway
- Trimming and removing vegetation that was blocking sight lines, uprooting rocks

or at risk of falling on the road

- Cleaning drainage systems to prevent flood damage
- Installing conduit in the Queen Creek Tunnel for a future fiber optic cable project

ADOT coordinated the work with Ames Construction, which required the highway closure as the contractor on the \$22.7 million Pinto Creek Bridge replacement project. ADOT crews needed to ensure Ames had constant use of US 60 to access the project site, where crews realigned US 60 to the newly completed bridge at Pinto Creek.

While traffic began using the new bridge Sept. 17, the project will extend through 2021 as crews remove the old structure and restore the project site to its natural state. More information about the project is available at azdot.gov/PintoCreekBridge.

March 2021.³ The Resolution Copper mine will produce approximately 132,000 tons per day of ore.⁴ Copper is a high demand commodity needed by Arizona and the rest of the nation to transition to renewable
